GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board : Altering Regulations as to Signature of Orders drawn by Guardians upon Treasurer :-

Parish of Paddington.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Paddington, in the County of London ;-And to all others whom it may concern.


WHEREAS by a General Order dated the eighth day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, the Poor Law Commissioners made certain Rules and Regulations relating to the administration of relief to the Poor within the parishes and the township named in the Schedule to that Order, including the said parish of Paddington, and by Article 84 of the said Order it was directed that the Guardians of the Poor of such parishes and township should pay every sum greater than five pounds by an order drawn upon the Treasurer of the parish, and signed by the presiding Chairman and two other Guardians at a meeting and countersigned by the Clerk :

And whereas by a General Order dated the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish of Paddington, among others, the Poor Law Board prescribed the Form in which, from and after the twenty-fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and fiftyseven, such orders should be drawn by the said Guardians upon their Treasurer :

And whereas it is expedient that further provision in the matter should be made as hereinafter mentioned :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, by this Our Order direct that, so far as the above cited General Orders relate to the said Parish of Paddington, the said Article 84 of the said General Order dated the eighth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, shall be altered by the substitution of the words "three Guar-dians" for the words "the presiding Chairman and two other Guardians" occurring therein, and the said Form prescribed by the said General Order dated the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, shall be altered by omitting therefrom the words "Presiding Chairman," and by making the words "Guardians of the Poor of the said Parish" therein apply to the three Guardians signing the order on the Treasurer.

Talycafn Bridge.

(Incorporation of Company; Powers to Undertakers; Construction of Bridge over the River Conway with Approach Roads thereto; Compulsory Purchase of Lands; Acquisition of Ferry and Ferry Rights; Levying of Tolls, &c.; Sale and Leasing of Bridge Undertaking; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts, and other purposes).

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session for leave to introduce a Bill and to pass an Act to effect the purposes or some of the purposes following (that is to say):-

To incorporate a Company and to empower the said Company or a Company incorporated or to be incorporated under the Companies Acts, 1862-1890, or otherwise, or certain persons to be named in the Bill as Undertakers (which Company or persons are hereinafter referred to as "the Undertakers"), to make and maintain the bridge and approach roads hereinafter described, with all proper fences, drains, arches, culverts, footpaths, toll-gates, toll-houses, and other buildings, works, and conveniences connected therewith, in the counties of Denbigh and Carnarvon (that is to say) :--

1. A bridge across the River Conway to be situate in the parishes of Eglwysfach, in the county of Denbigh, and Caerhun and Llanbedr-y-Cenin, in the county of Carnarvon, connecting the said counties at or near Talycafn, which bridge will commence at a point on or near the road leading from Talycafn Railway Station to the present ferry of Talycafn, and distant 108 yards or thereabouts (measuring along the said road) from the western corner of the booking office of the said railway station, and situate on the Denbighshire shore on or about the line of high water mark, at or near the point where the said road abuts on the said river, and will terminate at a point on the Carnarvonshire shore situate on or about the line of high water mark, 22 yards or thereabouts to the east of the Ferry Cottage, hut, or waiting room there.

2. An approach road ("Approach road No. 1") wholly in the said parish of Eglwysfach and commencing by a junction with the said road leading from the Talycafn Railway Station to the present ferry at or near a point in the last-mentioned road, distant 32 yards or thereabouts, measured in a straight line, in a north-westerly direction, from the western corner of the booking office of the said railway station, and terminating by a junction with the bridge hereinbefore described at the commencement or south-eastern extremity of that bridge.

3. An approach road ("Approach road No. 2") in the said parishes of Caerhun and Llanbedr-y-Cenin, commencing in the road leading from Talycafn to Tynygroes at a point in that road situate 104 yards or thereabouts (measured in a straight line) to the west of the said Ferry Cottage, hut, or waiting room, and terminating by a junction with the bridge hereinbefore described at the termination or north-western extremity of that bridge.

4. An approach road ("Approach road No. 3") in the said parishes of Caerhun and Llanbedr-y-Cenin, commencing in the road leading from Talycafn to Conway, at a point in that road situate 123 yards or thereabouts (mensured in a straight line) to the north-east of the said Ferry Cottage, hut, or waiting room, and terminating by a junction with the approach road No. 2 hereinbefore described at a point in that road 28

yards or thereabouts from its termination at the said bridge.

To take power to deviate laterally in the construction of the said bridge, approach roads, and works to the extent shown upon the deposited plans hereinafter mentioned, and to deviate vertically from the levels shown upon the sections to such an extent as will be provided by the Bill.

To authorize the crossing, stopping up, altering or diverting, whether temporarily or permanently, of all roads, footpaths, railways, rivers, streams, culverts, pipes, and drains, which it may be necessary to cross, stop up, alter, or divert in executing the purposes of the Bill.

To empower the Undertakers to purchase or acquire by compulsion or agreement, and to hold and use permanently or temporarily lands, houses, and buildings, and easements therein in the parishes aforesaid for the purposes of the Bill, and to provide for taking a part only of any property required without being subject to the liability imposed by section 92 of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845.

To authorize the Undertakers to take compulsorily or by agreement the existing ferry over the River Conway, known as the Talycafn Ferry, and all lands, houses, tolls, and other rights and property connected therewith, and to hold or to discontinue and extinguish, or provide for the holding or discontinuance and extinction, of the said ferry, and of all other rights of ferry, and other rights or privileges in or over the said ferry.

To provide that the said bridge, approach roads, and works shall be deemed to be the improvement of land within the meaning of the "Improvement of Land Act, 1864," or any Act or Acts amending the same, and to confer upon any tenant for life of, or any person or body having a limited estate or interest in, any lands which would or might be benefitted or improved in value by, or would derivõ facilities or accommodation from, the construction or maintenance of the said bridge, approach roads, and other works, the powers conferred by the lastmentioned Act upon landowners as defined therein.

To make provision for the repair and maintenance of the said bridge and approach roads respectively and the works connected therewith, or part or parts thereof by the bodies or persons liable to the repair of the highways in the parishes in which the same are respectively situate, or by such other bodies or persons, and also for the vesting of the soil of any roads, stopped up or diverted, as may be prescribed or provided for by the Bill in that behalf.

To authorize the Undertakers on the one hand, and the County Councils of Denbighshire and Carnarvonshire respectively, hereinafter called "the said County Councils," or either of them, or any other bodies or body corporate, persons or person on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements for and in relation to the lease, sale, and transfer of the whole or any part of the undertaking, or the tolls, rates, and charges to be levied in respect thereof and the powers of the Undertakers to the said County Councils, bodies, or persons, or any of them for such gross sum or sums, rent or rents, or other consideration, and generally upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed on between the contracting or agreeing parties, or as may be prescribed or authorized by the Bill, and to confirm any such contracts and agreements which may have been or may be entered into prior to the passing of the Bill.

To provide that no Company, body corporate, persons or person shall build and maintain any other bridge or bridges over the River Conway

within such distance from the said bridge as may be prescribed by the Bill.

To authorize the Undertakers to enter into Agreements with any Company or other body corporate, persons or person supplying water, gas or electricity in the said parishes, or elsewhere, for or with reference to the placing of water or other mains, pipes, wires or other apparatus in or upon the said bridge, approach roads, and works, in consideration of such gross sum or sums, rent or rents, and generally for such consideration and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed on between the contracting or agreeing parties or as may be provided by the Bill.

To authorize and enable owners, lessees, and occupiers of land in the said parishes, the said County Councils or either of them and any other corporation, public body, commissioners, persons or person to subscribe and contribute towards the expense of making and maintaining the undertaking, and to hold shares in or to guarantee interest upon the capital or debenture or mortgage debt of the Undertakers, and to apply their corporate or other funds, moneys, rates, revenues or income for that purpose, and to raise money for the like purpose on the security of their property or revenues or any of their rates, tolls, dues or charges.

To empower the Undertakers to levy, demand, and recover tolls, rates, and charges for or in respect of the use of the intended bridge, approach roads, and other works, or some of them, and to grant exemptions from the payment of tolls, rates, and charges.

To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges connected with the lands, houses, ferries, and buildings to be purchased or taken for the purposes of the Bill, or which would in any manner interfere with the objects of the Bill, and to confer, vary, and extinguish other rights and privileges.

The Bill will or may incorporate, and with or without alterations or modifications, all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869, the Companies Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845 and 1863, the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, or any Act or Acts amending the said Acts, or any of them.

And notice is hereby also given, that on or before the 30th day of November instant, plans and sections of the intended bridge, approach roads, and other works, showing the lines and levels thereof, with a book of reference to such plans, and a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette will be deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Denbigh at his office at Ruthin, and also with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Carnaryon, at his office at Carnarvon, and a copy of so much of the said plans, sections, and book of reference as relate to that parish, and a copy of this notice with the parish clerks of the said parishes of Eglwysfach, Caerhun, and Llanbedr-y-Cenin respectively at their respective residences.
