To repeal, alter, or amend, so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the intended Act, any of the provisions of the "Golden Valley Railway Act, 1876," and any of the other Acts relating to the Company, and especially to alter and amend the said "Golden Valley Extension Railway Act, 1889," and the "Golden Valley Railway Act, 1891," in so far as it relates to the debenture stocks, the apportionment of net receipts, and the capital authorised by the Act of 1889.

The Bill will alter and vary any existing rights and privileges so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the intended Act.

Elementary Education Acts, 1870 and 1873.

NOTICE is hereby given that the School Board for the Borough of Chesterfield, in pursuance and exercise of the powers given to them by the Elementary Education Acts, 1870 and 1873 (in which first-mentioned Act the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Acts amending the same are with certain exceptions incorporated), and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, propose to take the piece or parcel of land, the situation and quantity where-

of are given in the schedule hereto, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining on the said piece or parcel of land a school-house, in which a public elementary school may be carried on.

And notice is hereby further given that a plan of the said piece or parcel of land may be seen at all reasonable hours at the office of the said School Board, situate in Durrant-road, in the Borough of Chesterfield.

After publication of this notice, and service of the other notices required by law, the said School Board intend on or after the 1st day of January next to present a petition to the Education Department, in pursuance of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, praying that an order may be made authorising the said School Board to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Acts amending the same, with respect to the purchase and taking of land otherwise than by agreement so far as regards the land therein and in the schedule hereto mentioned.

The Schedule above referred to:—

A piece or parcel of land, consisting of portions of gardens, croft, yard, and occupation road, and situate on the south side of and adjoining Hollis-lane, in the Borough of Chesterfield, in the county of Derby, and having a depth therefrom in a southerly direction of 172 ft. or thereabouts.

The frontage to Hollis-lane commences at a point situate 44 ft. 6 in. or thereabouts west of the Hollis-lane bridge of the Midland Railway Company, and extends from the said point 122 ft. 9 in. or thereabouts in a westerly direction; and the width from east to west behind the frontage is 173 ft. or thereabouts.
