necessary to carry into effect the objects of the said Order.

5. The following are the names of the streets within which the Company propose to lay electric lines within a specified time :

High-street from Bethesda-street to Welcomestreet; Castle-street; Wind-street; Temple-street; Oxford-street, from Goat-street to Unionstreet; Caer-street; Goat-street, from Caer-street to Temple-street; all within the area of supply.

6. To authorise the Company to transfer all or some of the powers or obligations created by the Order to another or other Company or Companies, person or persons.

7. To authorise the Company and any local authority, body, company, or person to make and carry into effect agreements for the produc-tion and distribution of electricity, and for the performing of all acts incidental to public and private lighting.

8. It is intended to take power by this Order to cross the Swansea, Port Tennant, and Smith's Canals, and the River Tawse.

9. To authorise the Company to levy, make, and recover rates, rents, and charges in respect of electricity supplied by them, and in respect of the sale and hire of machinery, plant, apparatus, and instruments, and to confer, vary, and alter exemptions from the payment of such rates, rents, and charges, and to confer, vary, and extinguish other rights and privileges.

10. To authorise the Company, their officers, servants, and workmen, to enter upon lands, buildings, or other premises, and to examine any machinery, plant, apparatus, or instruments supplied by the Company, or used in connection with their lines or works, and to execute such works, and to do such things as shall be necessary for the regulation or prevention of such use, misuse, or waste, and to impose and recover penalties for the tampering or fraudulently in-terfering with any such machines and things aforesaid.

11. To confer upon the Company all the powers and privileges, exemptions and rights given or proposed to be given to undertakers by the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, and to authorise and enable them to exercise and enjoy the same throughout the said area of

supply. - (a) The alteration of the Greenland Dock of the Company by the narrowing of the same on both sides thereof, and shortening thereof at its eastern end, and the construction of a new lock and entrance thereto from the River Thames adjoining, and to the southward of existing Greenland entrance lock, and the closing of the said existing entrance lock.
