

Acts or portions of Acts incorporated therewith, and such other rights and powers as may be conferred by the Order, including the power to levy, charge, and recover rates, rents, and charges, and to make, lay down, erect, construct, and place all such works, buildings, engines, dynamos, meters, machinery, mains, wires, pipes, conductors, apparatus, matters, and things as may be necessary or expedient for all or any of the purposes aforesaid.

2. The following are the names of the streets in which it is proposed that electric lines should be laid down within a specified time, that is to say:—Market-place, New-square, Low-pavement, High-street, and Packer's-row.

3. To empower the Corporation for all or any of the purposes of the intended Order to break up, stop up, or interfere with, and to cross or pass over, under, or along, as the case may require, public and private streets, roads, highways, footways, thoroughfares, railways, tramways, rivers, canals, water-courses, bridges, and places within the area of supply, and any sewers, drains, pipes, and telegraph, telephonic, and electric apparatus, in, over, under, or along the same respectively, and particularly so to break up, stop up, or interfere with all streets within the area of supply repairable by the Corporation, and to pass or cross over, under, or along, and break up the following railways, tramways, and rivers, so far as they are respectively situate within the area of supply, that is to say:—The Midland Railway; the Manchester, Sheffield, and Lincolnshire Railway; the Lancashire, Derbyshire, and East Coast Railway; the Chesterfield and District Tramway; the River Hipper; the River Rother; and to lay, place, renew, alter, and maintain in, under, over, across, and along such streets, roads, highways, footways, thoroughfares, places, railways, and rivers, electric lines, wires, conductors, switches, mains, pipes, meters, and other apparatus for the supply of electricity and electric currents.

4. To authorise the Corporation to manufacture, hire, sell, and let dynamos, meters, burners, lamps, engines, conductors, machinery, and apparatus for and in relation to the production, supply, distribution, or utilisation of electricity, and to make and recover rents and charges therefor.

5. To enable the Corporation to acquire, hold and use patent rights or licences, and authorities under letters patent, for the use of inventions, processes, and apparatus for or relative to the production, supply, or utilization and distribution of electricity.

6. To enable the Corporation and any Local Authority, company, or person to enter into and fulfil contracts and agreements for the execution and maintenance of works, and the supply of electricity, and for and in relation to all or any of the other purposes before mentioned; and to relieve the Corporation from the consequences of any acts or defaults of any such contractors, and to enable the Corporation to sell, transfer, demise or let to such local authority, company, or person all or some of the rights, powers, privileges, and obligations intended to be conferred or imposed by the Order, as also any lands for the time being belonging to the Corporation, and to enable them to acquire land by agreement for all or any of the purposes of the intended Order.

7. To authorise the Corporation for the purposes of the Order to borrow money by mortgage, annuities, stock, or otherwise, on the security of the borough fund, and borough or general district or other rates, lands, tenements, hereditaments, undertakings and property, and the rates, rents, tolls, and revenue of the Corporation.

8. To incorporate with the intended Order, with or without alteration, the provisions or some of the provisions of "The Local Loans Act, 1875," "The Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847," "The Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871," and "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845, 1860, and 1869," except the provisions of the last-mentioned Acts relating to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement.

9. On or before the 30th day of November, instant, a copy of the notice as published in the London Gazette, and a map showing the proposed area of supply, will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Derby, at his office at Derby, and with the Town Clerk of Chesterfield, at his office in Gluman-gate, Chesterfield, and also at the office of the Board of Trade, Whitehall, London.

10. Printed copies of the draft Provisional Order will be deposited at the said office of the Board of Trade, on or before the 21st day of December next, and printed copies of the draft Provisional Order, when deposited, and of the Provisional Order, when made, may be obtained at the offices of the undersigned, on payment of one shilling for each copy.

11. Any local authority, company, or person desirous of making any representations to the Board of Trade, or bringing before them any objection respecting the intended application, may do so by letter, addressed to the Board of Trade (marked on the outside of the cover enclosing it, "Electric Lighting Act,") on or before the 15th day of January, 1894, and a copy of such objection must also be forwarded to the offices of the undersigned.

Crystal Palace and District Electric Lighting. (Extension of Area of Supply; Application to Board of Trade for a Provisional Order under Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888; Application to Extend Area of Powers and Provisions of Crystal Palace and District Electric Lighting Order, 1890; Power to Break up Streets, make Charges, lay down Wires, &c., and other Purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made on or before the 21st day of December next, by the Crystal Palace District Electric Supply Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") whose registered offices are at Springfield, Wells-road, Upper Sydenham, in the county of Surrey, to the Board of Trade, under the Electric Lighting Acts, 1882 and 1888, for a Provisional Order (hereinafter called "the Order") for the following purposes:—

1. To extend the area of supply under the Crystal Palace and District Electric Lighting Order, 1890 (hereinafter called "the Order of 1890"), and to enable the Company under and according to the powers and provisions of the Order of 1890, or some of them, to supply electricity for public and private purposes, not only within the area of supply defined by that Order but also within the area following (hereinafter referred to as "the added area"), that is to say:—The area bounded by a line drawn from the junction of Anerley-road with Thicket-road through Anerley-road to the junction of Anerley-road with the London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway lines, thence along such line of rails to its junction with London-road (Forest Hill), thence through London-road to
