

and proper tanks, buildings, engine, pumps, sewers, drains, channels, and other sewage works for the purposes of the intended Act, are as follows:—

A piece or parcel of land belonging to the Corporation, known as Livesey Fields, containing 23 acres or thereabouts, situate in the township and parish of Radcliffe, in the county of Lancaster, and bounded on the northerly side by the River Irwell, on the westerly side by the River Irwell, and by land belonging to the Earl of Derby, and on the east and southerly sides by land belonging to the Earl of Derby.

To empower the Corporation to purchase by compulsion or agreement, the following lands for the purpose of making and constructing in, through, under, or across the same, an aqueduct, tunnel, conduit, or line of pipes authorised by the Bury Corporation Waterworks Act, 1889 (that is to say):—

So much land belonging or reputed to belong to the Right Honourable the Earl of Abingdon, situate in the township of Higher Booths, in the parish of Whalley, in the said county of Lancaster, within the limits of deviation shown on the plans hereinafter referred to as may be required by the Corporation to construct an aqueduct, tunnel, conduit, or line of pipes commencing in the township of Higher Booths and parish of Whalley aforesaid by a junction with an authorised line of pipes at a point nine chains or thereabouts, measured in a straight line in a north-easterly direction from the north-east corner of the house or farmstead known as Lower Clough Bottom, which adjoins the Whitewell Brook, and terminating by a junction with an authorised line of pipes at a point 14½ chains or thereabouts, measured along the Burnley Road leading from Waterfoot to Burnley in a northerly direction from the centre of Springside Bridge, across the said brook in the township and parish aforesaid.

To extend the time within which by Section 26 of the Bury Corporation Waterworks Act, 1889, the Corporation are required to afford a supply of water to the inhabitants of the district of Haslingden in the said county of Lancaster.

To extend the powers of the Corporation in regard to the parks and pleasure grounds under their control so as to enable them to provide music, and to make a charge for chairs and seats for public use in the said parks and grounds.

To authorise and empower the Corporation to compel plumbers and other craftsmen to be duly qualified and registered.

To authorise and empower the Corporation to borrow or raise money for the execution of the works proposed to be authorised by the intended Act and for the purchase of the necessary lands, and to borrow and raise money for the purposes of the waterworks and gasworks Undertakings of the Corporation, for Fire Brigade purposes, for the construction of a refuse destructor and incident thereto, and for other the purposes of the intended Act.

To authorise the Corporation for the purposes of the proposed works, and for all or any of the purposes of the Bill to apply their funds, rates, and revenues, and any monies which they are now authorised to raise, and to make and levy additional and to alter existing rates, rents, duties, and charges, and to confer exemptions from the payment of rates, rents, duties, and charges, and to raise further money by mortgage

or by the creation and issue of Corporation stock debentures, debenture stock and annuities and otherwise, and to charge the same on all or any of the following securities (that is to say), the Borough Fund, the Borough Rate, General Rate, and the Gas and Water Undertakings of the Corporation, and other rates, tolls, revenues, estates, lands, Undertakings, and property of the Corporation.

The Bill will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with its objects, and will confer other rights and privileges.

The Bill will or may incorporate with itself, with or without alterations, such of the provisions as may be deemed expedient of the Lands Clauses Acts; the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, with respect to the temporary occupation of land; the Waterworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863, and the Public Health Act, 1875, and will or may so far as may be necessary, alter, amend, extend and repeal the provisions of the Bury Improvement Act, 1846; the Bury Waterworks Act, 1846; the Bury and Radcliffe Waterworks Act, 1853; the Bury Gas Act, 1857; the Bury and Radcliffe Waterworks Act, 1858; the Haslingden and Rawtenstall Waterworks Act, 1853; the Haslingden and Rawtenstall Waterworks Act, 1856; the Haslingden and Rawtenstall Waterworks Act, 1858; the Haslingden and Rawtenstall Waterworks Act, 1864; the Bury Gas Act, 1866; the Bury Improvement Act, 1872; the Local Government Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act, 1882; the Bury Improvement Act, 1885; the Bury Corporation Waterworks Act, 1889, and any other Acts, relating directly or indirectly to the Corporation, and of any and every other Act which will interfere with any of the objects of the Bill.

And notice is hereby further given that duplicate plans and sections of the intended sewers and works, and plans of the lands, houses, and property in, through, or under which they will be respectively made, or which may be taken therefor, and for the other purposes of the intended Act, together with a book of reference to such plans, and a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette will be deposited for public inspection on or before the 30th day of November, 1893, with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Lancaster, at his office at Preston, and on or before the same date a copy of so much of the said plans, sections, and book of reference as relates to each parish and extra parochial place, in or through which the works will be respectively made, or in which any lands to be taken are situate, and a copy of this Notice published as aforesaid, will be deposited in the case of each such parish with the parish clerk thereof at his residence, and in the case of an extra parochial place, with the parish clerk of some parish immediately adjoining such extra parochial place at his place of abode.

On or before the 21st day of December 1893, printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.
