To make provisions with reference to the payment of the costs and expenses of, and incident to the preparing for, obtaining and passing of the intended Act, or otherwise in relation thereto, and of carrying the same into effect.

The intended Act will incorporate all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts and the Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847.

And notice is hereby also given that a plan and section in duplicate of the intended embankments or sea-walls and works, and of the lands which may be taken or used under the powers of the intended Act, together with a book of reference to such plan will be deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Chester, at his office at Chester, and that a copy of so much of the said plan, section, and book of reference as relates to any parish or extra-parochial place, will be deposited in the case of a parish with the parish clerk of such parish at his residence, and in the case of an extra-parochial place with the parish clerk of some adjoining parish at his residence, and that all such deposits will be made on or before the 30th day of November, 1893, and will be accompanied by a copy of this Notice.

Printed copies of the Bill for the intended Act will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 21st day of December next.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the Session of 1894 by the Southwark and Vauxhall Water Company (hereinafter called "the Company") for leave to bring in a Bill for the following, or some of the following, among other purposes (that is to say):—

To authorize the Company to make and maintain the following works, or such of them, or such part or parts thereof respectively, as the Bill may define, that is to say:—

A service reservoir, situate partly in the parish of St. Giles, Camberwell, in the county of London, on lands numbered 391;

in the said parish of St. Giles; on the 25-inch Ordnance map of the county of Surrey, and partly in the parish of Lewisham, in the said county of London, on lands numbered 336 on the 25-inch Ordnance map of the county of Kent, the site of the said reservoir being bounded on the south-east by the Crystal Palace line of the London, Chatham, and Dover Railway; on the south-west by Homestall-road and an imaginary line drawn from the south-eastern corner of the junction of Homestall-road aforesaid with Marmora-road; on the north-west by the boundary fence of the occupation road adjoining Priory Farm; on the north-east partly by the back-garden walls of houses in Hall-road, and partly by an imaginary line drawn in a south-easterly direction from the south-eastern end of Hall-road to the fence of the embankment of the London, Chatham, and Dover Railway Company's Crystal Palace line at a point in that fence distant 750 feet, or thereabouts, in a south-westerly direction from the south-western corner of the bridge crossing the Brockley footpath.

A double line of pipes (Line of Pipes, No. 1) commencing in the parish of Sunbury, at the south-eastern corner of Park-road, at its point of junction with Lower Sunbury road, and terminating in the parish of Hampton, at a point in that road opposite the western boundary of the house known as Thames Valley Cottage, all in the county of Middlesex.

A double line of pipes (Line of Pipes, No. 2) wholly in the parish of St. Giles, Camberwell, in the county of London, commencing at the point of junction of Marmora-road with Homestall-road, and terminating in the said Homestall-road, at the north-eastern end thereof, opposite the house known as Wood End.

A storage reservoir, partly in the parish of Hampton and partly in the parish of Sunbury, all in the county of Middlesex, having a superficial area of 1,553,800 square feet, or thereabouts, and situate in fields numbered 268, 269, and 270, in the parish of Sunbury, on the 25-inch Ordnance map of the County of Middlesex, and fields numbered 186, 187, and 262, in the parish of Hampton on the said Ordnance map.

A subsiding reservoir with filter beds and engine house, wholly in the parish of Hampton, in the county of Middlesex, having a superficial area of 1,399,520 square feet, or thereabouts, and situate in fields numbered 266, 267, 269, and 270, in the parish of Hampton, on the 25-inch Ordnance map of the county of Middlesex.

The said reservoirs, lines of pipes, and other works will pass from, in, through, or into the parishes, townships, town lands, and extra-parochial places following (that is to say):—Hampton and Sunbury, in the county of Middlesex; Saint Giles, Camberwell, and Lewisham, both in the county of London.

All such cuts, channels, adits, catchwaters, aqueducts, culverts, tunnels, drains, sluices, gauges, wells, filter-beds, tanks, banks, walls, approaches, engines, machinery, and appliances, as may be necessary or convenient in connection with the before-mentioned works, or any of them.
