Payment of all proper costs, charges, expenses, fees, and percentages is provided for in the same manner. A Composition of 10s. in the pound to be paid on all debts provable against the joint estate by two instalments of 5s. each; the first to be paid within one calendar month from the date of the said approval by the Court; and the second instalment to be paid within four calendar months therefrom. Payment of the Composition secured as follows, viz.:—(1) By the joint and several bonds of the abovenamed debtors and Eleanor Martha Nixon, wife of the said Arthur Nixon, residing at 73, Wickham-road aforesaid, as surety; (2) By an assignment of all the property of the debtors which would become divisible amongst their creditors, if they were adjudged bankrupt in these proceedings, to Edwin Wilding, of Bloomsbury Mansion, Hart-street, Chartered Accountant, as Trustee, for the purpose of securing the payment of the Composition and carrying out the terms thereof; (3) By the postponement of the right of the said Eleanor Martha Nixon to the payment of any instalment of the Composition upon the debt proved by her, until both the said instalments have been paid to all the other creditors. The separate liabilities of the said John Daintree and Arthur Nixon shall be paid in full within two months from the date of the approval by the Court of this Composition, such payment to be secured to the satisfaction of the Trustee of the joint estate. The Receiving Order made against the said John Daintree, Robert Smith, and Arthur Nixon on the 7th day of June, 1893, is discharged as regards the joint estate, and also as regards the separate estates of John Daintree and Arthur Nixon respectively
