

following information respecting quarantine in Turkey, viz. :—

The quarantine of twenty-four hours' observation against arrivals from the Gulf of Smyrna, between Cara, Bournou, and Foglieri, inclusive, is suppressed and replaced by a medical visit in a port where there is a health officer.

The quarantine against arrivals from Italy (Sicily excepted) has been suppressed, and replaced by a medical visit in a port where there is a health officer.

Ten days' against arrivals from Eupatoria (Crimea) to be purged at Sinope.

The ten days' against arrivals from Rostoff on the Don (Sea of Azov) is reduced since the 12th instant to twenty-four hours of observation at the lazarettos of Sinope or Cavak.

The quarantine of ten days' against arrivals from the Russian Asiatic Shore of the Black Sea, from Batoun, inclusive, to Hoppa, is reduced since 18th instant to twenty-four hours of observation at the lazarettos of Sinope or Cavak.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Madrid, containing the following information respecting quarantine, viz. :—

Arrivals from Soulina (Roumania) arriving after 23rd ultimo, and from ports within 165 kilometres, will be admitted to free pratique if they arrive with clean bill of health vided by a Spanish Consul, or, if there be none, by the Consul of another nation, in good hygienic condition, and without suspicious occurrence in the health of the vessel, so long as they do not infringe any of the existing regulations.

Infectious goods, specified in the Royal Decree of 1886, which have remained in Soulina during the epidemic and arrive on or after the 14th proximo, shall likewise be admitted without disinfection, if in good hygienic conditions.

Arrivals from Ancona (Italy) are admitted to free pratique, as well as infectious goods.
