1. The sale or exposure for sale of any cattle sheep or swine in or at the Cattle Market at Petersfield in the county-of Southampton is hereby prohibited.

2. If a head of cattle or a sheep or a pig is sold or exposed for sale in or at the said Market at Petersfield in contravention of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier thereof, and the owner or consignee of each head of cattle and of each sheep or pig so sold or exposed, and the person so selling or exposing the same, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting a sale of cattle sheep or swine at such Market, and the purchaser thereat of any cattle sheep or swine so sold/or exposed in contravention of this Order, such purchaser knowing the animal to be sold or exposed for sale in con-travention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.
