And whereas the Right Reverend John Wareing, Bishop of the said diocese of Carlisle, as such Bishop, and the Reverend John Llewelyn Davies, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of Kirkby Lonsdale, in the said diocese of Carlisle, and as such Vicar or Incumbent the patron of the perpetual curacy of the said parochial chapelry of Barbon, and the Reverend James Harrison, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Incumbent of the same perpetual curacy, have, by an instrument under their hands, bearing date on or about the seventeenth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, certified to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, that it would be for the convenience of the said parochial chapelry of Barbon that the said new church of Saint Bartholomew, situate within such parochial chapelry, should be substituted for the old parish church of the same parochial chapelry.
