DESPATCHES of which the following are copies have been received from Rear-Admiral Frederick G. D. Bedford, C.B., Commander-in-Chief on the Cape of Good Hope and West Coast of Africa Station, and from the Senior Naval Officer, Zanzibar, forwarding reports of the operations of Naval Brigades landed at Lamu and Kismayu:—

Extract from Letter of Commander-in-Chief to Admiralty, dated 3rd September, 1893.

"*Raleigh*" at Zanzibar,

SIR, September 3, 1893.

I HAVE received the reports of Captain Lindley of the operations of the Naval Brigade landed at Lamu, dated 10th and 17th August, duplicates of which have been furnished to their Lordships by the Senior Officer, Zanzibar.

I have but few remarks to offer on this subject. Captain Lindley's Despatches, which are very full, are before their Lordships, and the Consul-General has fully explained the circumstances under which it was necessary to have recourse to force.

Captain Lindley conducted the operations in a manner which I feel sure will meet with their Lordships' approval, and was ably supported by Commander Sampson and the officers and men landed.

I regret to have to mention that a considerable number of the force that was landed have since suffered from fever. A report, which I called for from the Fleet Surgeon on the state of the wounded, &c., is enclosed.

Since that affair, as will be seen by the enclosed despatches from Her Majesty's ship "*Blanche*," another collision with the natives has taken place on the River Juba. It seemed inevitable, if the lives of the two Englishmen, Captain Tritton and Mr. McDougall, of the Imperial British East African Company, were to be saved, and I think that no one reading Lieutenant Lewes's letter can fail to be struck with the dash and determination displayed by that Officer and the small force under his orders.

I have informed Lieutenant Lewes that I approve of his proceedings, and consider he was quite right to insist on the withdrawal from the steamer of the Company's officers.

Report on Wounded.

Enclosure in Commander-in-Chief's Letter of 3rd September, 1893.

Her Majesty's Ship "*Raleigh*,"

Zanzibar, September 2, 1893.

SIR, I HAVE the honour to submit the following statement of the sick and wounded from Her Majesty's ships "*Blanche*," "*Swallow*," and "*Sparrow*," when engaged in operations against Lamu:—

Her Majesty's ship "*Blanche*."

1. Lieutenant Fitzmaurice, deep flesh gunshot wound of left forearm; now convalescent.
2. Charles Kingston, A.B., gunshot flesh wound of left thigh and left forearm; convalescent.
3. Benjamin Williams, A.B., deep flesh wound of right shoulder, posteriorly; healing rapidly.

Her Majesty's ship "*Swallow*."

1. George Sparrowhawk, gunshot wound of left thigh; convalescent.
2. William Maple, O.S., slight flesh wound of right loin; recovered.

Her Majesty's ship "*Sparrow*."

1. Sub-Lieutenant Gervis, wound of left side of neck, near the jugular vein, from a slug, which is deeply lodged in the tissues; convalescent.
2. William Leighton, P.O., 2nd class, severe gunshot compound fracture of left wrist, rendering future use of hand doubtful.
3. John Wall, P.M., gunshot wound of left leg, fissuring tibial bone; progressing favourably.

Since returning to the ships, of the "*Blanche*," Captain Lindley, Sub-Lieutenant Double, and 14 marines, had malarial fever; of the "*Swallow*," 25 of the landing party, including 14 marines, had simple continued fever.

The Surgeons of the ships consider the clothing of the marines rendered them more liable to fever than the sailors.

The fever is attributable to wet, exposure, and the necessary use of shore water in this malarial climate.

All the wounded men suffered from fever.

Extract from letter of Senior Naval Officer, East Coast of Africa Division, to the Commander-in-Chief (duplicate sent to Admiralty).

"*Raleigh*" at Zanzibar,

August 15, 1893.

SIR, I HAVE the honour to report that upon your departure in Her Majesty's ship "*Raccoon*," on

the 15th July, I assumed the duties of Senior Officer of this Division.

2. On the 17th Her Majesty's ships "Blanche," "Swallow," and "Sparrow," with Mr. Rodd, Her Majesty's Acting Consul-General, and General Matthews, Zanzibar Government, on board, proceeded to Lamu, in accordance with your orders, to assist Mr. Rodd in declaring a Protectorate over the territory of Witu.

A report of proceedings from Captain Lindley is attached.

The wounded arrived here yesterday and are all progressing favourably.

Letter from Captain Lindley, of Her Majesty's ship "Blanche," to Senior Officer, reporting proceedings at Pumwani.

Enclosure in Senior Officer's Letter, 15th August, 1893.

SIR, *Mkumbi Camp, August 10, 1893.*

I HAVE the honour to report as follows:—

At the request of Mr. Rodd, Her Majesty's Consul-General, and in pursuance of your order to render him all assistance in my power, I landed all the force at my disposal, and the field gun having arrived, we were ready to advance on Pumwani, hoping to settle things peaceably, but ready to fight if necessary.

We left this camp on Saturday, 5th August, and encamped about half-way to Pumwani that night. At about 8.30 A.M. on the following day,* when about a mile from Pumwani, the enemy commenced to fire, but were invisible owing to there being forest on both sides, and plain trees and fields of millet in front. I sent out skirmishers and supports, and fired rockets in the direction of the enemy's fire; General Hatch with native troops was skirmishing on the right. After advancing half-a-mile we came to a clearing of about 200 yards across in the bush; again we were subjected to a severe cross fire, and in front, about 100 yards down a narrow path was the outer gate of the village. I then ordered the field gun to fire on it, the skirmishers were closed and the supports ordered up and volleys fired into the bush where the enemy were firing from, and rocket tubes were also keeping up a smart fire. I left Mr. Rodd with a guard of marines and a company of seamen in reserve, the doctor's party, and porters with spare ammunition and provisions about 400 yards in rear. The enemy continued to keep up a heavy fire from the gate in front and their rifle pits on either flank, which were concealed in the bush, and we had several men wounded. At last after one and a half hour's heavy fire and apparently with little effect on the enemy, and the field gun having fired some 20 shell against the gate, and Lieutenant Fitzmaurice and Sub-Lieutenant Gervis being wounded, I ordered the gate to be stormed and the guncotton party to follow.

3. The storming party, who were gallantly led by Lieutenant Molteno and Sub-Lieutenant Thorpe-Doublle, consisted of a company from the "Blanche," one from the "Swallow," also half a company of Marines. These being unable to get in or over, I order them to fall back and the gun to be brought close up to the gate and fired. This having little effect, the gun was run back and the guncotton party under Mr. Kelsey,

Boatswain, blew up the gate in a very gallant and effectual manner.

4. When our party rushed in, the enemy were in full flight into the bush where it was useless to follow them.

Mr. Rodd, who had been in a very trying and dangerous position under fire, then came in, and I had the wounded and porters with stores brought in, and the town was in our possession after two hours' hard fighting.

5. I wish especially to mention the following Officers:—Commander Sampson, who ably assisted me throughout, Lieutenant Hutchison, who commanded the skirmishers, Lieutenant Fitzmaurice, who commanded the rocket party and field gun, Sub-Lieutenant Gervis, who was under him, Lieutenant Molteno and Sub-Lieutenant Thorpe-Doublle, who stormed the gate, Mr. Kelsey, Boatswain, who blew the gate up, Mr. Higgins, Gunner, who ably commanded his Company, Surgeon Lilly, who attended to the wounded under a heavy fire.

6. The next day, by wish of Mr. Rodd, we destroyed the crops and pulled the town down, also destroying the fortifications, which consisted of outer and inner gates (built of trees), seven rifle pits, capable of holding 20 men in each and concealed by the bush. We returned here yesterday after burning the town, and remain for the present. I am sending the wounded to Zanzibar.

7. I should have mentioned also the coolness and gallantry of all under my command, particularly the Marines under Sergeant Batten, Royal Marine Light Infantry. We were ably assisted by General Hatch and his 80 native troops; also Dr. Rae, in Mr. Rodd's staff, rendered most valuable assistance to our wounded; and Mr. Rogers, of the Imperial British East African Company, was invaluable from his knowledge of the country and languages and his gallantry and ready resource.

8. The Naval Force engaged was:—10 Officers, 121 seamen and stokers, 36 marines, 5 kroomen, 5 seedies, 3 interpreters.

Letter from Captain Lindley, of "Blanche," to Senior Officer, reporting proceedings at Jongeni.

Enclosure in Senior Officer's letter of 15th August, 1893.

Her Majesty's Ship "Blanche," at Lamu, August 17, 1893.

SIR, IN continuation of my last letter, dated 10th August, I have the honour to report as follows:—

* Subsequent Despatch of 17th August states the fight took place Monday, 7th August.

Mr. Rodd, Her Majesty's Diplomatic Agent and Consul-General, having written to the Mahadi, the Chief of Jongeni, and waited 48 hours for a reply, requested me to accompany him with the force at my disposal. This I did, leaving Mkumbi at noon on the 12th with the Naval Brigade, consisting of 10 officers and 173 men, one nine-pounder field gun, and two rocket tubes. Also Brigadier-General Hatch, with 70 native troops and about 200 native porters.

2. We encamped that night about seven miles from Mkumbi, and at daylight next morning proceeded on the path to Jongeni.

3. About half an hour after leaving camp the enemy commenced a dropping fire from the forest on our right flank about 500 yards off; the enemy not being visible I took no notice of this, and continued the march, keeping the column well closed up. The country was of a park-like nature, interspersed with clumps of forest, offering an admirable position for an attack.

4. After proceeding about three miles from our camp, at about eight o'clock we were again fired on, and Mr. Rogers pointed out to me the position of Jongeni; we were now entering a large clearing in the forest stretching away to right and left, richly cultivated with rice, corn, and plantains, and the gates could be seen about 400 yards in front in the forest beyond.

5. I then ordered some of the skirmishers to fire, in order to draw the enemy's fire and to show me the position of the bomas (rifle pits). This had the desired effect, a heavy fire being opened from the gate and bomas on either side of it. The field gun and rockets were now brought into action, and delivered a well-directed fire on the gates and bomas, one rocket setting fire to a portion of the town. After an hour the enemy's fire slackened considerably and we gradually advanced.

6. When within 100 yards of the gate I gave the order to charge, and this was gallantly done by three companies of seamen and stokers under Lieutenants Hutchison and Molteno and Sub-Lieutenant Thorpe-Douglas, General Matthews and Mr. Rogers being with them. At the same time General Hatch with the Soudanese, and assisted by the marines, charged and drove the enemy from the bomas and the bush on either side of the gates, the guncotton party under Mr. Kelsey, Boatswain, blew them in, and the town was in our possession after an hour's hard fighting.

8. I cannot speak too highly of the conduct of all under my command. I had the same officers as at Pumwani, with the exception of Lieutenant Fitzmaurice and Sub-Lieutenant Gervis, who were wounded there, and who were replaced by Lieutenant Cole and Sub-Lieutenant Lockhart, in charge of the field gun and rockets, which were admirably worked against the enemy's position.

9. In the afternoon we were employed destroying the enemy's bomas and crops, and also destroyed three villages. On the following morning we were similarly engaged, and at noon left Jongeni, after burning it.

10. We arrived at Mkumbi in the evening. On the following day the landing parties from the "Swallow" and "Sparrow," with all stores, marched to Mkonumbi, and encamped there for the night, returning to their ships on the following morning (16th). The rest of the Naval Brigade, with the Consul-General, returned on board this morning (17th).

11. In accordance with orders received, the "Swallow" proceeds to Zanzibar this afternoon,

and the "Sparrow" to Mombasa with telegrams, and I hope to leave with the Consul-General on Saturday, calling at Mombasa, and arriving at Zanzibar on Tuesday, 22nd. I made an error in the date of the fight at Pumwani in my last letter; it should have been Monday, the 7th, not the 6th, as stated.

12. In conclusion, I wish to bring to your notice the good behaviour of all under my command. Commander Sampson I especially recommend to your notice, as he has behaved with untiring zeal and ability. Mr. Crocker, Clerk, has been in charge of stores, &c., at Mkumbi, and displayed great zeal and ability in discharge of this important duty. Lieutenant Wake has conducted the duties of Senior Officer during my absence much to my satisfaction, and Lieutenant Kiddle has acted as Transport Officer with zeal and ability, also making several rough surveys. General Matthews has afforded the Naval Brigade every assistance, and has provided them with every comfort, and we cannot be too grateful to him. Personally, he has rendered me valuable assistance in the face of the enemy by his experience and advice.

I enclose the list of casualties, which I am glad to say is small, and attributable to the enemy firing too high, and our being able to silence their fire with the field gun and rockets before storming the gates. I have not been able to obtain as yet any trustworthy information as to the enemy's loss. Accompanying are two rough plans of the fights at Pumwani and Jongeni by Commander Sampson.

Extract from Letter of Proceedings from the Commander of the "Raccoon," dated 27th August, 1893.

Enclosure in Commander-in-Chief's Letter of 3rd September, 1893.

On arrival at Kismayu this morning (27th) I found Her Majesty's ship "Blanche" and His Italian Majesty's ship "Staffetta" at anchor.

Lieutenant Hutchison came on board and fully reported to me the events up to date.

I think the "Blanche's" arrival was most opportune.

It would appear that the reported disquiet at Kismayu was fully justified.

The mutineers, some 100 in number, no doubt assisted by some Somalis, opened with a rifle fire, on the Administrator's house principally, the firing ceasing at daylight. It is not supposed many men were in the affair; it was no doubt to try the feeling of the garrison, who were largely supposed to be in league with the mutineers.

Lieutenant Hutchison has been down with fever until this morning, received during the late expedition at Lamu, so that the responsibility of the ship and the action taken devolved on Lieutenant Lewes.

In forwarding the report of proceedings of these two officers I consider the measures taken by Lieutenant Lewes reflect great credit on all concerned, and that the latter officer acted with resource and courage on a very hazardous expedition.

In conclusion, I would like to mention the readiness with which Captain Incoronato, of His

Majesty's Italian ship "Staffetta," came on board, and offered most ready and hearty assistance, and also to remain as long as I wished. I may add this was courteously acknowledged, but not accepted, the first reason being there was no occasion to do so.

Letter from Lieutenant Lewes to Senior Naval Officer reporting proceedings at Kismayu.

Enclosure in Commander-in-Chief's Letter of 3rd September, 1893.

*Steamship "Kenia," at Gobwen,
August 25, 1893.*

SIR,

IN pursuance of orders received from the Senior Naval Officer at Zanzibar (the Captain of Her Majesty's ship "Blanche" being sick in Hospital at Zanzibar, and the Senior Lieutenant being on the sick list), I have the honour to report as follows:—

2. I left Zanzibar at 7 A.M. on Tuesday, the 22nd instant, and proceeded with all despatch to Kismayu, where we arrived at noon on Wednesday, 23rd.

3. On arrival here Mr. Farrant, the representative of the Imperial British East African Company, and Count Lovatelli, came on board and informed me that 54 of the Hyderabad Contingent had mutinied, joined the Somalis, and attacked Turki Hill Fort, killing Mr. Hamilton, of the Imperial British East African Company, who was in charge, and which was totally destroyed.

On the 18th the Somalis attacked Kismayu; after three hours' hard fighting they were driven back by Count Lovatelli and Mr. Farrant with the small friendly force at their disposal.

Further, that the two Englishmen, viz., Captain Tritton and Mr. McDougall were still alive and on board the steamship "Kenia" up the River Juba, but they were in the greatest danger, and were unable to leave the ship. I received information that the mutineers and Somalis were going to attack on Thursday night, 24th, or Friday, 25th.

Count Lovatelli most kindly offered to guide and assist the rescue of these two officials, if I could help him with a small force.

As there were 40 bluejackets and marines, and three executive officers on the sick list with fever, the result of previous operations on shore, and the enemy's force was known to consist of 150 rifles, 600 spearmen, and the surrounding Somalis hostile to all Europeans, and the two cannon they had obtained from Turki Hill Fort, I decided to call for volunteers, and obtaining 38 men, left at 7.30 P.M. for Gobwen, to endeavour to rescue these officials.

After a forced and trying march, owing to the anticipation of attack at any moment, under the guidance of Count Lovatelli, we retook Turki Hill Fort at 1 A.M. (midnight), the enemy running off as we entered. We found some of the late Mr. Hamilton's remains, which we buried, and a few of his effects.

Reaching Gobwen, 1½ hours afterwards, we embarked on board the steamship "Kenia," where we found Captain Tritton and Mr. McDougall well, but worn out, as they had been expecting an attack at any time for ten days.

The men, being tired out after the march, it was impossible to return with the Europeans at once as was first anticipated, and the men were housed on board the steamship "Kenia."

Next morning, after a consultation with the representatives of the Imperial British East African Company and Count Lovatelli, and the

men not being fit for the long march, I proceeded up the River Juba, with Count Lovatelli and the Company's officials, in order to strike an immediate blow at the enemy, who were responsible for Mr. Hamilton's death.

I placed the ship in a state of defence by means of iron plates, cut up canoes, sand bags, and bales of piece goods, placed two Maxim and one Hotchkiss gun in position, and took 14 Keribitos and eight Zanzibar Askaris on board; steam was raised, but it was unfortunate that after proceeding a short way we had to draw fires, on account of the donkey feed pump breaking down, which caused a delay of four hours off the enemy's shore, and gave warning of our approach.

Proceeding up the river we shelled and destroyed Magarada village; thence, at Count Lovatelli's request, after shelling and firing war rockets, I landed, with 30 men, and took Hajualla, a town in the river, after one hour's fighting.

After killing 18 men, and having burnt and destroyed the town (population about 1,000 inhabitants), capturing one prisoner, we crossed the river, landed with every available man, and, after one and a half hour's fighting, took Hajawen, in the British sphere (consisting of about 700 houses and huts).

The mutineers were outside this town, together with some hundreds of Somalis, who being armed with Sniders and plenty of ammunition, responded actively to our fire.

Numbers of the Somalis fell to volley firing, but owing to the smallness of the party and the distance of the town from the steamship "Kenia," I could not ascertain the number killed, but fully 70 went down; this was corroborated the next day by a friendly Chief, who stated there were over 100 killed.

I then returned to the town, which was burnt and totally destroyed.

Two villages about three miles from where we left the "Kenia," were treated in the same manner.

Several of the late Mr. Hamilton's effects, including a tin case with his name painted on it, were found in the town (Hajawen), proving these people to be implicated in his murder; they were much damaged but brought back to Gobwen.

The ivory could not be found, but cattle, sheep, and donkeys, which could not be transported, were shot.

About ten rifles were found and brought away, but the two cannon had been carried away in the bush.

These two towns had been the great annoyance of the country owing to the raids of extortionate customs levied by the inhabitants on all dhows passing up and down the river, and although they have often been attacked by the neighbouring tribes, they have never before been effectually punished. Mr. McDougall and Count Lovatelli inform me that a great blow has been given to their power in that district.

My reasons for attacking them were:—

1st. To deal a decisive blow at once, so that I might have a chance to get back with the Company's Officers without my being attacked by the enemy on the road to Kismayu, which is particularly suited, owing to the bush and surrounding hills, for their style of attack.

2nd. To punish the culprits for murdering an Englishman.

The enemy are supposed to have retired on Yonti, about four miles higher up the river; but owing to my small force and defective state of the boilers of the "Kenia," I decided not to follow them up; I therefore returned to Gobwen.

At the Council held on board the steamship "Kenia" on the 25th August, 1893, there were present, Captain Tritton, and Mr. McDougall, representing the Imperial British East African Company, Chiefs Omari bin Jaffir and Akidi Awall, and myself, representing the British Government.

The Chiefs were most friendly and willingly accepted the charge of the steamship "Kenia."

After three hours' consultation it was decided to give equal presents to these Chiefs, and to leave eight Sniders and ammunition for the defence of the forts and steamship "Kenia."

The Chief Omari bin Jaffir professed the greatest friendship for the English Government, and the Company, and would do all in his power to assist in defence of the steamer.

He would visit Kismayu if the Consul-General came there; and I assured him if he came to Zanzibar, His Highness the Sultan would give him a house to live in, and that he would be well treated, and that the Consul-General would be very glad to see him.

The steamship "Kenia" has been left in equal charge of the two Chiefs, one living on board, and one on shore. If there are signs of attack, they will send to Kismayu for assistance, which I have promised them should there be a man-of-war present, either to defend the "Kenia," or defend themselves if the "Kenia" is taken.

She lies in mid-channel between two forts, moored with three anchors down, and is as safe as it is possible to leave her under the circumstances.

She has trade goods to the value of 20,000 rupees on board; but her three guns I have brought back, and under all the circumstances it was decided to leave everything in the "Kenia," as although transports were asked from Kismayu, none came, and it was with much regret we left so much valuable property; but, as the lives of the small party were still in considerable danger, nothing else could be done, and I trust everything eventually will be saved.

I ordered an approximate survey of the ship and cargo with a view of clearing the Company's officers, concerning their books and accounts.

But until more peaceful times, the Company will be unable to move the ship without a force, and at present the only feed pump of the boiler is in a very defective condition, and must be repaired.

I would wish to bring to your notice Mr. Louis Barber, Gunner, who greatly assisted me throughout with his untiring energy, forethought, and suggestions concerning the defence of the "Kenia," and plan of attack, and in action he was always to the front.

The Count Lovatelli, who was the first to volunteer for the rescue of the Company's officials in the River Juba, was of the greatest assistance to me throughout with his knowledge of the country, resource, and general advice, and during the fighting behaved gallantly.

I would wish most strongly to bring to the notice of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty George T. Carey, Engine Room Artificer, Third Class, official number 141,577, and Alfred White, Leading Stoker, official number 114,956, and the four Stokers who repaired damages to the boiler of the "Kenia" on the two occasions when she was completely broken down; and serious consequences might have ensued on the second occasion had we been compelled to remain the night where we were. This work was performed under the enemy's fire, and I can honestly recommend them for some mark of

their Lordships' appreciation for the zeal and skill with which the work was done.

I have much pleasure in saying that there were no casualties on our side.

In conclusion, I can only say that the men who voluntarily accompanied me performed the forced and arduous marches they had to undergo in the most creditable and enduring manner, and were cool and collected under fire. I submit the attached list for your notice, as all the men were volunteers and of such miscellaneous ratings as to reflect great credit on them.

QUARANTINE STATION.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of London as a foreign animals quarantine station (in this Order called the Quarantine Station):

All that space situate at the Tilbury Docks, in the county of Essex, the property of the London and India Docks Joint Committee, lying between the shed known as the J Shed at the Eastern Department of the said Docks and the Quay Wall of the said Docks, and including the said J Shed, and also including the space extending for a distance of fifteen feet in the rear of the said J Shed.

And do hereby prescribe as follows:

1. When landed the animals shall forthwith be placed in certain Baggage Trucks prepared for their reception in the said space in the rear of the said J Shed and shall be there kept until moved thereout in accordance with the regulations contained in Article 20 of the Foreign Animals Order of 1893.

2. The said Baggage Trucks shall not be removed from the said space in the rear of the said J Shed so long as the animals remain therein.

3.
