PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by the "Manchester Ship Canal Act, 1885," section three, from and after the completion and opening for traffic of the Canal, the said Canal, and so much of the navigable waters of the Rivers Mersey and Irwell, as lie between Hunt's Bank in Manchester, and the limit of the Port of Liverpool at Warrington, and all channels, canals, cuts, docks, and works of the Manchester Ship Canal Company within those limits, are thereby constituted the Harbour and Port of Manchester, and the Company is to be the Harbour Authority of that harbour and port:

And whereas by the same section of the same Act the powers of the Commissioners of the Treasury to appoint a Port of Manchester, under the "Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," with such limits as they may think fit, are not affected:

And whereas the Manchester Ship Canal will be opened for traffic on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four:

And whereas by the "County Courts Admiralty Jurisdiction Act, 1868," it is among other things enacted, that if at any time after the passing of that Act it appears to Her Majesty in Council, on the representation of the Lord Chancellor, expedient that any County Court should have Admiralty jurisdiction, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to appoint that Court to have Admiralty jurisdiction accordingly, and to assign to that Court as its district for Admiralty purposes any part or parts of any one or more district or districts of County Courts:

And whereas a representation has been made by the Lord Chancellor stating that the County Court of Lancashire holden at Manchester should have Admiralty Jurisdiction; and that there should be assigned to that Court, as the district thereof for Admiralty purposes, the districts hereinafter specified.

Now therefore, Her Majesty having taken the said representation into consideration, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and appoint, and it is hereby ordered and appointed, that, from and after the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the County Court of Lancashire holden at

Manchester shall have Admiralty Jurisdiction, and Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid, to assign to the Court hereby appointed to have Admiralty Jurisdiction, as the district thereof for Admiralty purposes, the districts and parts of districts following; that is to say:—

The district of the said County Court of Lancashire holden at Manchester, the district of the County Court of Lancashire holden at Salford, and such parts of the districts of any other County Courts as are comprised within the limits for the time being of the harbour and port of Manchester aforesaid as constituted under the said "Manchester Ship Canal Act, 1885," or the "Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," or other lawful authority.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and forty-two duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a supplemental scheme bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following supplemental scheme, under the twenty-fifth section of that Act, with reference to the provision of a parsonage or house of residence for the rector or incumbent of the united benefice and rectory of Saint Catherine Cree with Saint James, Duke's-place, in the city and diocese of London.

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the fifth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three and published in the London Gazette on the sixth day of the same month, it was directed that certain monies should be paid to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne in aid of a fund for providing a house of residence (of freehold

tenure) for the rector or incumbent of the said united benefice and that such house of residence should be situate within the limits of the same united benefice that is to say within the limits of the one or the other of the parishes of Saint Catherine Cree and Saint James Duke's-place.

"And whereas the fund in the hands of the said Governors towards the provision of the said house of residence has now reached a considerable amount but cannot be applied towards the aforesaid object by reason of the fact that neither a suitable messuage of freehold tenure nor land suitable as a site for the erection of the intended house of residence, can be acquired upon reasonable terms in either of the said parishes of Saint Catherine Cree and Saint James Duke's-place.

'And whereas it has been represented to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England that if the aforesaid restriction as to the situation of the proposed house of residence for the said united benefice were removed it would be possible to secure for the united benefice a suitable house

of residence.

And whereas under the circumstances hereiubefore-mentioned it appears to be desirable and to be competent to us to recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council as follows:-

"Now therefore with the consents of the Bishop of the diocese of the patrons of the said united benefice and of the Vestries of the said two parishes to be affected by this scheme, that is to say with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick Bishop of the said diocese of London, (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the Master and Fellows of the College of Saint Mary Magdalene in the University of Cambridge and of the Mayor, Commonalty and Citizens of the said city of London, as the alternate patrons of the said united benefice (in testimony whereof the said Master and Fellows, and the said Mayor, Commonalty and Citizens have respectively sealed this scheme with their common or corporate seals) and with the consent of the Vestry of each of the two said parishes of Saint Catherine Cree and Saint James, Duke'splace (testified by the chairman of each of the said Vestries having hereunto set his hand pursuant to a resolution passed at each of the same. Vestries respectively at meetings duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England humbly recommend and propose that the provisions of the aforesaid Order of Your Majesty in Council of the fifth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three shall be altered and varied in the manner hereinbefore contemplated that is to say that the restriction imposed by the aforesaid Order of Your Majesty in Council as to the situation of the proposed house of residence for the united benefice shall be removed and that it shall not be necessary that such house of residence shall be actually situate within the limits of the said united benefice.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Supplemental Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify

direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

HEREAS the Ecclesiatical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirtysecond and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the twenty-third day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the words following, that is to

say:-"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Clement Toxteth Park in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese

"Whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the eighth day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two and being under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend John Bird then Bishop of the diocese of Chester a part of the parish of Walton-on-the-Hill in the said county of Lancaster and at that. time in the said diocese of Chester, but now in the diocese of Liverpool aforesaid, was assigned as a particular district to the consecrated church of Saint Clement Toxteth Park situate in the said parish of Walton-on-the-Hill and the said particular district was known as 'The Particular District of Saint Clement Toxteth Park.

"And whereas the said particular district of Saint Clement Toxteth Park has, under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirtyseven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Clement Toxteth Park, should be altered so as to include within its limits a certain additional portion of the

said parish of Walton-on-the-Hill.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend John Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent the said Supplemental Scheme, and to order and recommend and propose that from and after the

day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Clement Toxteth Park shall be altered so as to include within its limits all that further portion of the said parish of Walton-on-the-Hill which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink and that from and after the same date and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portion of the said parish of Walton-on-the-Hill so to be included as aforesaid shall become annexed to and become and be and shall form part of the said new parish of Saint Clement Toxteth Park.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Saint Clement Toxteth Park, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool

being:-

"All that part of the parish of Walton-on-the-Hill, in the said county and diocese (being part of the territory called or known as Toxteth Park) wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south-east by the new parish of All Saints Prince's Park Liverpool, in the county and diocese aforesaid, upon the north-east by the said new parish of Saint Clement Toxteth Park, upon the north-west by the ecclesiastical district of Saint Saviour Liverpool, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Margaret Toxteth Park Liverpool in the county and diocese aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts, and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Liverpool.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by an Order dated the 28th day of August, 1890 (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations"), in exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by Section 130 of The Public Health Act, 1875, and by Section 2 of the Public Health Act, 1889, made certain rules and regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected

with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of that disease;

And whereas by a further Order dated the 6th day of September, 1892, We made additional Regulations for the prevention of the spread of Cholera, and by Article V thereof directed that such Order should be read as one with the Regulations;

And whereas it is provided by Article 6 of the Regulations that every Port Sanitary Authority and every other Sanitary Authority within whose District persons are likely to be landed from any ship coming foreign shall, as speedily as practicable, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place where the Master of any ship certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera shall, as required by Article 10 of the Regulations, moor or anchor such ship until the requirements of the Regulations have been duly fulfilled; and that the place to be fixed as aforesaid shall be some place within the jurisdiction or district of the Sanitary Authority, unless We otherwise consent;

And whereas it is further provided by the said Article 6 that any place fixed as aforesaid, with Our consent, outside the jurisdiction or district of a Sanitary Authority, shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to be within such jurisdiction or district;

And whereas the said Sanitary Authority propose to fix the place hereinafter referred to, and shown on the Map or Chart in the Schedule annexed to this Order, as the place where any ship may be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations, and such place being situate without their jurisdiction or district, have made application to Us for Our consent in the matter;

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by the above-mentioned Sections, and of every other power enabling Us in this behalf, do hereby Declare, Order, and Direct as follows:-

ARTICLE I.—We Consent to the said Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Bridlington fixing, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the Port of Hull, the place shown by the circle drawn in red on the Map or Chart in the Schedule to this Order, as the place where any ship bound to any place within the District of such Sanitary Authority, and certified under the Regulations to be infected with Cholera, shall be moored or anchored for the purpose of Article 10 of the Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—The jurisdiction of the said Sanitary Authority shall, for the purposes of the Regulations, be deemed to extend, and, subject to the provisions of this Order, the Regulations shall apply, to any ship certified as aforesaid, which, in pursuance of the Regulations, or of any directions given thereunder, shall be moored at the place fixed as a mooring station, and hereinbefore referred to, or which shall be on its way thither.
