PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the "Manchester Ship Canal Act, 1885," section three, from and after the completion and opening for traffic of the Canal, the said Canal, and so much of the navigable waters of the Rivers Mersey and Irwell, as lie between Hunt's Bank in Manchester, and the limit of the Port of Liverpool at Warrington, and all channels, canals, cuts, docks, and works of the Manchester Ship Canal Company within those limits, are thereby constituted the Harbour and Port of Manchester, and the Company is to be the Harbour Authority of that harbour and port:

And whereas by the same section of the same Act the powers of the Commissioners of the Treasury to appoint a Port of Manchester, under the "Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," with such limits as they may think fit, are not affected:

And whereas the Manchester Ship Canal will be opened for traffic on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four:

And whereas by the "County Courts Admiralty Jurisdiction Act, 1868," it is among other things enacted, that if at any time after the passing of that Act it appears to Her Majesty in Council, on the representation of the Lord Chancellor, expedient that any County Court should have Admiralty jurisdiction, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to appoint that Court to have Admiralty jurisdiction accordingly, and to assign to that Court as its district for Admiralty purposes any part or parts of any one or more district or districts of County Courts:

And whereas a representation has been made by the Lord Chancellor stating that the County Court of Lancashire holden at Manchester should have Admiralty Jurisdiction; and that there should be assigned to that Court, as the district thereof for Admiralty purposes, the districts hereinafter specified.

Now therefore, Her Majesty having taken the said representation into consideration, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and appoint, and it is hereby ordered and appointed, that, from and after the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the County Court of Lancashire holden at

Manchester shall have Admiralty Jurisdiction, and Her Majesty is further pleased, by and with the advice aforesaid, to assign to the Court hereby appointed to have Admiralty Jurisdiction, as the district thereof for Admiralty purposes, the districts and parts of districts following; that is to say:—

The district of the said County Court of Lancashire holden at Manchester, the district of the County Court of Lancashire holden at Salford, and such parts of the districts of any other County Courts as are comprised within the limits for the time being of the harbour and port of Manchester aforesaid as constituted under the said "Manchester Ship Canal Act, 1885," or the "Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," or other lawful authority.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and forty-two duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a supplemental scheme bearing date the twenty-seventh day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, in the words following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following supplemental scheme, under the twenty-fifth section of that Act, with reference to the provision of a parsonage or house of residence for the rector or incumbent of the united benefice and rectory of Saint Catherine Cree with Saint James, Duke's-place, in the city and diocese of London.

"Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the fifth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three and published in the London Gazette on the sixth day of the same month, it was directed that certain monies should be paid to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne in aid of a fund for providing a house of residence (of freehold
