THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 12th December, 1893, from Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia, reporting that the Supreme Sanitary Council of Sofia have decided that travellers arriving from Austria-Hungary and Roumania, by way of the Danube, shall be allowed to enter Bulgaria after a medical inspection and disinfection of luggage.

Travellers arriving from the Roumanian Black Sea ports shall be subjected only to twenty-four hours' medical observation and strict disinfection

of luggage.

Goods arriving from Austria-Hungary and Roumania shall now be admitted into Bulgaria without quarantine or disinfection. Also goods, hitherto prohibited, shall be admitted free into Bulgaria from Austria-Hungary and Roumania if accompanied by a certificate stating that they come direct from those countries, and not in transit from contaminated countries, such as Turkey and Russia, in which latter case they will not be allowed admission.

These regulations are in force since the 8th instant.

The observation station on the Island of Hven, in the Oresund, is closed from and after the 13th instant. The observation station at Bredvik, outside Umeå, is closed since the 12th instant, and those at Juniskären, outside Sundsvall, at Häron, in the neighbourhood of Sandhamn, in the Stockholm Archipelago, at Arkö, in the Ostergötland Archipelago, at Enholmen, outside Slite, in Gotland, and at Vestra Hastholmen, in the Karlscrona Archipelago, are closed from the

The observation station at Köpstadsö, and the quarantine station at Känsö, in the Gothenburg Archipelago, and the observation and quarantine station at the Island of Fejan, near Furusund, in the Stockholm Archipelago, remain in use.

Now know ye, that the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in exercise and execution of the powers or authorities for this purpose contained in the several Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts" as aforesaid, or in some of them, and particularly in the Act of the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter thirty-eight, in the said Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and in the said Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling them in this behalf, do hereby, with the consent of the said James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified by his being a party to and executing these presents), assign to the said church of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, as a particular district, all those contiguous portions of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Andrew, Livesey, and of the said new parish of Feniscowles, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended, and do direct that the same shall be called "The Particular District of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe."

And the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the like consent of the said James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester (testified as aforesaid), in further exercise and execution of the powers or authorities contained in the said Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts," or in some of them, and particularly in the said Act of the first and second years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter thirtyeight, in the Act of the third and fourth years of Her present Majesty, chapter sixty, in the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-six (such two lastly-mentioned Acts being also two of "The Church Building Acts" before named), in the said Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and in the said Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, and of all other powers or authorities in anywise enabling them in this behalf, do hereby determine and declare that banns of matrimony shall be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be solemnized or performed at the church of the said particular district of Saint Francis Feniscliffe, and do hereby order and direct that all the fees, dues, offerings, or other emoluments to be received in respect of such publication of banns of matrimony, and of such solemnization or performance of marriages, bap-

tisms, churchings, and burials at the same church shall, from and after the next avoidance of the perpetual curacy of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Andrew, Livesey, and of the vicarage of the said new parish of Feniscowles respectively, belong to the Incumbent for the time being of the said particular district of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.
