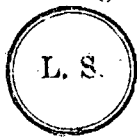

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked to the extent in that Schedule mentioned.

2. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order before the date of this revocation.

SCHEDULE.

The Order of the Privy Council dated the twenty-third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five approving of parts of the Port of Southampton as landing-places for foreign animals not subject to slaughter or quarantine.

The whole Order so far as it is unrevoked.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the eleventh day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, defining a part of the Port of London as a foreign animals quarantine station: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order before the date of this revocation.
