INSTRUMENT assigning a Particular District to the Church of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, situate within the limits of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Livesey, in the county of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester.

To all to whom these presents shall come the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and the Right Reverend James, Bishop of the Diocese of Manchester, send greeting:

Whereas a church has lately been built within the limits of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Andrew, Livesey, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester, by and at the expense of certain well-disposed persons, who have, with the approbation of the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and of the said James, Bishop of the said diocese of Manchester, secured to the said new church an endowment and a repair fund, in accordance with the provisions of the several Acts of Parliament called "The Church Building Acts," or of some of them, and particularly of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her present Majesty, chapter ninety-seven.

And whereas under the powers or authorities contained in the said Acts, or of some of them, and in the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said Majesty, chapter fifty-five, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have, with the consent of the said James, Bishop of the said diocese of Matchester, by an instrument bearing date on or about the twenty-first day of November, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, declared that the perpetual right of patronage of, and of nominating a Minister to serve, the said new church from time to time and at all times whenever
