England—South Coast,—Portland Harbour.

Additional Harbour Works,

NOTICE is hereby given, that additional harbour works are about to be commenced at Portland, between the end of the breakwater and Bincleave Rocks. These works will be marked in the following manner:—

1. A groyne will be constructed near Bincleave Rocks which will extend in a south-east direction. The inner end of this groyne is situated southwest 685 yards from the Coast Guard Flagstaff on the Nothe.

Whilst in course of construction the outer end of this groyne will be marked by red buoys and a light-vessel. The light-vessel will exhibit, by day, two red balls, placed vertically; and by night two red lights, placed vertically. In foggy weather a bell will be rung.

Vessels are warned not to anchor within a cable's length of these buoys, nor to pass between them, nor between the light-vessel and Bincleave Rocks.

2. Between the end of the groyne aforementioned and the head of Portland Breakwater, four detached structures are to be erected; the first will be situated with the centre of the breakwater fort bearing S. 27° E., distant 1,975 yards; the second structure will be situated South 700 feet from the first; the third structure will be situated S. 28° E. 765 yards from the second; and the fourth structure will be situated with the breakwater fort bearing S. 50° E., distant 700 feet.

During the building of these structures they will be marked by vessels moored over their sites, which vessels will each show by day two white balls, placed vertically; and by night, two white lights, placed vertically. When the structures are sufficiently advanced to be above water the light-vessels will be withdrawn and the vertical lights exhibited from the structures themselves.

In foggy weather a beli will be rung on board each vessel.

Mariners are cautioned not to approach these vessels too closely.

Note.—The spaces between the structures, and between No. 1 structure and the end of the groyne from Bincleave Rocks, will be available for navigation until further notice.

AUSTRALIA-SOUTH COAST.-PORT PHILIP. Geelong Approach-Depth in New Ship Channel, and Intended Alterations in Lights and Buoys.

THE Government of Victoria has given notice, dated 18th October, 1893, that the New Ship Channel, entrance to Geelong Inner Harbour, has been completed throughout its entire length of 2 miles to a depth of 22 feet at low water for a width of 110 feet; and that consequently, on 20th December, 1893, the following alterations will be made in the lights and buoys in the vicinity and

1. New Ship Channel Lights.—The north side of New Ship Channel will be marked by four fixed white lights, each elevated 26 feet above the sea, visible 6 miles, and exhibited from a pile structure situated about 20 feet northward of the northern side of the channel; the structures being at equal distances of 4,040 feet apart.

2. Buoys in Approach.—The buoys marking Prince George Bank, Point Richards, and Wilson Spit will each be replaced by a gas buoy showing an occulting light (six to eight flashes and eclipses every minute), visible six miles in clear weather.

Prince George Bank Buoy will show a white light; Point Richards Buoy a red light; and Wilson Spit Buoy a white light.
