following précis of a Brazilian Decree, relating to sanitary precautions against the introduction of infectious diseases.

(Partly in Précis.)

Translation of portions of the Brazilian Decrec, No. 1558, of October 7, 1893, regulating the Sanitary Service of the ports of the

ART. 4. The Inspector-General shall . . . (11) in times of epidemics see to the berthing

and movements of ships.

ART. 14.—Sec. 4. If the information furnished by the ship is not satisfactory, or if the ship comes from a suspected or infected port, the Sanitary Authority shall not go on board, but shall order the ship to the nearest quarantine station.

Sec. 5. If the information furnished is satisfactory, but if it appears on proceeding to carry out the "ordinary inspection" of the ship that the information was not exact, or that there was bad faith in respect of information given as to the health of the ship, the Sanitary Authority shall not proceed further with the inspection, and shall order the ship to undergo "rigorous inspection" at the quarantine station. Sec. 6. If the information furnished was inexact

only on points of secondary importance which did not concern the health of the ship, the Sanitary Authority shall proceed with the ordinary examination, shall vise the Bill of Health and return it to the master, who shall be fined in accordance with the provisions of these regu-

ART. 20. No private medical practitioner may be on board a ship without obtaining the permission of the Sanitary Authority, and he shall report the nature of the illness from which his patient is suffering.

ART. 24. If a private doctor finds that his patient is suffering from any pestilential malady he shall so inform the authorities, and shall cease

to attend such patient.

ART. 25.—Sec. 4. If the case on board is one of contagious sickness, but not pestilential, the ship shall not be sent to the quarantine anchorage unless the town and port are free from such zickness.

Sec. 5. If the case is pestilential, the ship shall at once be sent to the nearest quarantine station, if the port and town are free from such pestilential sickness.

Bills of Health.

ART. 26. The following ships must exhibit Bills of Health on entering a Brazilian port: (1) Ships from any foreign port; (2) Ships from a Brazilian port where there is a Health Inspector.

The following ships need not exhibit a Bill of Health: (1) Ships running regularly between ports in the same State; (2) Foreign ships of war stationed in Brazilian ports and making excursions to other ports in the Republic; (3) Cruisers; (4) Fishing vessels; (5) Ships entering

ART. 27. Every ship from abroad must be furnished with the following documents:—(1) A Bill of Health issued by the Local Authority and bearing the visa of the Brazilian Consul or of the consul of a nation in friendly relations with Brazil; (2) a Bill of Health, also with visa, from each port of call; (3) a Bill of Health from each Brazilian port touched at.

Measures by Sea.

ART. 40. Medical commissioners may be sent to places where pestilential maladies have appeared, and may be ordered to go on board vessels sailing for Brazil.

Quarantine.

ART. 44. Definitions:—
"Infected Port."—One where a pestilential

epidemic has appeared.

"Suspected Port."—(1) One where isolated cases of pestilential sickness have occurred; (2) one maintaining easy and frequent communications with infected places; (3) one not taking sufficient precautions in accordance with sense of the present Decree against infected ports.
"Infected Ship."—One having had a case of

pestilential sickness on board.

"Suspected Ship."—(1) One coming from an infected or suspected port, but not having had a case on board; (2) one coming from a clean port, but having touched at a suspected or infected port; (3) one having communicated with an infected or suspected ship, the ports of origin and call of which are not known; (4) one having had a death from an illness the nature of which is not known, or several deaths from one illness; (5) one not having the Bills of Health required by this Decree.

"Suspected Objects."-Those capable of re-

taining or transmitting contagion:-

(1) Cotton, hemp, wool, flax, silk, unmanufactured; (2) hair, horsehair, and feathers, raw; 3) letters, newspapers, closed papers, the sacks, &c., containing them, unless tarred, sacks, &c., containing them, unless tarred, mails; (4) fresh or dried raw skins, skins with the hair tanned or not; (5) vegetable hair, hay, alfafa, herbs, "sumauma," pressed or in bales; (6) used furniture, carpets, and fixtures from rooms, articles stuffed, &c., with cotton, hemp, wool, flax, silk, or hair, old or new; (7) clothing of all kinds and personal luggage; (8) portions of animals, fresh; (9) fruit, fresh vegetables, and garden produce, and fresh milk products; (10) cuttings of all kinds and rags properly so called.

(11) Jerked meat.

The articles mentioned under (8), (9), (10), and (11) may not be imported when coming from infected or suspected places.

The Government declares what ports are "infected" or "suspected," the list thereof shall

be published officially.

ART. 45. Ships sailing to Brazilian ports and wishing to enjoy the privileges granted to mail ships ("paquets") must submit to the provisions of the present Decree, which divides ships into three classes :-- (1) Steamers carrying less than 100 steerage passengers; (2) emigrant ships, i.e., ships carrying more than 100 steerage passengers, whether they enjoy the privileges of mail ships or not; (3) sailing ships. Sec. 1.—Ships of the first and second classes

must carry a doctor, and be provided with-

A disinfecting stove, using superheated steam under pressure.

Disinfectants, and disinfecting appliances as required by this Decree.

A drug book, showing those on board at the beginning of the voyage, and those procured during the voyage.

A prescription book.

A minutely-kept register of illnesses, and remedies administered.

A passenger list showing names, age, sex, nationality, profession, and whence travelling.

Crew list.

Cargo manifest.

Sec. 2.—The leaves of these books shall be opened, sealed, and initialled by the Brazilian Consul at the port of origin, and the leaves referring to each voyage cancelled by the Sanitary Authority of the port of arrival. The books shall be initialled, &c., without charge to

the master. If there is no Brazilian Consul, the consul of a nation in friendly relations with

Brazil shall initial, &c., the book.

Sec. 3.—All the ship's papers shall be submitted for examination to the Consular Authority at the ports of origin and call, and to the Sanitary Authority at the port of arrival. The former shall note on the Bills of Health how far all the required documents are on board.

Art. 46.—There shall be two kinds of quarantine:—(a) Quarantine of observation; and

(b) Rigorous quarantine.

Sec. 1. Quarantine of observation consists in the detention of the ship during the time necessary for a rigorous sanitary inspection.

Sec. 2. Rigorous quarantine has two ob-

jects:

(1) That namely of ascertaining whether any passenger from an infected or suspected port is suffering from a pestilential disease in condition of incubation; (2) And of disinfecting objects suspected of

retaining or transmitting infection.

ART. 47. In its practical sense, quarantine of observation consists in the rigorous inspection referred to in Article 14, Section 5, and will be carried out as follows at a quarantine station by the medical director of the lazaretto: inspection of all the ship's papers; comparison of the quantities of drugs left in the pharmacy with those entered in the stock book and with those entered in the prescription book, so as to ascertain which have been most used and most frequently used for treating illness on board during the voyage; roll call of crew and passengers from the lists and ascertaining of reasons why any are missing; examination of witnesses to establish the truth; taking of written evidence necessary for determining and justifying the sanitary treatment to be accorded to the ship; ascertaining the hygienic condition of the ship; and taking all measures for ascertaining the truth in regard thereto which may seem

If after the inspection is over the medical officer of the lazaretto does not think that he can on account of well founded doubts apply to a suspected ship the treatment provided under those regulations, he may detain the ship for time sufficient to enable him to consult the head of the Maritime Sanitary Department. He shall be consulted by the most expeditious and rapid channel, and whatever he orders shall

be done.

ART. 48. Rigorous quarantine shall be applied.

To infected ships.

2) To ships on board which cases of undefined sickness have occurred, the nature of which could not be determined at the sanitary inspection of the ship.

ART. 49. Rigorous quarantine is of fixed dura-It involves the disembarkation of the passengers and of the cargo at a lazaretto, the purification and ultimately the grant of the free pratique when the danger to the public health is over.

ART. 50. When there is no room for more persons at a lazaretto, rigorous quarantine may be performed on board the ship itself becoming

a supplementary lazaretto.

If the number of persons or the quantity of cargo on board makes it impossible properly to carry out the process of disinfection, the passengers and cargo or the one or the other shall be transferred to another ship. Such transhipment shall entail no extra expense on the sanitary administration, the whole expense is to be borne by the ship in quarantine.

ART. 51. The fixed duration of rigorous

quarantine shall be the maximum duration of the incubation period of the pestilential illness to be kept out, namely, the yellow fever and cholera morbus, eight days, and for oriental plague, 20 days

The duration of quarantine for other pestilential sicknesses is dependent on circumstances, and will be fixed by the sanitary authorities.

This fixed duration may be reckoned in one of

two ways:

(a) Commencing from the date of the last case that occurred during the voyage.

(b) Commencing from the date of the landing

of the passengers at the lazaretto. Sec. 1. The duration of rigorous quarantine

shall be reckoned from the date of the last case that occurred during the voyage, when the following circumstances are found:—

I. When the ship fulfils the conditions foreseen

by Sections 1, 2, and 3 of Article 45.

II. When the local Sanitary Authorities are satisfied of the truth of the statements made

Sec. 2. If, under the conditions laid down in the preceding paragraph, the time that elapsed between the date of the last case and the date of arrival is as great or greater than the maximum period of incubation of the pestilential disease concerned, the passengers shall have free pratique, and the ship shall also have free pratique if she carry no suspected goods.

But if the ship carry suspected goods even in such a manner that they cannot have been contaminated by the passengers or the crew, and if such goods have not been disinfected, or if the disinfection be held to have been insufficient, then the ship shall not have free pratique till the goods in question have been disinfected.

If the conditions stated in this Article are not fulfilled as regards the requirements to be demanded of the ship in order that the period of quarantine may be reckoned from the date of the last case that occurred during the voyage, rigorous quarantine shall be reckoned as pro-

vided under (b) of this Article.

Sec. 3. If the period that has elapsed since the date of the last case of the pestilential sickness is less than the maximum period of incubation, and if the ship fulfils the conditions indicated in Section 1, the passengers shall perform a complementary quarantine of such a number of days' duration as is required to complete the said maximum duration of the period of incubation.

The complementary period of quarantine shall be performed at the lazaretto unless there be no room there, in which case it may be performed

on board.

Sec. 4. If the ship is found on arrival to have persons on board suffering from a pestilential sickness, the sick shall be taken to the floating hospital, and the other passengers shall perform rigorous quarantine in the floating lazaretto. The duration of the quarantine shall be reckoned from the date of the entry of the passengers into the lazaretto.

Sec. 5. A ship which has had cases of pestilential sickness on board, although it have none on board at the date of arrival, is subject to the treatment indicated in the preceding paragraph if she do not fulfil the conditions laid down in Sec. 1 of this Article.

Sec. 6. A suspected ship which has come from an infected or from a suspected port to the port of arrival in a period less than the maximum period of the duration of the pestilential sickness which it is desired to keep out shall also be subject to the complementary quarantine indicated in Sec. 3.

Sec. 7. A suspected ship which has completed

the voyage in a period longer than the maximum period of incubation shall be subject to quarantine cf observation, during which the provisions of Art. 47 shall be carried out. If the ship have on board suspected goods which have not been contaminated by the passengers or crew, and have not been disinfected, it shall be subject to rigorous quarantine in order that disinfection may be carried out or completed, but this quarantine shall not commence till the passengers have left the ship; they shall have free pratique.

In a case of possible contamination, the provisions of Section 2 of this Article should be

followed.

ART. 52. When a ship which would have to perform quarantine has on board passengers and goods for different ports, the passengers and goods for any particular port shall alone be landed at the lazaretto of that port, the ship being at liberty to continue her voyage at once.

If there is no room at the lazaretto, the provisions of Article 50 shall be observed.

In such a case, the sanitary pass which the ship receives at the quarantine station shall state that the ship has not undergone sanitary inspec-

tion, &c. ("expurgo sanitario").

ART. 53. A ship with passengers and goods for Brazil which refuses to submit to the quarantine and other sanitary proceedings laid down by these regulations, and also a ship which on arrival gives false information to the Sanitary Authorities, or does not pay the fines inflicted on it, shall be repelled from the ports of the Republic as long as she carries the same master, against whom the penalty is for life.

As an exceptional measure, repulsion may be employed against a ship carrying great numbers of passengers badly infected, among whom many deaths have occurred during the voyage, as such a ship may communicate the disease to this

country.

ART. 54. If a case of pestilential sickness occurs on board a ship performing quarantine of observation, the ship shall be subject to rigorous

quarantine.

ART. 55. A declaration that a port is infected shall, for sanitary purposes, affect ships that left it during a certain period before the first case occurred. That period shall be 20 days for oriental plague and eight days for yellow fever

and cholera morbus.

ART. 56. Persons suffering from a pestilential sickness on board a ship undergoing sanitary treatment or in a lazaretto after disembarkation shall be transferred to a floating hospital persons suffering from contagious diseases, shall be transferred to an isolated building, and those suffering from ordinary complaints shall be taken to an infirmary attached to the lazaretto, where when they have recovered they shall perform the proper quarantine, unless it be found possible to transfer them to a land hospital, on the termination of the quarantine of the group to which they belonged.

ART. 57. In order that a port may be declared "clean," a number of days must have passed without a fresh case of pestilential sickness equal to the maximum period of incubation, as

laid down by these regulations.

Lazarettos.

ART. 58. There shall in Brazil be two kinds of lazarettos: fixed lazarettos established by preference on islands near the national territory; and floating lazarettos, established in times of epidemics in sufficient number to meet the requirements of the quarantine service.

Penalties.

ART. 79. The actions specified in the following

shall be punished with the fines there mentioned:—

Sec. 1. The master of a ship for not speaking the truth on giving information on arrival respecting occurrences on board—fine of 200\$000.

specting occurrences on board—fine of 200\$000.

2. For concealing persons ill on board with any sickness; sending them to hospitals on land without the previous permission of the Sanitary Authority; calling a doctor on board without the same permission—a fine of \$200; if the sickness was pestilential—a fine of 500\$ for each person sick.

3. For not performing within the specified time the operations of disinfection and sanitation ordered by the Sanitary Authority, and for not removing to another anchorage when ordered, a fine of \$100, and double the amount for a second offence.

4. For allowing any person not belonging to the sanitary service to board or leave a ship which has not received pratique, a fine of 200\$

for each offence.

5. In changing the anchorage for a ship not in pratique, without the previous permission of the

Sanitary Authority, a fine of 200\$.

6. For shipping or unshipping anything on to or from a ship not in pratique, without the previous permission of the Sanitary Authority, a fine of 200\$.

7. For not having a Bill of Health issued at the ports of origin and call as required by Article

27, a fine of 200\$.

8. The director of any hospital for receiving any sick person from on board any ship without having fulfilled the conditions laid down by Article 23, a fine of \$200.

9. Any medical practitioner infringing the pro-

visions of Article, 200\$.

10. A ship for infringing the provisions of any licence given by the Sanitary Authority, a fine of 200\$.

ART. 80. Any infraction of the present regulations for which no special penalty is provided, shall be punished by a fine of 20\$ to 50\$, and double the amount on a second offence.

ART. 86. Appeals against any act or decision must be lodged in due form within five days.

Sec. 4. Except as regards fines and other

Sec. 4. Except as regards fines and other penalties and cases specifically excepted, appeals have no suspending force.

ART. 93. National or foreign ships enjoying the privileges granted to mail ships ("paquets") or which may solicit such privileges, must make a declaration that they submit absolutely to the provisions of the present regulations as regards the articles referring to the requirements to be fulfilled by them in order to enjoy the privileges mentioned in the portions of the regulations referring to quarantine, and especially—

1. That they have fulfilled all the provisions of

Sec. 1 of Art. 45.

2. That they will on demand give a free passage out and home to the medical commissioner instructed to travel in the ship.

3. That they will provide and use everything ordered in writing by the medical commissioner in view of preserving the health of those on board.

OFFICIAL VOCABULARY FOR CODE TELEGRAMS.

THE International Telegraph Office at Berne will shortly issue an official vocabulary, or book of code words, to be used for telegrams in code,

or preconcerted language.
The vocabulary has been prepared in conformity with the decision of the International Telegraph Conference, held at Paris in 1890, and is intended to facilitate the transmission of International code

telegrams.

The employment of words taken from this vocabulary will become obligatory for European code telegrams after the expiration of three years from the date of its publication; and its general adoption for the extra-European, as well as the European, régime is desirable.

The vocabulary will contain about 200,000 words, arranged in alphabetical order, drawn from

the eight languages authorized for code telegrams by the International Telegraph Convention. numbering of the words, as at present proposed, will be as follows: - the thousands will appear in large figures at the head of the page, and the hundreds, tens, and units in smaller figures to the left of each word.

The price per copy will be about ten shillings. The books will be supplied in England through the General Post Office.

The International Telegraph Office being desirous of ascertaining the number of copies which are likely to be required, intending subscribers are requested to forward their applications before the end of January, to the Secretary, General Post Office, London, E.C.
