It is hereby notified, for the proper purposes, that, by order of the Government, and on the recommendation of the Consultative Board of Public Health, vessels coming from India, China, Japan, and Java will be admitted to free pratique at the port of Ponta Delgada (St. Michaels—Azores), for the sole purpose of receiving coal or supplies, provided they hold clean bills of health and are in a good sanitary condition, and when they shall have been admitted to free pratique at all the ports at which they may have called, and the length of the voyage shall have been more than forty days; and, even so, the hatchways must be kept entirely closed during the stay of the vessels in that port.

Circular from the Imperial Royal Maritime Government to all the Officers and Functionaries depending upon it :-

By an Order of the 31st December, 1893, of the Ministers of the Interior and of Finance, in concert with the Royal Hungarian Government, and in connection with the existing sanitary conditions of foreign countries, the probibition to import goods, or to transmit them, if they come from the French ports of the Gulf of Lyons, and from the Departments of Herault and Gard, and from Roumania, as laid down in the Decrees of the 21st of July, 1893, and of the 27th of September, 1893, and in the Government Circulars of the 25th of July and the 2nd of October, 1893, Nos. 7386 and 9800, is annulled.

On the other hand, the prohibitions of a similar kind against Russia now in force on the strength of the Decree of the 3rd of June, 1893, and contained in the Government Circular of the 8th of June, 1893, No. 5703, are extended to

European and Asiatic Turkey.

This Decree enters into force on the day upon which it comes to the knowledge of the respective Customs officers engaged in the preservation of maritime sanitation.

### OFFICIAL VOCABULARY FOR CODE TELEGRAMS.

THE International Telegraph Office at Berne will shortly issue an official vocabulary, or book of code words, to be used for telegrams in code,

or preconcerted language.

The vocabulary has been prepared in conformity with the decision of the International Telegraph Conference, held at Paris in 1890, and is intended to facilitate the transmission of International code telegrams.

The employment of words taken from this vocabulary will become obligatory for European code telegrams after the expiration of three years from the date of its publication; and its general adoption for the extra-European, as well as the

European, régime is desirable.

The vocabulary will contain about 200,000 words, arranged in alphabetical order, drawn from the eight languages authorized for code telegrams by the International Telegraph Convention. The numbering of the words, as at present proposed, will be as follows: —the thousands will appear in large figures at the head of the page, and the hundreds, tens, and units in smaller figures to the left of each word.

The price per copy will be about ten shillings.
The books will be supplied in England through

the General Post Office.
