COMPENSATION FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE OF FOREIGN PARCELS.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her

Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. Where an Agreement has been made between Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (hereinafter referred to as "the Postmaster-General") and the Postal Administration of any Foreign State respecting the exchange of Parcels with declaration of value (otherwise called "insured Parcels"), the provisions of this Warrant shall apply to Parcels transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and such territories of such Foreign State as are referred to in the Agreement (hereinafter referred to as a "Foreign Country").

2. Subject to the provisions of this Warrant, if any article of pecuniary value enclosed in, or forming part of, a Parcel transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and a Foreign Country, be lost or damaged while in the Post, the Postmaster-General may pay to any person or persons who may, in the opinion of the Postmaster-General, establish a reasonable claim to compensation (having regard to the nature of the article, the care with which it was packed, and other circumstances) such sum as he may think just.

Provided that:—

(a.) If in addition to the postage payable in respect of such Parcel a compensation fee of five pence is paid in respect of such Parcel, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed twelve pounds.

(b.) If in addition to the postage payable as aforesaid a compensation fee of seven pence halfpenny is paid in respect of such Parcel, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed twenty-four pounds.

(c.) If in addition to the postage payable as aforesaid a compensation fee of ten pence is paid in respect of such Parcel, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed thirty-six pounds.

(d.) If in addition to the postage payable as aforesaid a compensation fee of one shilling and one halfpenny is paid in respect of such Parcel, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed forty-eight pounds.

(e.) If in addition to the postage payable as aforesaid, a compensation fee of one shilling and three pence is paid in respect of such Parcel, the sum paid by way of compensation shall not exceed fifty pounds.

3. A Parcel in respect of which a compensation fee is paid shall be deemed to be and is hereinafter referred to as an "insured Parcel."

4. Any Parcel, other than an insured Parcel, containing coin or any article of jewellery, transmitted by Post between the United Kingdom and a Foreign Country shall be subject to the following provisions:—

(1.) Such Parcel shall be registered, and may be detained for that purpose at any Post Office.

(2.) Such Parcel shall be charged with a registration fee of eight pence in addition to all other postage payable thereon.

(3.) If such Parcel be posted in the United Kingdom it shall be returned to the sender.

(4.) No compensation shall be payable in respect of the loss or damage of such Parcel, or the contents thereof.

5. The Postmaster-General may give effect to the provisions of this Warrant, as to the loss or damage of articles enclosed in or forming part of Parcels, out of such aids or supplies as may be

from time to time provided and appropriated by Parliament for that purpose; but nothing contained in, or done under, or in pursuance of, this Warrant shall render him liable, either personally or in his official capacity, to any action or other legal proceeding in respect of, or in consequence of, any such loss or damage. And the decision of the Postmaster-General on all questions arising between him and any person claiming payment in respect of the loss or damage of any article enclosed in or forming part of a Parcel shall be final and conclusive.

6. In this Warrant—

The expression “coin” means coin of all kinds whether or not current in the United Kingdom or elsewhere.

The expression “jewellery” means—

(a.) Gold or silver in a manufactured or unmanufactured state.

(b.) Diamonds and precious stones.

(c.) Watches entirely or mainly composed of gold or silver, and

(d.) Any article of a like nature which, apart from workmanship, has an intrinsic or marketable value.

The expression “United Kingdom” includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

7. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

COMPENSATION FOR LOSS
OR DAMAGE OF COLONIAL PARCELS
TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Treasury Warrant dated the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and all Warrants extending or amending the same.

2. A Parcel transmitted by post under the provisions of the said Warrants is hereinafter referred to as an “insured Parcel.”

3. Any Parcel, other than an insured Parcel, containing coin or any article of jewellery transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and any place mentioned in the said Warrants shall be subject to the following provisions:—

(1.) Such Parcel shall be registered, and may be detained for that purpose at any Post Office.

(2.) Such Parcel shall be charged with a registration fee of eight pence in addition to all other postage payable thereon.

(3.) If such Parcel be posted in the United Kingdom, it shall be returned to the sender.

(4.) No compensation shall be payable in respect

of the loss or damage of such Parcel or the contents thereof.

4. In this Warrant—

The expression “Coin,” means coin of all kinds, whether or not current in the United Kingdom or elsewhere.

The expression “Jewellery” means,

(a.) Gold or silver in a manufactured or unmanufactured state.

(b.) Diamonds and precious stones.

(c.) Watches entirely or mainly composed of gold or silver, and

(d.) Any article of a like nature, which, apart from workmanship, has an intrinsic or marketable value.

The expression “United Kingdom” includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

PINNER FAIR.

1. By Memorial, dated the 10th day of January, 1894, a representation has been duly made to me by the Justices of the Petty Sessional Division of Gore, in the county of Middlesex, that a Fair has been annually held on Whitsun Wednesday, in the hamlet of Pinner, in the parish of Harrow, in the said Division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished:

2. On the 17th day of February, 1894, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fair.

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Foreign Animals Order of 1893, dated the twenty-seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, the cargo of cattle and sheep expected shortly to arrive at the port of London from Buenos Ayres in the vessel Burton may be transhipped in the River Thames from such vessel to the vessel Ragoon (in this Order called the landing-vessel) for conveyance to the Foreign Animals Wharf, known as the Foreign Cattle Market at Deptford.

2. Those cattle and sheep shall be transhipped in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs, and an Officer

of Customs shall remain in charge of the animals on board the landing-vessel until its arrival at the Foreign Animals Wharf.

3. The landing-vessel shall proceed direct to that Wharf, and the cattle and sheep shall be landed there in the presence and under the supervision and control of an Officer of Customs.

4.—(1.) The landing-vessel shall immediately after the landing of such cattle and sheep, and before being again used, be cleansed and disinfected as follows:

(i.) All parts of the landing-vessel with which the cattle or sheep or their droppings have come in contact shall be scraped and swept: then

(ii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water: then

(iii.) The same parts of the landing-vessel shall have applied to them a coating of lime-wash: except that

(iv.) The application of lime-wash shall not be compulsory as regards such parts of the landing-vessel as are used for the crew.

(2.) The scrapings and sweepings of the landing-vessel shall not be landed unless and until they have been well mixed with quicklime.

5. The cattle and sheep so transhipped shall continue to be deemed foreign animals.

6. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order, the owner or consignee of the animals, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the landing-vessel, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

7. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in the Foreign Animals Order of 1893.
