#### No. 18.—CHANNEL AND WESTERN STATION.

ENGLAND-WEST COAST.-FIRTH OF SOLWAY. Alterations in Buoyage.

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice, dated 27th December, 1893, that a buoy has been placed southward of Workington Bank, westward

of English Channel:

Sunken Rock Westward of Cape Patience. Alterations in Rathlin O'Birne and St. John's Point Lights, and Intended Alteration in Rath'in Island Light.

THE Commissioners of Irish Lights have given further notice, dated 2nd January, 1891, that the following alterations have been made in the lights shown from Rathlin O'Birne, northern side of entrance to Donegal Bay; and St. John's Point, eastern side of Dundrum Bay :

1. With reference to Notice to Mariners, No.

Rathlin O'Birne Light is a flasling light every fifteen seconds, showing white seaward between the bearings of S. 39° W. and N. 28° W., and red towards the mainland and south-eastward of the island.
