Gentlemen who propose to present others mus send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee. in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majerty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-haw.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain[°]at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

ORDER of the Local Government Board : District Auditor: Assignment of District and Duties (County Councils) : Supplemental :-

North-Eastern Counties Audit District. Counties of Norfolk, the Parts of Lindsey, and

the Parts of Holland.

Eastern Sea Fisheries District.

- To John Frederick Adams, District Auditor ;-To the Local Fisheries Committee for the
 - Eastern Sea Fisherics District ;-
- To the County Councils of the Counties of Norfolk, the Parts of Lindsey, and the Parts of Holland :-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 37th day of September, 1892, We, the Local Government Board, certified the appointment of the said John Frederick Adams as a District Auditor, and directed that, unless We should otherwise prescribe, it should be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the County Councils of the Counties named in paragraph (1) of Article I of the said Order, including the said Counties of the Parts of Holland and the Parts of Lindsey, and the other Accounts referred to in that Article so far as the same might relate to a period prior to the 1st day of April, 1894, as well as the Accounts referred to in Article II of the Order ; and We further directed that the District in which the said John Frederick Adams should act as Auditor, and which District was thereby assigned to him, should be termed "The North-Eastern Counties Audit District," and should, for the performance of the duties assigned to him by Article I of the Order, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Administrative Counties named in Schedule A to the Order; and, for the performance of the duties assigned to him by Article II of the Order, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in Schedule B to the Order, and the Districts mentioned in paragraphs (3) and (4) of the said Article II, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in paragraph (6) of the said Article II ;

And whereas the Accounts referred to in paragraph (4) of Article I of the said Order, the duty of auditing which was assigned to the District Auditor as aforesaid, included the Accounts of such of the Joint Committees including representatives of the County Council of one or more of the said Counties named in the Order and representatives of the County Council or Councils of some other County or Counties, as We might by Order under Seal thereafter prescribe;

- And whereas by an Order made by the Board of Trade on the 7th day of November 1893, under the Sca Fisheries Regulation Act, 1888, the Eastern Sca Fisheries District has been created and a Local Fisheries Committee has been constituted for the regulation of the soa fisheries carried on within the District; and the Committee so constituted are a Joint Committee including representatives of the said Counties of the Parts

of Holland and the Parts of Lindsey, within the said North-Eastern Counties Audit District, and of the County of Norfolk, which is not within that Audit District;
