LÉOPOLD II, Roi des Belges,

A tous présents et à venir, Salut.

Revu les articles 12 et 13 de l'arrêté royal du 17 août 1831, sur la police sanitaire, articles stipulant comme suit :

ART. 12. Tout navire arrivant d'un port quelconque et quelle que soit sa destination, sera porteur d'une patente de santé, laquelle fera connaître l'état sanitaire des lieux d'où il vient et son propre état sanitaire au moment où il en est parti.

ART. 13. Tout navire belge ou étranger qui n'a point de patente de santé, est sujet, outre les mesures auxquelles son état sanitaire le soumet à un surcroît de quarantaine réglé selon les circonstances, et qui ne peut être moindre de cinq jours.

Considérant qu'il n'est pas nécessaire d'exiger une patente de santé des navires venant directement de pays ou de circonscriptions territoriales non contaminés et que les formalités relatives à la production de ce document occasionnent des retards préjudiciables au commerce,

Vu l'avis de la commission sanitaire de l'Escaut ;

Sur la proposition de Notre Ministre de l'agriculture, de l'industrie et des travaux publics,

Nous avons arrêté et arrêtons :

ART. 1. Un deuxième paragraphe, ainsi conçu, est ajouté à chacun des articles susvisés :
