PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others mus send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the

necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained

at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

(Translation.)
Republic of Colombia,
Department of Government.

Bogota, December 1, 1893.

This office having received frequent complaints that the steamers which arrive at our ports on the Atlantic do not comply with the formality of presenting their respective bills of heath certified, by the Colombian Consul at the port from whence they come.

Be it resolved:

That the duty of the Local Authorities of the ports of the Republic is hereby fixed, to demand from all ships that may arrive in our ports bills of health, duly certified by the Colombian Consuls, if there were any at the port whence they sailed, as an indispensable requisite to be freely admitted to pratique.

To carry into effect this resolution, the said Authorities will grant sufficient time and notify by every means possible the Steamship Companies

and any other interested parties.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The sale or exposure for sale of any cattle sheep or swine on or at the Wong at Horncastle in the Parts of Lindsey, Lincolnshire, is hereby prohibited.

2. If a head of cattle or a sheep or a pig is sold or exposed for sale on or at the Wong at Horncastle in contravention of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier thereof, and the owner or consignee of each head of cattle and of each sheep or pig so sold or exposed, and the person so selling or exposing the same, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting a sale of cattle sheep or swine at the Wong aforesaid, and the purchaser thereat of any cattle sheep or swine so sold or exposed in contravention of this Order, such purchaser knowing the animal to be sold or exposed for sale in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board: Altering General Consolidated Order. Out-door Labour Test:—

Hexham Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Hexham Union, in the county of Northumberland: - To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes, and to the Overseers of the Poor of the several Townships, comprised in the said Union :-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WE, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order, with respect to the relief of the Poor in the said Hexham Union, as

ARTICLE 1.—Subject to the provisions of the General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners dated the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in force in the Union, every able-bodied male pauper who receives relief within the Union, and is relieved out of the Workhouse, shall be relieved in the following manner; that is to say:-

Half at least of the relief given to such pauper shall be given in food, clothing, and other articles

of necessity.

No such pauper shall receive relief from the Guardians, or any of their officers, or any Overseer of any Parish in the Union, while he is employed for wages or other hire or remuneration by any person; but every such pauper so relieved

shall be set to work by the Guardians.

ARTICLE 2. - The Guardians shall, within fourteen days after the day when this Order comes into force, and from time to time afterwards as the Local Government Board may require, report to the Local Government Board the place or places at which able-bodied male paupers shall be so set to work in the Union, the sort or sorts of work in which they or any of them shall be employed, the times and mode of work, and all such other matters relating to the employment of such able-bodied paupers as the said Guardians shall deem material to be communicated to the Local Government Board, or as the Local Government Board shall require.

ARTICLE 3 .- If the Guardians shall depart, in any particular instance, from any of the regulations herein-before contained, and shall, within fifteen days after such departure, report the same and the grounds thereof to the Local Government Board, and if the Local Government Board shall approve of such departure, then the relief granted in such particular instance shall, if otherwise lawful, not be deemed to be unlawful, or be

subject to be disallowed.

And whereas provision is made in a General Order of the Poor Law Commissioners, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, in force in the said

Union, for the appointment of an officer, to be

termed a Superintendent of Out-door Labour, and for the continuance in office of such officer, and it is expedient that further provision should be made as hereinafter mentioned;

We therefore further Order, that if at any time the number of able-bodied male paupers requiring relief shall be so small as to render the services of a Superintendent of Out-door Labour unnecessary, the Guardians may dispense with the services of such an Officer.
