REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING Rooms.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only 'at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or

Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presenta-tion cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained

at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200

at each Drawing Room.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

#### UNIVERSITY OF WALES.

REGULATIONS for Appointment of Representatives on the University Court by Head Teachers of Public Intermediate and Elementary Schools.

HEREAS by Royal Charter dated the thirtieth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, constituting the University of Wales, it is provided that the University Court shall comprise (amongst other persons)-

Three persons appointed by the Head Teachers of Public Intermediate Schools in Wales and the county of Monmouth (which county is in the said Charter, and hereafter in these presents included in the term "Wales"), all of which said three persons so appointed shall be Head Teachers of, and one at least of whom shall be a Head Mistress of, one of such Public Intermediate Schools, and

Three persons appointed by the Head Teachers of the Public Elementary Schools in Wales, all of which said three persons so appointed shall be Head Teachers of, and one at least of whom shall be a Head Mistress of, one of such Public Elementary Schools;

And it is further provided that the mode and manner in which the appointment of Members of the Court by the Head Teachers of Public Schools in Wales shall be made, shall be as from time to time determined by the Lord President of the Privy Council by writing under his hand:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of the said Charter, I do hereby determine and order as follows:-

1. For the purpose of the appointment of Members of the Court by the Head Teachers of Public Intermediate Schools and of Public Elementary Schools, respectively, there shall be from time to time an election, at which every Head Teacher of an Intermediate or of an Elementary School (as the case may be) shall be entitled to vote for each of any number of such Head Teachers, not exceeding the number to be appointed.

2. The returning officer, at some time not less than one month nor more than six weeks before

appointed in pursuance of any such election to be members of the Court, and as soon as conveniently may be after the occurrence of any casual vacancy arising from the death or resignation of any such person, shall cause a notice to be published stating that an election is about to be held, and specifying the day on or before which, and the place at which, voting papers must be returned by persons voting at the election. The notice shall be published in two or more newspapers circulating in Wales, and shall be in the form marked A in the Appendix to these regulations or to the like effect:

Provided that, in the case of a casual vacancy through death or resignation occurring within six months before the expiration of the term of office of the persons appointed in pursuance of any such election to be members of the Court, an election shall not be held to fill such vacancy except on a requisition in writing addressed to the returning officer and signed in the case of the Intermediate Schools by not less than ten, and in the case of the Elementary Schools by not less than fifty, of the teachers entitled to vote at the election.

For the purpose of the first election, the notice as above-mentioned shall be published on or before the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred

and ninety-four.

3. It shall be the duty of the returning officer, at least seven days before the day on or before which it is declared in the notice that voting papers must be returned, to cause a voting paper to be forwarded by post or otherwise to each person entitled to vote at the election, but the election shall not be rendered void by reason of the omission of the returning officer to cause a voting paper to be forwarded in any particular case or cases, and any person entitled to vote who has not received a voting paper may, on application to the returning officer, obtain from him a voting paper.

4. Each voter shall write on the voting paper delivered to him the name or names of the person or persons for whom he votes (not exceeding the number to be appointed), and shall sign the voting paper and append to his signature and to the name of each person for whom he votes the name of the school, and the department thereof, of which such voter or person is Head Teacher; and the voting paper shall be returned by post or otherwise to the appointed place on or before the appointed day. Votes shall not be given except upon the voting papers provided by the returning officer, which shall be in the form marked B in the appendix to these regulations, or to the like effect. Every voting paper in respect of which any requirement of these regulations has not been complied with or which is not received at the appointed place on or before the appointed day, shall be invalid.

5. The returning officer, immediately after the day on or before which voting papers are required to be returned, shall cause the validity of the votes to be ascertained in such manner as he may think necessary, and shall cause such of the votes as are found to be valid, and to have been duly returned, to be counted, and the number of such votes given for each person to be ascertained. The decision of the returning officer on any question touching the validity of a voting paper or vote shall be final.

6. The person or persons to the number to be elected, who, being duly qualified, has or have received the greatest number of votes, shall be deemed to be appointed by the Head Teachers of Public Intermediate or Elementary Schools (as the expiration of the term of office of the persons the case may be) to be a member or members of the Court, and shall be so certified in writing to the Court by the returning officer; but for the purposes of this paragraph a person whose appointment would cause a contravention of the requirement, that one at least of the persons representing the Head Teachers of such schools shall be a Head Mistress of one of them, shall be deemed not to be duly qualified.

7. If by reason of an equal number of votes being given to two or more persons the question arises which of them is to be certified as a member of the Court, the returning officer shall settle the question by lot, and the person certified by him shall be deemed to be duly appointed by the Head Teachers entitled to vote at the election.

8. The returning officer shall forthwith give to all persons so appointed notice of their appointment, which in the case of appointments to fill the places of persons retiring on the expiration of their term of office shall be deemed to date from that expiration.

The first appointment shall be deemed to date from the day on which the first meeting of the Court is held.

9. The returning officer at the first election shall be the Clerk of the Privy Council, and at subsequent elections shall be the Chancellor of the University or any person appointed by the Court in lieu of the Chancellor.
