THE following Letter from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and a copy of a Note from the Swiss Chargé d'Affaires in London, relative to the length of the period during which Licences issued by the British Authorities to Commercial Travellers are valid, have been forwarded to the Secretary of State, and are hereby published, in order that the view of the Swiss Government as to the duration of Licences may be made known to the Public:-

Foreign Office, March 2, 1894. I AM directed by the Earl of Rosebery to transmit to you herewith, to be laid before the Secretary of State for the Home Department, copy of a Note from the Swiss Chargé d'Affaires in London, relative to the length of the period during which Licences issued by the British Authorities to Commercial Travellers are valid, and I am to request you to move Mr. Secretary Asquith to cause due publicity to be given to this information, and to cause the various authorities competent to issue these certificates to be advised to comply with the suggestions offered in Monsieur Bourcart's note.

Monsieur le Comte,

PAR dépéche du 12 Février 1892, votre Seigneurie a bien voulu me faire connaître les autorités désignées pour délivrer aux voyageurs de commerce représentant en Suisse des maisons anglaises les certificats au moyens desquels ils peuvent obtenir la patente Suisse

Le Chambre de Commerce de Londres, qui se trouve parmi les autorités en question, vient de nous demander quelle était, dans l'esprit des autorités Suisses, la durée de validité des certi-

ficats fournis par elle.

J'ai aussitôt requis l'avis de mon Gouvernement et l'ai fait connaître à la Chambre de Commerce de Londres. Je crois bien faire en informant également votre Seigneurie, afin qu'elle soit en mesure de donner sur ce point aux autres, autorités délivrant les certificats, sus mentionnés les instructions qu'elle estimera

Mon Gouvernement admet qu'il ne lui appartient pas de statuer sur la durée de validité des certificats. Il pense que c'est aux autorités qui établissent ces documents à determiner cette durée tout comme c'est à elles aussi à décider si la maison de commerce représentée est autorisée à pratiquer dans le pays ou elle est etablie.

Néanmoins mon Gouvernement estime qu'il serait désirable que la durée de validité des certificats fût limitée à l'année ou au semestre au cours desquels, ils sont delivrés ; la validité des patentes données sur le vu des certificats est en effet limitée à cette période. D'autre part, les certificats délivrés par d'autre pays, tels que l'Allemagne, l'Autriche-Hongrie et l'Italie portent la mention expresse qu'ils ne sont valables que pour l'année courante.

(Amendment of Existing Statutes as to Metropolitan Consolidated Stock and Capital Expenditure of the Council; Annual Capital Expenditure, 1894-5; Subjects and Items of Expenditure under existing Acts, and future Acts of Parliament).

THE London County Council (in this notice called "the Council") intend to apply to Parliament in the present Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the purposes following,

namely:-

1. To define the amounts which the Council may expend for the various purposes for which capital expenditure is necessary during the financial year commencing April 1st, 1894, and (on account of the next financial year) during the following six

These purposes include (among others) Providing stations, buildings, plant for new stations, hydrants, and a new pier at Pimlico for the purposes of "The Fire Brigade Act, 1865."

Purchase, acquisition, laying-out, planting, and improvement of parks, gardens and open spaces. Fencing, drainage, buildings, erections, appliances and conveniences of various kinds, in parks and open spaces. Formation and improvement of lakes, ponds, and fountains. Contributions towards purchase, acquisition, laying-out and improvement of open spaces, gardens and recreationgrounds.

The tunnel approaches and works authorized by "The Thames Tunnel (Blackwall) Acts, 1887 and 1888," including provision for re-

housing persons displaced.

Schemes and contributions to schemes and other capital expenditure under "The Housing of the Working Classes Act, 1890."

Providing buildings for inquests under "The Public Health (London) Act, 1891."

Providing site and building for the destruction of carcases under the "Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts," and the Glanders or Farcy Order of 1892.

Paving streets as required by "The London Streets (Removal of Gates) Act, 1893," or

other expenses under that Act.

Expenses incidental to the completion of new streets, street improvements and other works and purchases of lands already authorized by various Acts.

Purposes mentioned in Section 144 of "The Metropolis Management Act, 1855," and Section 72 of "The Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862."

Purchase of property, formation of approach and other works, and ferry-boats in connection with Woolwich Ferry.

Buildings, fittings, furniture, ventilation, heating, lighting, farm-buildings and stock, planting, road-making, fencing, and miscellaneous expenditure on improvement and development of lands held with the various asylums.

Additions to and other expenditure properly chargeable to capital in respect of industrial

schools.

Stations and sites for the verification and stamping of weights and measures and the provision of standards and appliances

Acquiring a site for and providing a Council Chamber and Offices for the Council.

Providing sites, buildings, and plant for storeyards, workshops, and factories, including the construction of river walls.

Widenings, alterations, and improvements of

minor county bridges.

Improving spans and headways of railway bridges over or under streets

Purchase of plant for electric-lighting testing. Purchase of tramways under the Acts relating to tramways, and incidental expenses

- Generally all other subjects in respect of which capital expenditure is or may be necessary during the current financial year, commencing April 1st, 1894, and (on account of the next financial year) during the following

To enable the Council from time to time to raise money by the creation and issue of Consolidated Stock, or by borrowing to such amount as may be necessary for the purposes defined in the intended Act, and to make provisions as to the redemption of such stock or repayment of loans, and the payment of interest or dividend thereon out of the Consolidated Loans Fund, or otherwise, and to include in their estimates and precepts, for the purpose of the County Rate, such sums as may be requisite for those purposes.

3. To make provisions as to any loans to oe made by the Council to the Vestries and District Boards, School Board, Boards of Guardians, Local Boards, and other Local and Public Authorities, and as to the period within which such loans shall be repaid; and as to the creation, issue, and redemption of consolidated stock issued to raise money for the purpose of any such loan.

4. To define and regulate the period within which money raised by the creation of stock

is to be redeemed, and within which provision is to be made for the replacement in the Consolidated Loans Fund of moneys employed for various purposes of capital expenditure, and to extend or alter any periods now prescribed by Statute for those purposes.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons in accordance with the provisions of the Standing Orders on or before the 14th day of

April.
