WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for
England, in consideration of a benefaction of
three hundred pounds sterling, which has been
paid to us in favour of the benefice of Ashbourne
with Mapleton, in the county of Derby, and in
the diocese of Southwell, and in respect of which
we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the
same benefice, and to his successors, a yearly
sum of nine pounds, do hereby, in pursuance of
the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years
of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven,
section five, grant out of our common fund to the
said benefice of Ashbourne with Mapleton, to
meet such benefaction, one other capital sum
of three hundred pounds, in respect of which, so
long as the same capital sum, or any part
thereof, shall remain in our hands, there shall
be paid by us to the Incumbent for the time
being of the said benefice of Ashbourne with
Mapleton, one other yearly sum of nine pounds,
or such part thereof as shall be proportionate to
any balance of the same capital sum which shall
so remain in our hands; such lastly-mentioned
yearly payment to commence as from the date
of the publication of these presents in the
London Gazette, and to be receivable in equal
half-yearly portions on the first day of May
and the first day of November in each and
every year.

In witness whereof, we have hereunto set
our common seal, this fifth day of
April, in the year one thousand eight
hundred and ninety-four.
