REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOMS.

By Her Majesty's Command,
The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Rooms are requested to bring with them to the Drawing Room two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

The privilege of making presentations to The Queen at a Drawing Room is restricted to those Ladies who have themselves been previously presented to Her Majesty, and who are themselves present at the Drawing Room.

Under such circumstances a Lady has the privilege of presenting one Lady only at a Drawing Room in addition to her Daughters or Daughters-in-law.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her Majesty.

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presentation cards will be forwarded.

Printed Forms for this purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Lady to be presented be very distinctly written on the presentation cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Drawing Room, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

The number of Presentations is limited to 200

at each Drawing Room.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at a Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

TT HEREAS a Convention has been concluded on the twenty-fourth day of April one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, and Apostolic King of Hungary, with respect to the protection to be given by way of copyright to the authors of literary and artistic works:

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged on the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfour, between Her Majesty the Queen and His Majesty the Emperor:

And whereas Her Majesty in Council is satisfied that the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy have made such provisions as it appears to Her Majesty expedient to require for the protection of authors of works first produced in Her Majesty's dominions;

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, doth order and it is hereby ordered as follows:-

1. The Convention as set forth in the First

Schedule to this Order shall as from the commencement of this Order and subject to clause five of this Order have full effect throughout Her Majesty's dominions, and all persons are enjoined to observe the same.

2. The author of a literary or artistic work which on or after the commencement of this Order is first produced in the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy shall, subject as in this Order and in the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, mentioned, have as respects that work throughout Her Majesty's dominions but subject to the exceptions specified in clause five of this Order the same right of copyright, including any right capable of being conferred by an Order in Council under section two or section five of "The International Copyright Act, 1844," or under any other enactment, as if the work had been first produced in the United Kingdom, and shall have such right during the same period.

Provided that the author of a literary or artistic work shall not have any greater right or longer term of copyright therein than that which he enjoys in the country in which the work is

first produced.

The author of any literary or artistic work first produced before the commencement of this Order shall have the rights and remedies to which he is entitled under section six of "The International Copyright Act, 1886."

3. Section six of "The International Copyright Act, 1852," shall not apply to any dramatic piece to which protection is extended by virtue of

this Order.

4. This Order shall be construed as if it formed part of "The International Copyright Act, 1886."

5. This Order shall apply to all the Colonies and Foreign Possessions of Her Majesty excepting to those hereinafter named that is to say except to

Provided nevertheless that the provisions of this Order may be applied by further Order to any of the above-named Colonies or Foreign Possessions on whose behalf notice to the effect indicated in Article nine of the Convention shall be given.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four which day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

And the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.

Convention between Great Britain and Austria-Hungary for the Establishment of International Copyright.

Signed at Vienna, April 24, 1893.
[Ratifications exchanged at Vienna, April 14, 1894.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United King- into English shall no longer within dom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of dominions exclusively belong to the author.

India, &c., and His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, &c., and Apostolic King of Hungary, animated with the desire to secure in the most complete manner, within their respective dominions, the rights of authors, or their legal representatives, over their literary or artistic works, have resolved to conclude a Convention to that effect, and have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, &c., the Right Honourable Sir Augustus Berkeley Paget, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Her Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to His Imperial and Royal

Apostolic Majesty, &c., &c., &c.;

His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, King of Bohemia, &c., and Apostolic King of Hungary, the Count Gustave Kalnoky de Köröspatak, Knight of the Golden Fleece, Knight Grand Cross of the Order of St. Stephen, Knight of the Order of Leopold, His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty's Privy Councillor and Chamberlain, Minister of the Imperial House and of Foreign Affairs, General of Cavalry, &c., &c., &c.

Who, having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

Authors of literary or artistic works and their legal representatives, including publishers, shall enjoy reciprocally, in the dominions of the High Contracting Parties, the advantages which are, or may be, granted by law there for the protection of works of literature or art.

Consequently, authors of literary or artistic works which have been first published in the dominions of one of the High Contracting Parties, as well as their legal representatives, shall have in the dominions of the other High Contracting Party the same protection and the same legal remedy against all infringement of their rights as if the work had been first published in the country where the infringement may have taken place.

In the same manner, the authors of literary or artistic works, and their legal representatives, who are subjects of one of the High Contracting Parties, or who reside within its dominions, shall in the dominions of the other Contracting Party enjoy the same protection and the same legal remedies against all infringements of their rights as though they were subjects of or residents in the State in which the infringement may have taken place.

These advantages shall only be reciprocally guaranteed to authors and their legal representatives when the work in question is also protected by the laws of the State where the work was first published, and the duration of protection in the other country shall not exceed that which is granted to authors and their legal representatives in the country where the work was first published.

ARTICLE IL

The right of translation forming part of the copyright, the protection of the right of translation is assured under the conditions laid down by this convention. If ten years after the expiry of the year in which a work to be protected in Her Majesty's dominions on the basis of this Convention has appeared, no translation in English has been published, the right of translating the work into English shall no longer within those dominions exclusively belong to the author.

In the case of a book published in numbers, the aforesaid period of ten years shall commence at the end of the year in which each number is published.

ARTICLE III.

Authorized translations are protected as original works. They consequently enjoy the full protection granted by this Convention against the unauthorized reproduction of original works.

It is understood that in the case of a work for which the translating right has fallen into the public domain, the translator cannot oppose the translation of the same work by other writers.

ARTICLE IV.

The expression "literary or artistic works" comprehends books, pamphlets, and all other writings; dramatic or dramatico-musical works, musical compositions, with or without words; works of design, painting, sculpture, and engraving, lithographs, illustrations, geographical charts, plans, sketches, and plastic works relating to geography, topography, architecture, or science in general; in fact, every production whatsoever in the literary, scientific, or artistic domain which can be published by any mode of impression or reproduction.

ARTICLE V.

In the British Empire, and in the Kingdoms and States represented in the Austrian Reichsrath, the enjoyment of the rights secured by the present Convention is subject only to the accomplishment of the conditions and formalities prescribed by the law of that State in which the work is first published; and no further formalities or conditions shall be required in the other country.

Consequently, it shall not be necessary that a work which has obtained legal protection in one country should be registered, or copies thereof deposited in the other country, in order that the remedies against infringement may be obtained which are granted in the other country to works

first published there.

In the dominions of the Hungarian Crown the enjoyment of these rights is subject, however, to the accomplishment of the conditions and formalities prescribed by the Laws and Regulations both of Great Britain and of Hungary.

ARTICLE VI.

In order that the authors of works protected by the present Convention shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be considered as such, and be, consequently, admitted to institute proceedings in respect of the infringement of copyright before the Courts of the other State, it will suffice that their name be indicated on the work in the accustomed manner.

The Tribunals may, however, in cases of doubt, require the production of such further evidence as may be required by the Laws of the respective countries.

For anonymous or pseudonymous works, the publisher whose name is indicated on the work is entitled to protect the rights belonging to the author. He is, without other proof, reputed the legal representative of the anonymous or pseudonymous author, until the latter or his legal representative has declared and proved his rights.

ARTICLE VII.

The provisions of the present Convention cannot in any way derogate from the right of each of the High Contracting Parties to control, or to prohibit by measures of domestic legislation or police, the circulation, representation, exhibition, or sale of any work or production.

Each of the High Contracting Parties reserves also its right to prohibit the importation into its

own territory of works which, according to its internal Laws, or to the stipulations of Treaties with other States, are or may be declared to be illicit reproductions.

ARTICLE VIII.

The provisions of the present Convention shall be applied to literature or artistic works produced prior to the date of its coming into effect; subject, however, to the limitations prescribed by the following regulations:—

(a.) In the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy— Copies completed before the coming into force of the present Convention, the production of which has been hitherto allowed, can also be circulated in future.

In the same manner, appliances for the reproduction of works, such as stereotypes, wood blocks, and engraved plates of every description, such as lither aphers' stones, if their production has not hitherto been prohibited may continue to be used during a period of four years from the coming into force of the present Convention.

The distribution of such copies, and the use of the said appliances, is, however, only permitted if an inventory of the said copies and appliances is taken by the Government in question, in consequence of an application of the interested party, within three months from the coming into force of the present Convention, and if these copies and appliances are marked with a special stamp.

Dramatic and dramatico-musical works, or musical compositions legally performed before the coming into force of the present Convention, can

also be performed in the future.

(b.) In the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland—

The author and publisher of any literary or artistic work first produced before the date at which this Convention comes into effect shall be entitled to all legal remedies against infringement; provided that where any person has, before the date of the publication of the Order in Council putting this Convention into effect, lawfully produced any work in the United Kingdom, any rights or interests arising from or in connection with such production, which are subsisting and valuable at the said date, shall not be diminished or prejudiced.

ARTICLE IX.

The provisions of the present Convention shall apply to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to—

India.

Provided always that the provisions of the present Conventions shall apply to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative at the Court of His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty within two years from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the present Convention.

ARTICLE X.

The present Convention shall remain in force

for ten years from the day on which the ratifications are exchanged; and in case neither of the two High Contracting Parties shall have given notice twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years of their intention of terminating the present Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given such notice.
Her Britannic Majesty's Government shall

also have the right to denounce the Convention in the same manner, on behalf of any of the Colonies or foreign possessions mentioned in

Article IX, separately.

ARTICLE XI.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Vienna as soon as possible. It shall come into effect ten days after its publication in conformity with the forms prescribed by the Laws of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

In witness whereof, the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed this Convention, and have

hereunto affixed their seals.

Done at Vienna, the twenty-fourth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

WHEREAS by "The Behring Sea Award Act, 1894," it is enacted that Her-Majesty the Queen in Council may make Orders for carrying into effect the provisions of the Behring Sea Arbitration Award set out in the first Schedule to that Act, and therein referred to

as the Scheduled provisions:

And whereas by the said Act, it is also enacted that an Order in Council made under that Act may provide that such officers of the United States of America as are specified in the Order may, in respect of offences under that Act, exercise the like powers under that Act as may be exercised by a commissioned officer of Her Majesty in relation to a British ship, and the equipment and certificate thereof, or such of those powers as appear to Her Majesty in Council to be exercisable under the law of the United States of America against ships of the United States, and that such British officers as are specified in the Order may exercise the powers conferred by that Act, with any necessary modifications specified in the Order, in relation to a ship of the United States of America, and the equipment and certificate thereof:

And whereas the powers which Article 1 of this Order confers upon the officers of the United States therein specified are powers which, in respect of offences under the said Act, may be exercised by a commissioned officer of Her Majesty in relation to a British ship and the equipment and certificate thereof, and appear to Her Majesty in Council to be exercisable under the law of the United States against ships of the

United States:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Act, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :-

1. The Commanding Officer of any vessel belonging to the Naval or Revenue Service of the United States of America, and appointed for the time being by the President of the United States for the purpose of carrying into effect the powers conferred by this Article, the name of which vessel shall have been communicated by the President of the United States to Her Majesty as being a vessel so appointed as aforesaid, may, if duly commissioned and instructed by the President in that behalf, seize and detain any British vessel which has become liable to be forfeited to Her Majesty under the provisions of the recited Act, and may bring her for adjudication before any such British Court of Admiralty as is referred to in Section one hundred and three of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854" (which section is set out in the second Schedule to the recited Act), or may deliver her to any such British officer as is mentioned in the said section for the purpose of being dealt with pursuant to the recited Act.

2. The Commanding Officer of any vessel belonging to the Naval or Revenue Service of Her Majesty, and appointed for the time being by Her Majesty for the purpose of carrying into effect the powers conferred by this Article, the name of which vessel shall have been communicated by Her Majesty to the President of the United States as being a vessel so appointed as aforesaid, may, if duly commissioned and instructed by Her Majesty in that behalf, exercise the powers conferred by the recited Act in relation to a ship of the United States: Provided that such officer, after seizing and detaining a ship of the United States in exercise of the said powers, shall take her for adjudication before a Court of the United States having jurisdiction to adjudicate in the matter, or deliver her to any naval or revenue officer or other authorities of the United States.

3. Until arrangements for giving further effect to Articles four and seven of the said Scheduled provisions shall have been made between Her Majesty and the Government of the United States, the following provisions should have effect :-

(a.) A Secretary of State, or any person duly authorized by him for the purpose, may grant a special licence in such form and manner as he may think fit to any British sailing-vessel, authorizing such vessel for the present year to fish for fur-seals during the period of time in the manner and in the waters in which fur-seal fishing is allowed by the recited Act, and until the delivery of such special licence, any British sailing-vessel which before the date of this Order has left port, and is or is intended to be employed in the said fishing, shall be deemed to have been duly authorized, and duly provided with a special licence, within the meaning of the said Article four; and all persons on board any such vessel, which is or is deemed to have been provided with a special licence, shall be deemed to have been duly authorized to engage in fur-seal fishing within the meaning of the said Article seven.

(b.) A Secretary of State may, by notice published in the London Gazette, prescribe the flag to be used by such British vessels as are, or shall be, authorized to fish for fur-seals under the provisions of this Order, and may cause one such flag to be delivered to each authorized vessel

which has left port before receiving a special licence; and every vessel which before leaving port has received a special licence, and every authorized vessel to which such flag shall have been delivered, shall carry such flag during the period of time and in the waters in which fur-seal fishing is allowed by the recited Act, and shall hoist it at such times and in such manner as may be prescribed by such notice.

(c.) A Secretary of State may give such further provisional directions as he may deem necessary for the due observance of the provisions of the recited Act and this Order, and any such directions, on being published in such manner as he may direct, shall be observed as if they were

contained in this Order.

4. This Order may be cited as "The Behring

Sea Award Order in Council, 1894."

And the Right Honourable the Earl of Kimberley, K.G., the Most Honourable the Marquis of Ripon, K.G., two of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. C. L. Peel.

THE following Statute, made on the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, by the Governing Body of the College of Saint John the Evangelist, in the University of Cambridge, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:-

A STATUTE to amend under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 a Statute framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Act 19 and 20 Vict. c. 88 in relation to the College of Saint John the Evangelist in the University of Cambridge such amending Statute being duly made at a general meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the ninth day of March one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfour and passed at such meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted for the approval of Her Majesty the Queen in Council.

Whereas the Cambridge University Commissioners appointed under the Act 19 and 20 Vict. c. 88 on the twenty-ninth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine made the following Statute which was confirmed by Her Majesty the Queen in Council on the twenty-second day of February one thousand eight hundred and sixty:

STATUTE respecting Scholars from Sedbergh School.

"That from the date hereof no further election " be made of any Scholar on the Foundation of "Roger Lupton, D.D., or of Henry Hebble-" thwaite.

"That in the place of the Scholarships founded "by the said Roger Lupton and Henry Hebble-"thwaite, there be established Six Exhibitions, of "the yearly value of thirty-three pounds six

"shillings and eightpence each, to be called Lupton and Hebblethwaite Exhibitions.

"That each of the said Exhibitions be tenable " for three years.

"That Two of the said Exhibitions be filled up "by the College in the first term of ordinary " residence for Undergraduate Students, in the

" year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, Two in the year one thousand eight hundred " and sixty, Two in the year one thousand eight "hundred and sixty-one, and so on for ever.

"That those Students only be admitted as " Candidates who have been Scholars of Sedbergh

"School for at least two years.

"That at each annual election a preference be always given to a native of the parish of " Sedbergh in electing to one of the Two Exhibi-"tions (if such an one on presenting himself for " examination be found competent).

"That in the event of a vacancy occurring "during the three years for which any Exhibition "is tenable, a new Exhibitioner be elected by the "College on the same conditions as at the " ordinary yearly elections, and that the Exhibi-"tion so filled up be tenable for such period only "as the Exhibitioner originally elected in the " ordinary manner would have held it.

"That any Lupton and Hebblethwaite Exhibitioner be eligible for any Scholarship, Sizarship, or other College emolument, not being a " second Lupton and Hebblethwaite Exhibition; " and that in the event of his being elected, his "Exhibition be tenable with such Scholarship, Sizarship, or other College emolument.

"That if, on the occasion of a vacancy of any " Lupton and Hebblethwaite Exhibition, no Can-"didate should present himself who had been a Scholar of Sedbergh School for the space of "two years aforesaid, or none such of sufficient " merit to deserve to be elected, the Exhibition " or Exhibitions then to be filled up be treated

" as open to general competition."

And whereas under the Act 40 and 41 Vict. c. 48 s. 54 (hereinafter called the Act) it is enacted that a Statute made by the Commissioners nominated by the Act for a College and any Statute Ordinance or Regulation made by or in relation to a College under any Authority other than that of the Act should after the cesser of the powers of the Commissioners be subject to alteration from time to time by Statute made by the College under the Act and not otherwise the same being passed at a general meeting of the Governing Body of the Collège specially summoned for this purpose by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the persons present and voting.

And whereas it has been represented to us the Master and Fellows of the said College (being the Governing Body thereof) and we are of opinion that the usefulness of the said Exhibitions would be increased if their value were greater.

We the said Master and Fellows of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th Section of the Act amend the said Statute respecting Scholars from Sedbergh School as hereinbefore set out by substituting therefor the Statute following that is to say-

STATUTE for Lupton and Hebblethwaite Exhibitions.

"In place of the six Lupton and Hebblethwaite Exhibitions now established in St. John's "College there shall be established three Exhibi-"tions of the yearly value of £66 13s, 4d, to be called Lupton and Hebblethwaite Exhibitions.

" Each of the said Exhibitions shall be tenable

" for three years.

"The election of the Exhibitioners shall be "vested in the Council of the College and the "intellectual qualifications of candidates shall be " ascertained in such manner as the said Council " shall from time to time determine.

" One of the said Exhibitions shall be filled up " in the year 1894 one in the year 1895 and one " in the year 1896 and so on for ever.

"The day of election in any year shall be "determined by the said Council and they shall "give thirty days' notice to the Head Master of "Sedbergh School of the day so appointed.

"Those Students only shall be admitted as "Candidates who have been Scholars of Sedbergh "School for at least two years and either have "presented themselves for examination or have "entered the College within a year after leaving " the School.

"At each annual election a preference shall " always be given to a native of the parish of " Sedbergh, if such an one on presenting himself

" for examination be found competent.

"The tenure of the said Exhibitions shall be " contingent upon residence good conduct and "application to study and the Council of the "College shall have power to deprive an Exhibi-"tioner of his Exhibition and the Exhibition shall " then be declared vacant.

"In the event of any vacancy occurring whether " by deprivation or from any other cause during "the three years for which an Exhibition is " tenable a new Exhibitioner shall be elected by " the Council of the College at the time of and on "the same conditions as at the ordinary yearly " elections and the Exhibitioner so elected shall " hold such Exhibition for the then unexpired " residue of the term of three years.

" If on the occasion of any vacancy of a Lupton " and Hebblethwaite Exhibition no candidate shall " present himself who has been a Scholar of Sed-"bergh School for the space of two years as " aforesaid or no candidate of such attainments " as to make it probable in the judgment of the " said Council that he will pass during the tenure " of his Exhibition all the examinations required "by the University for a degree with honours the Exhibition or Exhibitions then to be filled up shall be treated as open to public competition.

BE it known, that I, James S. Hogg, Governor of the State of Texas, by authority vested in me by the laws of this State, do hereby declare that quarantine shall be established on the Gulf Coast and Rio Grande border on and after May 1, 1894, and that it shall continue until closed by procla-

Said quarantine shall apply to all vessels, persons, or things coming from places infected by yellow fever, small-pox, or cholera; and all places south of 25° north latitude shall be considered infected unless proof to the contrary be submitted

to the State Health Officer, and special exemption be granted to said places, and persons from such places are prohibited from entering this State within a period of ten days.

I further declare quarantine against any person or persons infected or liable to be infected with yellow fever, small-pox, or cholera, either within or without the State, and direct the quarantine officers of the State, and health officers of counties and towns, to establish local quarantines around any and all such persons whenever discovered.

The Coast Quarantine Stations shall be governed

by the following Rules: -

Rule 1. Every vessel arriving at any port in this State must halt for inspection at some point designated by the local quarantine officer, and no person shall board the vessel until after inspection, and then only when permission to do so is given by the quarantine officer; and all orders made and requirements imposed upon said vessel must be promptly obeyed by, both officers, crew, and passengers.

Rule 2. Vessels from an infected place having had no sickness of an infectious kind en route, shall be detained and subjected to daily processes of purification, such as shifting cargo, fumigating, ventilating, pumping out bilge-water, and freely using disinfectants, for five consecutive days before being permitted to land either passengers, crew, or cargo, and a longer period if in the judgment of the quarantine officer it is necessary to insure perfect safety.

Rule 3. Vessels from badly infected places, or having at time of arrival yellow fever on board, shall not cross the bar until special permit to do so is granted by the State Health Officer.

Rule 4. Vessels from infected ports laden with such articles as cannot possibly be carriers of infection, and vessels coming empty from infected places, may be admitted after complying with above conditions and such other rules as may be prescribed by the State Health Officer.

Rule 5. Every vessel engaged in the fruit business with interdicted places must conform to the rules prescribed by the Conference of Gulf State Health Officers at New Orleans, February 2, 1894, and evidence of such compliance must be submitted to the State Health Officer before a special permit will be granted.

Local boards of health, civil and military authorities, and citizens of Texas are solicited to assist the quarantine. officers in the execution of the above rules, and are earnestly requested to notify the Governor of any dereliction of duty by officers or employées, or any other facts that will give greater efficiency to the quarantine service.

Seeing that it is known that in European and Asiatic Turkey and in Portugal there are at present centres of choleraic infection;

In view of the Law of December 22, 1888, No. 5849 (series 3), for the protection of hygiene and of public health, decrees—

That the Order of Home and Maritime Sanitation of the 11th of November, 1892, No. 9, shall from this date onwards be applied to persons arriving from the ports of the Ottoman Empire situated in the Bosphorus, in the Egean Sea and in the Mediterranean, and from the ports of Portugal

Article 6 of the said Order of 11th of November, 1892, No. 9, will be modified as follows:—

Vessels on which there shall have been proved to occur cases of cholera during the voyage, or which contain at the moment of arrival cases suspected to be of that disease, shall be sent to the nearest sanitary station, either to Isola dell' Asinara, to Isola di Poveglia, or to Augusta, in order to be subjected to such preventive measures as in each individual case the office shall deem requisite.

Vessels which find themselves in such conditions ought to proceed directly to one of the stations above mentioned, before entering any port of Italy.

The Order of Maritime Sanitation of the 23rd September, 1890, No. 3, remains cancelled, the conditions put forward in it being in the later Order reproduced with greater clearness and simplicity.

The Prefects of the Maritime Provinces, the Harbour Masters and Harbour officials of the Kingdom, are desired to carry out the present Order.

In the Matter of Letters Patent bearing date the 15th day of July, 1880, numbered 2923, and granted to Lieutenant-Colonel William Hope, V.C., of the Army and Navy Club, Pall Mall, in the county of Middlesex, and Roswell Sabine Ripley, of the Westminster Palace Hotel, in the county of Middlesex, late Major-General in the service of the Confederate States, and formerly Major in the United States Artillery, for an invention of 'Improvements relating to Ordnance and Firearms and Ammunition for the same."
