#### PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levec, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly written on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

This restriction does not apply to Ladies who, from official position or other circumstances, are specially privileged to make presentations to Her-

Majesty

The Lady who proposes to present another must send in writing the name of such Lady to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Drawing Room, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the name to Her Majesty, when, if it be approved, presenta-tion cards will be forwarded.

IN exercise of the powers vested in me by section 44 of the Burials Act, 1852, as extended and applied by section 7 of the Burials Act, 1853, I, the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby make the following regulations with respect to interments in the Hever Burial Ground at Eden Bridge, in the county of Kent:—

I. The burial ground shall be effectually fenced, and, if necessary, underdrained to such a depth as will prevent water remaining in any grave or vault.

grave or vault.

II. The area to be used for graves shall be divided in grave spaces, to be designated by convenient marks, so that the position of each may be readily determined, and a corresponding plan kept on which each grave space shall be shown.

III. No earthen grave shall be dug within one foot of any other grave.

IV. A register of graves shall be kept in which the name, age, and date of burial in each shall be duly registered. V. No body shall be buried in any vault or walled grave unless the coffin be separately entombed in an air-tight manner, that is by properly comented stone or brick work which shall never be disturbed.

VI. One body only shall be buried in any common carthen grave on the same day, unless the bodies be those of members of the same family; and every coffin shall be forthwith covered with earth at least a foot thick, which shall be closely rammed down never

to be again disturbed.

VII. No unwalled grave shall be re-opened within fourteen years after the burial of a person above twelve years of age, or within eight years after the burial of a child under twelve years of age, unless to bury another member of the same family; in every case a layer of earth not less than one foot thick shall be left undisturbed above the previously buried coffin; but if, on re-opening any grave, the soil be found to be offensive, such soil shall not be disturbed, and in no case shall human remains be removed from the grave.

VIII. No cossin shall be buried in any unwalled grave within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall not be less than three feet below that level.

And the Burial Board at Hever is hereby required to conform to and obey the said Regulations as provided by the Act.

#### SAVINGS BANKS (INVESTMENT) REGULATIONS, 1894.\*

WHEREAS by the Savings Banks Act, 1880, the Treasury is empowered, with the consent of the National Debt Commissioners, so far as any Regulations relate to those Commissioners, and with the consent of the Postmaster-General, so far as any Regulations relate to Post Office Savings Banks, to make Regulations with respect to the matters in the said Act specified, and to revoke alter or add to such Regulations, and by the Savings Banks Act, 1887, it is enacted that such Regulations may provide as in the last-mentioned Act stated:

And whereas by the Savings Banks Act, 1893, it is enacted as follows (Section 3):—

"(1.) Whenever by reason of interest or 
"dividends credited to a Depositor in respect 
"of money or stock standing to his credit 
"in a Savings Bank, or by reason of any 
"sum transferred to his account from the 
"account of a deceased Depositor, the sum 
"standing in the name of a Depositor in a

"(1.) The amount of Government Stock credited by
"a Savings Bank authority to the account of any
"depositor in any Savings Bank year whether any
"stock has been previously sold or not shall not

"exceed two hundred pounds stock.

"(2.) The whole amount of Government Stock credited

"by a Savings Bank authority to the account of a

depositor shall not exceed five hundred pounds

stock at any one time.

"(3.) Provided that a depositor may, not more than "once in any Savings Bank year, purchase stock to "replace stock previously sold in one entire sum during that year."

"Savings Bank exceeds two hundred pounds, "all sums in excess of that amount shall, "unless the Depositor otherwise directs, be "invested by the Savings Bank Authority in "Government Stock, and that stock shall be "credited to the account of the Depositor, but shall not be reckoned in computing the amount of stock which may be credited to the account of a Depositor in any one "Savings Bank year or in the aggregate."

"(2.) Regulations made in accordance with the "provisions of the Savings Banks Act, 1880, "may prescribe the times at which investments are to be made, the minimum amount to be invested at any one time, the class of stock to be purchased, the commission to be paid by the Depositor, and any other matter incidental to investments in pursuance of this Section."

And whereas Regulations dated the 24th day of July, 1888, and the 14th day of June, 1889, have been made by the Treasury under the Savings Banks Act, 1880, and the Savings Banks Act, 1887.

And whereas it is expedient to alter the said Regulations, and to make further Regulations:

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, under and by virtue of all powers and authorities vested in us in that behalf, do, with the consent of the National Debt Commissioners, so far as any Regulations relate to those Commissioners, and with the consent of the Postmaster-General, so far as any Regulations relate to Post Office Savings Banks, make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

#### PRELIMINARY.

#### Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited for all purposes as the Savings Banks (Investment) Regulations, 1894.

Commencement of Regulations.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of June, 1894.

Regulations to be read as one with Regulations of 1888.

3. These Regulations shall be read as one with the Savings Banks (Investment) Regulations, 1888 (hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations of 1898").

Interpretation.

4. In the Regulations of 1888 and in these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires:—

The expression "Government Stock" has the same meaning as in the Savings Banks Act, 1893.

The expression "Savings Bank Year" means, in the case of a Trustee Savings Bank, the twelve months ending on the 20th November in any year, and, in the case of a Post Office Savings Bank, the twelve months ending on the 21st day of December, in any year.

the 21st day of December, in any year.

The expression "Consols" means Two and three-quarters per cent. Consolidated Stock (1903).

The expression "Committee" as applied to the estate of a lunatic means as well the Committee of the estate of a lunatic so found by inquisition as any receiver or other person directed by the Judge in Lunacy to exercise with respect to the estate or property of a lunatic not so found, powers similar to those of a Committee, and includes any person appointed by the Judge of a County Court

to realize the property of a lunatic.

<sup>\*</sup> The power of Savings Bank depositors to invest deposits in Government Stock is conferred by Section 3 of the Savings Bank Act, 1880, as amended by Section 2 of the Savings Bank Act, 1893. The latter enactment provides as follows:—

#### AUTOMATIC INVESTMENT.

Minimum amount to be automatically invested.

5. The minimum sum standing to the credit of a Depositor in a Savings Bank which shall be invested in Government Stock by a Savings Bank Authority, otherwise than on the request of the Depositor, shall be the sum of £5.

#### Investment of Excess on transfer from Account of Deceased Depositor.

5. Where by reason of the transfer of a sum from the account of a deceased Depositor the amount (exclusive of Government Stock) standing to the account of a Depositor in a Savings Bank exceeds the sum of £200 by any sum not less than £5, the notice\* directed by the Regulations of the Savings Bank to be given to the Depositor shall state (in addition to the matters mentioned in the Regulations) that unless the Depositor within one month from the date of such notice otherwise directs, the same will be invested in Government Stock.

#### Investment of Excess of Interest or Dividends.

7. Whenever at the end of any Savings Bank year it appears that by reason of the addition to the sum standing to the credit of any Depositor in a Savings Bank of interest or of dividends on Government Stock credited to the Depositor in the books of the Savings Bank the total amount (exclusive of Government Stock) standing to the account of the Depositor exceeds the sum of £200 by any sum not less than £5 notice shall forthwith be given to such Depositor that unless within one month from the date of such notice he otherwise directs, the same will be invested in Government Stock.

#### Description of Stock.

- 8. Every notice to a Depositor relating to the investment in Government Stock of deposits in excess of £200 (hereinafter referred to as an "Investment Notice") shall—
  (a.) Request such Depositor to specify in what
  - description of Government Stock he desires any such investment to be made; and
  - (b.) State that, should the Depositor fail to specify any description of Government Stock, any such investment will be made in Consols.

#### $\pmb{A}utomatic$ $\pmb{Investment.}$

9.—(1.) Unless a Depositor within one month from the date of an investment notice otherwise directs, the sum specified in such notice to be in excess of £200 shall be invested by the Savings Bank Authority in such Government Stock as the Depositor may have specified, or, failing any such specification, in Consols.

(2.) All the provisions of the Savings Banks (Investment) Regulations, 1888, in relation to an investment in Government Stock on the application of a Depositor, shall (so far as the same are applicable) apply to investments made under this

Regulation.

Automatic Investment in the case of a Minor.

10. Where a Depositor is a minor, any investment notice with reference to deposits standing to the credit of such minor, either alone or on a joint account with any other person, shall be addressed,-

- (a.) Where a minor is under the prescribed age, to the person who under the Regulations or Rules of the Savings Bauk would, if the deposit were a first deposit, be required to make the declaration; and
- (b.) Where the minor is of the prescribed age, to the minor;

and the person to whom such notice is addressed

may give any such direction or specification as is referred to in these Regulations with reference to the investment referred to in the notice.

Automatic Investment in the case of a Lunatic.

- 11.—(1.) Where a Depositor is a lunatic, any investment notice with reference to deposits standing to the credit of such Depositor, either alone or on a joint account with any other person, shall be addressed to the Committee of such lunatic, and such Committee may give any such direction or specification as is referred to in these Regulations with reference to the investment referred to in the notice.
- (2.) In such case as aforesaid where no Committee has been appointed, any investment notice may, in the discretion of the Savings Bank Authority, be sent to any relative of the lunatic or to any other person appearing to be interested in the lunatic or his property, and the Savings Bank Authority shall consider, but shall not be bound to observe, any direction or specification of such person.

#### Automatic Investment not to apply to certain Accounts.

12. The provisions of these Regulations relating to the investment in Government Stock of sums standing in a Savings Bank to the credit of a Depositor otherwise than on the request of the Depositor shall not apply to sums standing to the credit of any Depositor entitled by law to deposit in a Savings Bank a larger sum than £200.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

Commission on Investments, Sales, &c.

13. The commission chargeable on investment in Stock (including the receipt of dividends), and on the sale of Stock, shall be as under, viz. :

With a further charge of 6d. in respect of every £100 Stock or part of £100 Stock above £200.

The Commission on procuring a Stock Certificate, with coupons annexed, under the National Debt Act, 1870, shall be the same as on a sale of Stock, and such commission shall be in addition to the fee payable to the Bank of England for the Certificate.

The commission on a transfer of Stock into the Depositor's name in the books of the Bank of England shall be the same as on a sale of Stock.

Repeal.

14. As and from the date when these Regulations come into force, the Regulations specified in the Schedule to these Regulations are hereby repealed to the extent shown in the second column of that Schedule.

### No. 234.—EAST INDIES STATION. INDIA.

Uniform System of Buoyage.
THE following Uniform System of Buoyage was adopted for Indian waters in 1892, and the Government of India has given notices that it has since been carried out at the undermentioned ports,

viz.:—Karachi; Bombay Harbour; Madras Harbour; Balasor River; Akyab Harbour; Bassein River; and Rangoon River.

The system is as follows:-

- 1. The Mariner, when approaching the coast, must determine his position on the chart, and must note the direction of the main stream of flood tide.
- 2. The term Starboard Hand shall denote that side which would be on the right hand of the Mariner, either going with the main stream of flood, or entering a harbour, river, or estuary from seaward; the term Port Hand shall denote the left hand of the Mariner under the same circumstances.
- 3. Buoys showing the pointed top of a cone above water shall be called Conical, and shall always be Starboard Hand Buoys, as above defined.
- 4. Buoys showing a flat top above water shall be called Can, and shall always be Port Hand Buoys, as above defined.
- 5. Buoys showing a domed top above water shall be called Spherical, and shall mark the ends of Middle Grounds.
- 6. Buoys having a tall central structure on a broad base shall be called Pillar Buoys, and like other special buoys, such as Bell Buoys, Gas Buoys, Automatic Sounding Buoys, &c., &c., shall be placed to mark special positions, either on the coast or in the approaches to harbours, &c.

7. Buoys showing only a mast above water

shall be called Spar Buoys.

8. Starboard Hand Buoys shall always be painted a single red colour.

Port Hand Buoys shall be painted of another characteristic colour, either black or parti-colour.

- 10. Spherical buoys at the ends of Middle Grounds shall always be distinguished by horizontal stripes of white colour.
- 11. Surmounting topmarks, such as staff and cone, &c., shall always be painted of one dark colour.
- 12. Staff and Cone shall only be used on Starboard Hand Buoys; Staff and Cylinder on Port Hand; Globes at the outer ends of Middle Grounds; and Half Globes, round part uppermost, at the inner ends.
- 13. Buoys on the same side of a channel, estuary, or tideway, may be distinguished from each other by names or consecutive numbers or letters, commencing from seaward, and when necessary by a staff, surmounted by the appropriate topmark.

14. Fairway Buoys shall always be painted in horizontal stripes of white colour, and shall be surmounted by a staff only.

15. Buoys intended for mooring, &c., may be of shape or colour according to the discretion of the Authority within whose jurisdiction they are laid, but for marking Submarine Telegraph Cables the colour shall be green, with the word "Telegraph" painted thereon in white letters.

Buoying and marking of wrecks:—

16. Wreck buoys in the open sea, or in the rapproaches to a harbour, or estuary, shall be coloured green, with the word "Wreck" painted in white letters on them.

17. When possible the buoy shall be laid near to the side of the wreck next to mid-channel.

18. When a wreck-marking vessel is used, it shall, if possible, have its top sides coloured green, with the word "Wreck" in white letters thereon, and shall exhibit:—

By day:—Three balls on a yard 20 feet above the sea, two placed vertically at one end, and one

at the other, the single ball being on the sidenearest to the wreck.

By night:—Three fixed white lights, similarly arranged, but not the ordinary riding light.

19. In narrow waters, or in rivers, harbours, &c., under the jurisdiction of Local Authorities, the same rules may be adopted, or, at discretion, varied as follows:—
