THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 24th May, 1894, from Her Majesty's Representative at St. Petersburg, enclosing the following revised Quarantine Regulations in force in the Russian Empire:-

Circular addressed by the Ministry of the Interior to the Governors of the

(Translation from the Russian.)

March 22 (April 3), 1894. IN view of the approaching opening of the

navigation season, I have the honour to reques your Excellency, in supplement to the instructions issued by the Ministry of the Interior for the development of the paragraph of the Rules confirmed by His Imperial Majesty on the 26th April, 1893, respecting the precautionary measures to be taken against the introduction of infectious diseases, to instruct the quarantine and other sanitary establishments under your jurisdiction as follows:-

I. Vessels arriving from places infected with cholera are divided, in regard to the application to them of sanitary measures, and irrespectively of the nature of their bills of health, into infected, doubtful, and healthy categories.

A vessel is recognized as infected on board of which there are cholera patients, or new cases of which disease have occurred within the last seven

A vessel is considered doubtful when cases of cholera have occurred on board on her departure from a port or during a voyage, but when no fresh case has manifested itself during the last seven days.

A vessel is recognized as healthy, although she may have come from an infected port, but on board which there have been no cases of death, nor cholera seizure, on the departure on her voyage or on the arrival of the vessel.

Infected vessels are subjected to the following

measures :-

1. Cholera sick and those suffering from attacks suspected to be of a choleraic nature are removed from the vessel and isolated (§ 11 of the Imperially confirmed Rules, and point 16 of the Instructions for Maritime Quarantine Establishments: vide Annexes 1 and 2).

The period of detention of the persons removed from vessels and placed in sick quarters, or some other local infirmary for the treatment of choleraic patients, must not in any case exceed five days, in accordance with point 3, § 11, of the Imperially confirmed Rules of the 26th April, 1893 (vide Annex 1); and all persons who, after the expiration of that time, shall not prove to be suffering from one of the infectious diseases specified in § 5 of the Rules (vide Annex 3), cannot be detained against their wishes.

Passengers and members of the crew of a vessel who shall be found healthy on medical inspection

shall not be subjected to observation.

2. Disinfection shall be stringently carried out in accordance with points 12 and 13 and the observation to point 8 of the Instructions for Quarantine Establishments (vide Annex 4), as also in conformity with the Circular Instructions of the Ministry of the Interior of the 24th July, 1893, sub No. 1211 (vide Annex 5).

Doubtful vessels shall be subjected to-

Medical inspection.

(2.) Disinfection, in conformity with points 12 and 13 of the Instructions (vide Annex 4).

Vessels found in satisfactory sanitary condition after their inspection, as also their cabins, crews, and passengers, are allowed free pratique (§ 18 of the Imperially confirmed Rules, and point 6 of the Instructions, vide Annex 6); vessels, however, though found in a healthy state, but which present unsatisfactory hygienic conditions (§ 17 of the Rules, and point 7 of the Instructions, vide Annex 7), shall be allowed to load and receive passengers only after the defects observed by the Medical Inspector shall have been remedied; there will, however, be no detention in the landing of healthy passengers and discharge of goods.

places if no cases of cholera or suspected cholera shall have occurred on board within the last seven

III. When in exceptional cases a vessel shall have arrived at a port where there are no quarantine surgeons, but where there is a customs establishment, and when such vessel, owing to a storm or some extraordinary circumstance, could not enter a Russian port provided with a quarantine establishment in order to obtain a bill of health Article 3 of the Imperially confirmed Rules, vide Annex 8), the sanitary inspection of the same, as also the application of all necessary sanitary measures, may be intrusted, at the discretion of the local Governor, to a medical officer under his

IV. The importation of the following articles from cholera-infected European countries shall be

prohibited :-

Bedlinen, clothing, and used articles of dress; as also bed appurtenances that have been in use and brought as part of cargo.

Rags and scraps of clothing.

Exception shall be made in favour of-

(a.) Hydraulically pressed rags imported as wholesale goods in bales, bound with iron bands, and bearings marks and numbers showing the origin of the goods.

(b.) New remnants, exported direct from spinneries, weaving-mills, ready-clothing workshops, or bleaching-mills; artificial wool (shoddy), and

cuttings of new paper.

As regards other goods and articles transported on change of residence, as luggage or articles of domestic use, they shall be subjected to the operation of the instructions issued by the Ministry of the Interior on the 3rd July, 1893, for the disinfection of goods imported at medico-inspection stations on the frontier and at quarantine establishments (vide Annex 9).

The aforesaid goods and articles shall be exempted from the operation of prohibitive measures on importation on the quarantine authorities being supplied with proof that such articles were dispatched at least five days before the appearance of an epidemic at the place from

whence they were forwarded.

#### Annex 1.

Extract from Imperially confirmed Rules for preventing introduction of Epidemic Diseases into Russia by Sea Frontier of April 26 (May 8), 1893).

§ 11. Quarantine procedure on the maritime frontiers shall consist of:-

1. Inspection of sanitary papers;

2. Oral examination, and, in case of necessity, of personal-inspection of crews and passengers;

3. Isolation of persons suspected of suffering from dangerous contagious disorders; and

4. Adoption of necessary measures for improving the sanitary condition of a vessel, and, if necessary, for its disinfection.

#### Annex 2.

Extract from Instructions for Maritime Quarantine Establishments of July 3 (15), 1893.

Point 16. Persons suffering from infectious diseases, or suspected of the same, and removed from a vessel by the local police, shall be transferred to the infectious wards of the local hospitals, and shall only be left in the reception-rooms of a gatory for vessels arriving from cholera-infected | quarantine establishment when, owing to their

serious state, they cannot be so removed. (§ 5 of the Rules Imperially confirmed, Annex 3.)

Annex 3.

Extract from Rules for preventing the introduction of Epidemic Diseases into Russia by Sea Frontier, Imperially confirmed April :26 (May 8), 1893.

§ 5. In order that the Empire be protected against the introduction of plague, cholera, yellow fever, and other diseases specially dangerous on account of their infectious character, the Minister of the Interior shall have the power (1) of declaring any foreign countries, or portions of the same, sanitarily unsatisfactory in respect of any particular infectious disease; and (2) of issuing Regulations within the limits of the present Rules, the observance of which shall be compulsory for all institutions and persons of all branches of the service and descriptions.

#### Annex 4.

Extract from Instructions for Maritime Quarantine Establishments of July 3 (15), 1893. Point 12. In the event of the discovery on

board a vessel of persons suffering from Asiatic cholera the berths occupied by such persons, their luggage, and the things with which they may have come in contact shall be disinfected, as shall also all other places on board which, in the opinion of the medical officer, may have become infected.

Point 13. When having recourse to the process of disinfection, the marine quarantine establishments shall be guided by the instructions for disinfection against Asiatic cholera published in the official Gazette, No. 85 of 1893, and free pratique shall be given to vessels immediately after the process of disinfection shall be carried out, without waiting for the complete drying and airing of the parts of the vessel subjected to disinfection.

Observation to Point 8.

The hold of a vessel shall be purified in the following manner: A fire hose shall be attached to the driving pump and lowered into the hold, a full stream of sea-water is ejected on every part which it is necessary to cleanse, and the process of cleansing shall only cease when the water pumped out shall be the same as that pumped in.

In case of well-founded suspicion of the infection of the hold of a vessel by persons suffering from cholera, or by their evacuations, the hold shall be disinfected.

Annex 5. Circular of the Minister of the Interior of July 24 (August 5), 1893, sub. No. 1211, issued in supplement to and in explanation of Instructions of July 3 (15), 1893.

Relative to Reception Sick Quarters of Marine Quarantine Establishments.

The reception sick quarters of quarantine establishments must consists of-

(a.) One male ward with two to four beds; (b.) One female ward with one or two beds;

(c.) Rooms for a dispensary, and one room each for the subordinate members of the medical staff; and

(d.) A place set apart for a kitchen range for the preparation of food for patients and for the disinfection and washing of linen.

The reception sick quarters are arranged in one of the quarantine buildings, or, if such arrangement be not possible, in a separate heated barrack. The dispensary of the quarters must be supplied with drugs and other necessaries for primary treatment of patients.

kitchen for persons arriving in large parties at the port does not enter within the range of duties of the quarantine authorities, as such places of shelter, &c., must be provided by Steamship Companies and owners of sea-going steamers.

Respecting Questioning of Crews and Passengers, and the Work of Disinfection.

Governors and Prefects, in conjunction with the Customs authorities, will establish the order and method of informing medical quarantine officers on duty of the arrival of vessels in port. The questioning of crews, &c., and inspection of vessels shall take place in the port itself, and only on the accumulation in port of a large number of vessels, on board which there may be one or several cases of cholera sick, a guard-ship shall be stationed in the roads for carrying out the measures necessary in such case.

The berthing of vessels in port prior to quarantine examination shall be done in the prescribed manner, but in order to avoid a crowding of vessels during a time when cholera prevails, a general plan is to be preliminarily worked out for their berthing in port by the Customs and port

authorities.

Disinfection by chemical means of all articles subject to disinfection is effected on board the vessel, with the exception of things belonging to cholera sick removed from a vessel, as are also all articles that have come in contact with persons attacked by cholera, for the complete purification of which disinfection by steam shall be employed, such articles being linen, bedding, and woollen articles, the latter, in the absence of a steam disinfecting chamber on board, are to be removed on shore for disinfection.

The constant presence at night of a medical officer at a quarantine establishment is not obligatory, provided a night service of commissaries or other quarantine or Customs officers is established at a quarantine station. The latter officials give free pratique to Russian passenger vessels on a master of the latter presenting a ship's surgeon's certificate of the satisfactory state of a vessel, and also to all ships navigating Russian internal waters, if on examination of the vessel's papers and master it shall appear that she affords no grounds for suspicion in sanitary respects. When any vessel shall arrive in port in an unsatisfactory condition, the medical officer on quarantine duty shall be at once summoned.

The hoisting on arrival in harbour of yellow, and black flags is obligatory on all vessels arriving from foreign ports; while for vessels plying on internal waters it is only necessary when such vessel may have had communication with even only one of the places infected with any of the diseases specified in § 5 of the Imperially confirmed Rules of the 26th April, 1893 (vide Annex 3).

In accordance with the strict meaning of § 19 of the Imperially confirmed Rules (vide Annex 10), quarantine oral examination, as also the application of sanitary measures to a vessel in appropriate cases, must not retard the carrying ont of Customs formalities.

The disinfection of the clothes and belongings of persons attached to a quarantine and customhouse shall, in case of need, be effected at the discretion of the quarantine medical officer on duty.

Annex 6.

Extract from Rules for preventing the introduction of Epidemic Diseases into Russia by Sea Frontier, Imperially confirmed April 26 (May 8), 1893,

18. All vessels arriving with unclean bills Provision for sheltered accommodation and of health, as also those which have been declared

as suspicious, shall be compulsorily subjected, in respect of their passengers and crews, to medical examination, and if there shall be, or have been, cases of sickness on board, declared infectious in accordance with § 5 (vide Annex 3), the ship's quarters shall be disinfected. For bringing a vessel into satisfactory condition, and for carrying out the work of disinfection, a vessel shall only be detained during the time necessary for this purpose. shipmaster shall be supplied with a certificate specifying the reason for the detention of his vessel, and, in addition to this, the detention of a vessel shall in each case be reported to the proper Consul

Point 6 of Instructions for Maritime Establishments, July 3 (15), 1893.

Vessels arriving with unclean bills of health, or coming under one of the conditions mentioned in § 17 of the Rules, Imperially confirmed, for preventing the spread of epidemic diseases across the maritime boundaries of the Empire, shall, besides oral examination, be subjected to an inspection of their berths, crews, and passengers.

#### Annex 7.

Extract from Rules for preventing the Introduction of Epidemic Diseases into Russia by Sea Frontier, Imperially confirmed April 26 (May 8), 1893.

- § 17. Sea-going vessels arriving from foreign ports, notwithstanding that they may be provided with clean bills or certificates of health, shall be treated as suspected in the following cases:-
- 1. If they have arrived from places declared by the Minister of the Interior, under the Rules laid down in § 5 (vide Annex 3) as unsatisfactory in point of contagious disease, or if they have had communication with these places on their way;

2. If they have arrived with suspicious cases of illness on board:

- 3. If their sanitary condition is evidently bad;
- 4. If the particulars given in the bill of health do not agree with the Consular visa or attestation.

Point 7 of the Instructions for Maritime Quarantine Establishments.

To the conditions which shall serve for recognizing the sanitary condition of a vessel as being bad belong:

1. Crowding of passengers.

2. Accumulation in the berths, &c., of a vessel of dirty rags and unwashed bed and body linen, animal refuse, and various rubbish.

3. Unsatisfactory condition of the stored water. and the absence, during a prevalence of Asiatic cholera, of means for supplying passengers and crew with boiled water.

#### Annex 8.

- Extract from Rules for preventing the introduction of Epidemic Diseases into Russia by Sea Frontier, Imperially confirmed April 26 (May 8), 1893.
- § 3. Ports unprovided with a quarantine medical staff, but in which Customs establishments exist, may be put into by vessels either having a medical man on board, or furnished with a clean bill of health furnished by a Russian quarantine establishment.

#### Annex 9.

Instructions for Marine Quarantine Stations, confirmed by the Minister of the Interior July 3 (15), 1893.

1. At each marine quarantine station there shall always be on duty a medical officer, from time to time relieved by another.

2. The functions to be discharged by the medical officer on duty consist of :---

(a.) Oral sanitary examination of crews, &c., and inspection of vessels arriving at the port;

(b.) Issue of bills of health to vessels;

(c.) Personal observation and superintendence of the measures applied for the systematic purification of vessels and the disinfection of their quarters, goods, and passengers' luggage;

(d.) Medical treatment of sick and of suspicious cases of persons in the quarantine lazarette or

sick reception quarters; and

(e.) The sanitary inspection, when necessary, of outward-bound vessels and passengers.

3. Viva voce examination of the master or skipper of a vessel is made with the object of ascertaining the sanitary condition of a vessel.

4. All information obtained by such examination, as also all the sanitary measures applied to a vessel, shall be entered in the Examination Return or Form.

5. A bill of health is issued with the signature of a medical officer on duty, bearing the seal of

the quarantine station.

- · 6. Vessels arriving with an unclean bill of health, or coming under one of the conditions specified in § 17 of the Imperially confirmed Rules for the adoption of precautionary measures against the introduction of epidemic diseases at the maritime boundaries of the Empire, shall, in addition to oral examination of their crew and passengers, be subjected to the inspection of the quarters of the latter.
- 7. To the conditions leading to a recognition of an unsatisfactory sanitary state of a vessel belong:

- (1.) Crowding of passengers.
  (2.) Accumulation on board of rags, soiled and unwashed apparel and bedlinen, animal refuse, and rubbish.
- (3.) Bad quality of the water supply, and absence during the prevalence of Asiatic cholera of appliances for supplying passengers and crews
- with boiled water.

  8. Vessels recognized as being in an unsatisfactory sanitary condition shall be allowed free pratique only when the defects observed by the medical officer shall have been remedied by means at the disposal of the vessel itself; at the same time, however, the landing of healthy passengers and their luggage shall not be interdicted.

Observation.—The cleansing of a ship's hold is effected in the following manner: -A fire-hose is attached to the driving pump, a full stream of sea-water is directed against every part of the ship which must be purified, and the process shall be continued until the water pumped out shall be the same in appearance as that pumped in.

In case of well-founded suspicion of contamination of the hold by cholera sick or their evacuations, the hold shall be subjected to disinfection.

- 9. Passenger sea-going vessels plying between home ports, and carrying a ship's surgeon, shall be exempted from oral examination of the crew, &c., and inspection, on the presentation by the master of the ship surgeon's certificate as to the satisfactory sanitary condition of the ship.
- 10. The oral examination of the crews, &c., and inspection of coasting-vessels, may be intrusted to one of the officials attached to the quarantine station.
- 11. Only such passengers shall be examined as may excite suspicion owing to the locality from whence they have proceeded, or who may them-selves declare their illness, or may be pointed out as sick by other passengers.

12. In the event of discovery of persons suffering from Asiatic cholera on board a vessel, the places occupied by such sick, their belongings and things with which they may have come in contact, as also all other parts of the vessel which may have been infected by them, shall be subjected to disinfection.

13. When carrying out the process of disinfection, quarantine stations shall be guided by the instructions issued on the subject, and free pratique shall be allowed a vessel when the disinfection shall have been completed, without waiting for the complete drying and airing of the parts of the vessel subjected to the process of disinfection.

14. If a vessel arriving from a cholera-infected port have on board goods which may not be imported in conformity with the list annually published by the Minister of the Interior, such goods shall not be landed. At the same time, however, a vessel may load and discharge other goods under the surveillance of the quarantine authorities, and subject to the precautions estab-

lished by the latter.

15. Foreign-going ships that may not wish to subject themselves to purification and disinfection recognized as necessary by the quarantine authorities shall retain their right of putting out to sea. The landing of passengers from such vessels may be allowed, but the former shall be subjected to medical examination, and in the event of discovery among them of cholera or kindred affections, such cases shall be removed to the local cholera infirmary, and their belongings disinfected.

16. Persons attacked by infectious diseases, or those suspected of suffering from the same, removed from vessels by the local police, shall be placed in the infectious wards of local hospital establishments, and only left in the quarantine reception sick quarters owing to their serious condition rendering removal impossible, or to

other cause.

#### Annex 10.

Extract from Rules for preventing the Introduction of Epidemic Diseases into Russia by Sea Frontier, Imperially confirmed April 26 (May 8), 1893.

§ 19. A sanitary medical official shall board a vessel, together with the Customs authorities, for the purpose of questioning the crew, &c., and for medical inspection; the oral quarantine examination must not interfere with the observance of Customs formalities.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1878.

(41 Vict. c. 16. s. 33.)

LIMEWASHING, &C.

Order of Secretary of State granting Special Exception.

WHEREAS the Factory and Workshop Act, 1878, section 33, provides as follows:

For the purpose of securing the observance of the requirements of this Act as to cleanliness in every factory and workshop, all the inside walls of the rooms of a factory or workshop, and all the ceilings or tops of such rooms (whether such walls, ceilings, or tops be plastered or not), and all the passages and staircases of a factory or workshop, if they have not been painted with oil or varnished once at least within seven years, shall be limewashed once at least within every fourteen months, to date from the period when last limewashed; and if they have been so painted or varnished, shall be washed with hot water and soap once at least within every fourteen months, to date from the period when last washed:

And whereas the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did by Order, dated the 20th December, 1882, direct that the Regulations in section 33 should not apply to foundries:

And whereas it has been proved to my satisfaction, that as regards the foundries specified in the Schedule hereto, the said Order is no longer necessary:

Now I, the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do by this Order, rescind the said Order of the 20th December, 1882, so far as regards the foundries specified in the Schedule hereto.

This Order will come into effect on the 1st July, 1894.
