TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE, BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY.

By Her Majesty's Command,

Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Gentlemen who propose to present others must send in writing the name of such Gentlemen to the Lord Chamberlain's Office, not later than two days previous to the Levee, in order that the Lord Chamberlain may submit the names to Her Majesty, when, if they are approved, Presentation Cards will be forwarded. Forms for the purpose can be obtained at the Lord Chamberlain's Office.

Gentlemen who wish to be presented officially should communicate with the heads of their Department, who will provide them with the

necessary cards and instructions.

It is particularly requested that the names of the Gentlemen to be presented be very distinctly voritten on the Presentation Cards delivered to the Lord Chamberlain at the Levee, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 12th June, 1894, from Her Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, reporting that, under a Royal Ordinance dated the 8th instant, the following places are now to be prepared as observation stations in case of cholera in the neighbouring countries, viz.:—

Bredvik, outside Umeå. Juniskären, outside Sundsvall. Fejan, near Furusund. Härön, near Sandhamn.

Arkö, in the Archipelago of Östergötland. Vestra Hastholmen, in the Archipelago of Karlskrona.

Hven Island.

The following are also to be made ready as quarantine stations as well as observation stations, viz.:—

Känsö, outside Gothenburg.

Fejan, near Furusund.

Should cholera appear in any Russian port on the Baltic the first six of the abovenamed stations will be at once opened.

Should cholera reach Denmark, Hven will be opened; and should cholera break out in any German Baltic port all the above stations will be immediately opened.

Bucarest, ce 3/15 Juin, 1894. Le Département Royal des Affaires Etrangères a l'honneur de porter à la connaissance de la Légation Royale d'Angleterre les mesures prophylactiques prises par le Conseil des Ministres dans le séance du 29 Mai (10 Juin), 1894, sur l'avis de la Direction Générale du Service Sanitaire en vue d'empêcher l'importation en Roumanie du Choléra, qui a été officiellement constaté dans plusieures localités de la Bucovine.

1. La création d'un service de révision sanitaire et de désinfection aux points frontière de Michail-

eni et de Burdujeni.

2. La fermeture de tous les autres points d'entrée de Bucovine, ainsi que celle du point Molnitza situé au point de jonction des frontières de Roumanie d'Autriche-Hongrie et de Russie.

3. La garde de la frontière sera renforcée par

des troupes permanentes.

4. Les ouvriers et toutes autres personnes venant en masse, ne seront admis que sur autorisation spéciale et après avoir subi une observation médicale.

5. L'entrée sera interdite pour tous les vaga-

bonds et les individus malpropres.

6. Toutes les personnes venant du district de Cotzman (Bucovine) seront autant que possible soumises à une observation médicale pendant cinq jours au lieu de leur destination.

Toutes les mesures précitées seront mises en application à partir du 4/16 Juin courant.

Any person acting in contravention of this Regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of a conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and

if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage, upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned.

Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor, or other duly authorized officer of the Company, the fare legally demandable for the

urnev.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any), when required so to do by the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket on the completion of his journey, or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics,

or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company, shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail of the roof of any carriage, and shall cease to do so immediately on request of the conductor.

14. No person except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

16. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

17. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter or mount, or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

18. No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave any carriage whilst in motion.

19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

powder, or other explosive materials.
