Now I, the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby certify that in my opinion such processes carried on in factories and workshops, or parts thereof, as are named in the Schedule hereunder, are dangerous or injurious to health.

ORDER of the Local Government Board:  
Altering Name of Local Board: Public Health Act, 1875, Section 311:—

Ormskirk Union.

Lathom Local Government District.

To the Lathom Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Lathom, in the County of Lancaster;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 311 of the Public Health Act, 1875, it is enacted as follows:—

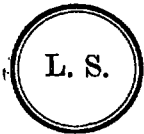
"Any Local Board constituted either before or after the passing of this Act may, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, change their name. Every such change of name shall be published in such manner as the Local Government Board may direct";

And whereas the said Lathom Local Board have resolved that their name should be altered to the "Lathom and Burscough Local Board," and have made application to Us, the Local Government Board, to sanction such change of name:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We hereby give Our sanction to the name of the said Local Board being changed to the "Lathom and Burscough Local Board."

And We hereby Direct that the Lathom and Burscough Local Board shall cause this Order to be published during two successive weeks in some newspaper circulating within their District within one calendar month from the date hereof.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—the farm-yard and all the cattle-sheds thereon at Sheriffs Court Farm, together with the field adjoining the farm premises and known as the Home Meadow, all in the parish of Minster, in the county of Kent, in the occupation of Thomas Willett,—which was declared by Order of the Board dated the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from
