THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 3rd July, 1894, from Her Majesty's Representative at Stockholm, reporting that the Official Gazette of the 2nd instant declared the following Russian provinces infected with cholera from the 30th ultimo, viz.:—the Province of St. Petersburg, with all other Russian Provinces not yet declared infected; but the following provinces are nevertheless not to be regarded as infected, viz.:—Estonia, Livonia, and Kurland; nor is Finland regarded as infected.

The following observation and quarantine stations have been opened, besides the observation and quarantine station at Känkö, near Gothenburg, viz.:—the observation and quarantine station on the Island of Fejan, near Furusund, outside Stockholm; the observation stations at Bredvik, outside Umeå; at Juniskären, outside Sundsvall; at Harö, near Sandhamn, outside Stockholm; at Arkö, in the Östergötland Archipelago; and at Vestra Hästholmen, in the Karlskrona Archipelago.

THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 5th July, 1894, from Her Majesty's Representative at Christiania, enclosing the following translation of a Norwegian Quarantine Notice:—

Justice and Police Department of the Royal Norwegian Government.

By Royal Order a Mandate (Plakat) was issued on 29th June, 1894, to the following effect:—

In virtue of the Law of 1st July, 1887, containing an appendix to the Quarantine Law of 12th July, 1848, it is forbidden to import into the Kingdom from Galicia or the Bukhovina, use linen, used articles of clothing, and used bed clothes, used wadding together with clouts and rags.

Clouts and rags shall, until further notice, be permitted to be imported on the conditions that may be laid down by the Department of Justice which at the same time shall be authorized in special cases to allow the importation, for the use of the person interested, from Galicia and the Bukhovina, and likewise from Russia of use articles of clothing, used linen, and used bed

clothes, even if these are not brought as passengers' effects (S. 1 Law of 1st July, 1887), on the condition that proper disinfection takes place on the responsibility and at the cost of the person concerned.

This Mandate to enter at once into force.

Notice is hereby given, that an infringement of this Mandate, or of the rules given in accordance with its contents, is punishable under Section 21 of the Quarantine Law of 12th July, 1848. Articles which, in contest with it, are sought to be imported or have been imported, shall be forfeited to the State Treasury if not possible of destruction.

The prohibition in the first paragraph of the Mandate does not apply to linen or articles of clothing which any one may bring with him for his own use, as passengers' effects.

Which is hereby communicated, while directing attention to the fact that in virtue of the Royal Mandate of 19th August, 1892, the importation into the Kingdom from Russia of used linen, used articles of clothing, and used bedclothes, clouts, rags, and used wadding is forbidden.

The importation of clouts and rags from that country is however in virtue of the Royal Mandate of 26th September, 1893, until further notice, permitted on the conditions laid down by the Department, and given below, which shall also be applicable for permission to import clouts and rags from Galicia and the Bukhovina, namely:—

That it be established either by a certificate from the proper Norwegian or Swedish Consul, that the clouts and rags in question have been collected only in places which have been free from cholera, or have been properly disinfected at the place of shipment, before it shall have taken place, or;

That at the place of importation immediately after their arrival, they are disinfected under the control of the Sanitary Commission of the place.

RULE OF THE SUPREME COURT.

THE following Draft Rule is published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893, by order of the authority to make Rules under the Supreme Court of Judicature Acts. Copies may be obtained from the Queen's Printer.

Draft Rule.

Local Government Act, 1894.

Section 70.

July, 1894.

Rule of the Supreme Court.

1. The summary proceeding for submitting any question for decision to the High Court of Justice under the seventieth section of the Local Government Act, 1894, shall be by special case to be agreed upon by the parties, or in default of such agreement to be settled by an arbitrator agreed upon by the parties, or if necessary appointed by a Judge at Chambers, or to be settled by a Judge in Chambers.

2. The special case when settled shall be filed at the Crown Office Department at the Central Office of the Supreme Court, by the Chairman of Quarter Sessions, the County Council, or the Local Authority concerned within eight days from the settlement thereof, and shall be put into the Crown paper for argument as if it were a case stated by Justices under 20-21 Victoria, chapter 43.

This Rule shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1894.

RIOT (DAMAGES) ACT, 1886.**REGULATIONS AS TO CLAIMS FOR COMPENSATION.**

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, make the following Regulations:—

1. All claims for compensation under the Act shall be made in writing, and shall be delivered as under:—

When the matter in respect of which the claim is made arises in—

The City of London and the liberties thereof, to the Town Clerk of London.

The Metropolitan Police District, to the Receiver for the Metropolitan Police District.

Any county, riding, parts, division, or liberty of a county maintaining a separate police force, or any borough the police force of which has been consolidated with the police force of a county, to the Clerk to the County Council.

A borough maintaining a separate police force, to the Town Clerk.

Any town not being a borough, and maintaining a separate police force under any local Act of Parliament, to the Clerk to the Commissioners or other authority under the local Act.

The River Tyne within the limits of the Acts relating to the Tyne Improvement Commissioners, to the Secretary to the Commissioners.

2. All claims shall be so delivered within fourteen clear days after the day when such injury, stealing, or destruction took place.

Provided that the police authority, on application to be made before the expiration of the fourteen days, may, for special cause shown, enlarge the period of fourteen days to forty-two days, and in the event of such application being refused, the applicant may, within seven days after such refusal, appeal to the Secretary of State, and his decision shall be conclusive as to whether the claim shall be received.

3. All claims shall be made in the form appended to these Regulations.

4. The claim shall specify the name and address of the claimant, the day and hour on which the injury, stealing, or destruction took place; and as to the premises whether they are a house, shop, or building, and where they are situated, and the nature of the claimant's interest therein.

5. The claim shall state separately the sums claimed for—

(a.) Destruction of premises,

(b.) Injury to premises (including injury to windows, fittings, or fixtures thereof),

(c.) Injury to other property in or on the premises,

(d.) Theft or destruction of other property in or on the premises,

distinguishing, as regards (c.) and (d.), property belonging to the claimant from property belonging to others in his care.

6. Where the claim is in respect of injury done either to premises or to property therein, it shall state shortly the nature of the injury; if the injury has been repaired, it shall state the cost of the repairs, and be accompanied by the bill for such repairs; if the injury has not been repaired, but is repairable, then the claim shall contain a specification of the repairs required, and an estimate by a competent person of their cost.

7. Where the claim is in respect of property in or upon premises, whether such property has been injured, stolen, or destroyed, it shall, when practicable (except in the case of articles of the same nature and of small value, and except where the cost of repairs only is claimed), specify each article separately, and the sum claimed for it or for the injury thereto; and, when practicable, the claimant shall send with his claim vouchers or copies of vouchers for the sums paid by him for the property.

8. In all cases the claim shall state generally the evidence which the claimant is prepared to offer in support of it, and the place where such documents as he proposes to put in evidence may be inspected; and whether the claimant has received or may receive, or is entitled to, any compensation from any (and if so what) source for any loss included in his claim, and the amount of such compensation.

9. The claimant if so required by the police authority shall verify the claim by himself making such a statutory declaration, and by procuring and furnishing to the police authority such statutory declarations of other persons as the police authority may require; and he shall produce to the police authority and to any person nominated by that authority all such documents under his control as are needed to support his claim, and shall deliver to the police authority copies thereof or extracts therefrom as may be required, and shall give to the police authority or any person nominated by that authority access to the premises and produce the property for injury to which the claim is made.

10. The police authority may make separate awards as regards property of the claimant and property not belonging to him.

When an award includes compensation for property in the care of, but not belonging to, the claimant, it may provide that prior to payment either the claimant shall produce receipts from the owners for the sums payable to them, or their authority to him to receive the same, or that the claimant or some other person to be approved by the police authority shall enter into a bond or personal undertaking with the police authority in such sum as the award shall name for securing

payment to the owners of such property of the sums due to them. When an award includes compensation for stolen property, it may provide for a similar bond or undertaking for securing either repayment to the police authority of the whole or such part as the police authority may determine of the compensation paid for such stolen property as may be subsequently recovered, or the delivery of the property so recovered to the police authority to be realized by them for the benefit of the police rate.

11. No costs will be allowed to any claimant.

12. The above regulations shall, with the necessary variations, apply:

(a.) In the case of the plundering, damage, or destruction of any ship or boat stranded or in distress, on or near the shore of any sea or tidal water, or of any part of the cargo or apparel of such ship or boat, by persons riotously and tumultuously assembled together; and

(b.) In the case of the injury or destruction, by persons riotously and tumultuously assembled together, of any machinery (whether fixed or moveable) prepared for or employed in any manufacture or agriculture, or any branch thereof, or of any erection or fixture about or belonging to such machinery, or of any steam engine or other engine for sinking, draining, or working any mine or quarry, or of any staith or erection used in conducting the business of any mine or quarry, or of any bridge, waggon-way or trunk for conveying minerals or other product from any mine or quarry.

13. The Regulations made under the above-mentioned Act on the 23th July, 1886, are hereby revoked.

Treasury Chambers, July 12, 1894.

THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that at a Trial of the Pyx, held at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, on the 4th July, 1894, in accordance with the provisions of the Order in Council of the 29th June, 1871, the following verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the Queen's Remembrancer, viz. :—

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn this fourth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, before the Queen's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, have made the Assays and Trials of Her Majesty's Gold and Silver Coins in the Pyx of the Mint, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins, both of gold and silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain; and we took two coins from each of such packets of Gold coins, making altogether four Five pound or one hundred shilling pieces, sixty-eight Sovereigns or Twenty shilling pieces, and thirty Half-Sovereigns or Ten shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was plus four thousandths of an ounce (.004 oz.) on the whole of such coins, and that, therefore, they were within the prescribed remedy as to weight. We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such

ingot, comparing it with the standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus six hundred thousandths (or .0006), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. We then took from such residue one Five pound piece, six Sovereigns, and three Half-Sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Five pound piece weighed 617.122 grains; that such Sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123.374 grains, the second 123.424 grains, the third 123.174 grains, the fourth 123.124 grains, the fifth 123.324 grains, and the sixth 123.324 grains; and that such Half-Sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 61.507 grains, the second 61.627 grains, and the third 61.717 grains. We then assayed the said Five pound piece, six Sovereigns, and three Half-Sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such Five pound piece to be 916.46, of such Sovereigns to be 916.30, 916.36, 916.86, 916.66, 916.36, and 916.60 respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such Half-Sovereigns to be 916.56, 916.76, and 916.36 respectively. We also took two coins from each of such packets of Silver coins, making altogether four Crowns, six Half-Crowns, eighteen Florins, thirty-two Shillings, eighteen Sixpences, two Fourpences, twelve Threepences, two Twopences, and two Pennies, and weighed each of the said Silver coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the said Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus eleven thousandths of an ounce (.011 oz.) on the whole of such coins, and that, therefore, they were within the prescribed remedy as to Weight. We then melted the said Silver coins, so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus one ten thousandths (or .0001), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to Weight. We then took from such residue one Crown, one Half-Crown, one Florin, one Shilling, one Sixpence, and one Threepence, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Crown weighed 434.863 grains, that such Half-Crown weighed 218.081 grains, that such Florin weighed 174.545 grains, that such Shilling weighed 86.972 grains, that such Sixpence weighed 43.666 grains, and that such Threepence weighed 21.838 grains. We then assayed the said Crown, the said Half-Crown, the said Florin, the said Shilling, the said Sixpence, and the said Threepence separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such Crown to be 924.1, of such Half-Crown to be 924.9, of such Florin to

be 924-8, of such Shilling to be 925-0, of such Sixpence to be 925-9, and of such Threepence to be 925-5.
