**W**HEREAS by the first section of "The Colonial Probates Act, 1892," it is enacted as follows:—

"Her Majesty the Queen may, on being satisfied that the legislature of any British possession has made adequate provision for the recognition in that possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom, direct by Order in Council that this Act shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications specified in the Order, apply to that possession, and thereupon, while the Order is in force, this Act shall apply accordingly."

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the British Possession herein-after mentioned has made adequate provision for the recognition in that Possession of probates and letters of administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in Her Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

"The Colonial Probates Act, 1892," shall apply to the British Possession hereunder mentioned:—

The Island of Jamaica.

And the Most Honourable the Marquess of Ripon Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her

Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-first day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district or new parish for spiritual purposes out of the parish of Saint Mary Islington in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

“Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Saint Mary Islington which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district or new parish for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner hereinafter set forth.

“And whereas there is within the limits of the district or new parish so hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted as aforesaid a consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship being the church or chapel of ease situate in the Holloway-road in the said parish of Saint Mary Islington which said church or chapel of ease was erected under the provisions of a certain local Act of the fifty-first year of His late Majesty King George the Third chapter one hundred and thirty-four.

“And whereas in pursuance of another local Act being an Act of the fifth year of His late Majesty, King George the Fourth chapter one hundred and twenty-five the whole right of patronage of and nomination to the said church or chapel of ease became vested in the vicar of the said parish of Saint Mary Islington and in his successors for the time being.

“And whereas a scheme under the Charitable Trusts Acts 1853 to 1887 has been approved by an Order dated the third day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three of the Chancery Division of Your Majesty's High Court of Justice in the matter of the estate of the late Robert Alger Newbon deceased whereby certain trustees were appointed for the management of the charity and it was provided that if within twelve months from the date of such scheme coming into operation the said church or chapel of ease should be legally constituted a new or district parish church under the provisions of the New Parishes Acts or the Church Building Acts or any of them a fund should be established for the permanent endowment of the incumbency of such new church as follows (that is to say) the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds should be set apart in each year out of the income of the said charity upon condition nevertheless that an equivalent reduction be made in the amount of the rents authorized to be taken for pews or sittings in the said church or chapel of ease and such sum should be paid by the trustees to the incumbent for the time being of the said new parish by equal quarterly payments.

“And whereas certain arrangements have been made whereby the amount of the pew rents in the said church or chapel of ease shall be reduced as required by the said Scheme and Order of the Court and the said annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds will accordingly become payable to the incumbent of the district and new parish hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to

his successors immediately upon the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

“And whereas a faculty for laying out the burial ground attached to the said chapel of ease (which burial ground has been closed for burials by an Order of Your Majesty in Council) as an open space under and pursuant to the Act of the forty-fourth and forty-fifth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-four and the Acts amending the same was on the tenth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three granted by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick Bishop of the said diocese of London to the Vestry of the civil parish of Saint Mary Islington and such burial ground has since been so laid out and is now under the charge and control of the said Vestry.

“Now therefore with the consent of the said Frederick Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Saint Mary Islington which is mentioned and described in the schedule hereunder written and which is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district or new parish for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named (when such district shall have become as it will by operation of law at once become a new parish) ‘The New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Holloway-road, Islington.’

“And we further recommend and propose that the said church or chapel of ease being a consecrated church in use for the purposes of Divine worship and situate within the limits of the proposed new parish shall as from the day last-mentioned be and for that purpose we hereby specify the same church or chapel of ease as the parish church of the said new parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Holloway-road Islington.

“And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of and nomination to the said new parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Holloway-road Islington shall vest as at present in the vicar of the said parish of Saint Mary Islington and his successors for the time being.

“Provided always that the foregoing scheme shall be without prejudice to a certain judgment delivered at Saint Paul's Cathedral on the twentieth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three by the Judge of the Consistory Court of London upon an application by the Vestry of the civil parish of Saint Mary Islington for the faculty for laying out the burial ground attached to the said church or chapel of ease under the Open Spaces Acts as aforesaid and to the faculty issued in pursuance of such judgment.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The new parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Holloway-road, Islington being:—

“All that part of the parish of Saint Mary Islington in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London which is bounded upon the

west partly by the district parish of the Holy Trinity Islington partly by the new parish of Saint Clement Barnsbury partly by the new parish of Saint James Lower Holloway and partly by the new parish of Saint Barnabas Hornsey-road all in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the north by the new parish of Saint Thomas Finsbury Park in the said county and diocese upon the north-east by the new parish of Christ Church Highbury in the same county and diocese upon the east partly by the new parish of Saint Augustine Highbury New Park and partly by the district parish of Saint Paul Ball's Pond both in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the south-east by the new parish of Saint Stephen Islington in the same county and diocese and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Stephen Islington from the parish of Saint Mary Islington aforesaid at the south-western corner of Canonbury-square and extending thence northward and in a direct line for a distance of twelve yards or thereabouts to a point at the middle of the eastern end of Canonbury-lane and extending westward along the middle of the said lane for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Upper-street and with Park-street and continuing thence still westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to a point at its junction with Liverpool-road upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Mary Islington from the district parish of the Holy Trinity Islington aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbent of the said parish of Saint Mary Islington out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken.

And whereas the said patrons and the said incumbent have offered certain objections to the said scheme.

And whereas (notwithstanding such objections) the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the twenty-first day of June, in the

year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Bedford in the county of Bedford and in the diocese of Ely.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twenty-sixth day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty and published in the London Gazette on the thirtieth day of the same month, a part of the parish of Saint Paul Bedford in the said county of Bedford and in the diocese of Ely aforesaid was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of the Holy Trinity situate within the limits of such parish and the same district was called 'The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity Bedford.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity Bedford has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four become new a parish of the character contemplated by that Act and by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Bedford should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Honourable and Right Reverend Alwyne Bishop of the said diocese of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Bedford shall be altered so that all that portion of the said new parish which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink shall be dis severed from such new parish and shall be restored to and shall in future again form part of the said parish of Saint Paul Bedford.

"And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts or any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dis severed from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Bedford, in the county of Bedford and in the diocese of Ely, and to be restored to the parish of Saint Paul, Bedford in the same county and diocese, being:—

"All that part of the said new parish of the

Holy Trinity Bedford which is bounded upon the west by the parish of Biddenham in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the south-west and upon the south-east by the parish of Saint Paul Bedford aforesaid, and upon the remaining sides that is to say, upon the north-east, and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Paul Bedford from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Bedford aforesaid, at the centre of the bridge which carries Ford End-road over the main line of the Midland Railway, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of thirty and a half chains or thereabouts (thereby passing through the Bedford Railway Station on the same line of railway) to the centre of the bridge which carries Bromham-road over the said line of railway, and extending thence generally westward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of twenty-one and a half chains or thereabouts to a point at Gallows Corner upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Bedford from the parish of Biddenham aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ely.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of "The Saint Pancras Ecclesiastical Regulation Act 1868," duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven and of "The Saint Pancras Ecclesiastical Regulation Act 1868," have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the parish (sometime district) of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill and partly out of the parish (sometime district) of Saint Martin Kentish Town both within the original limits of the parish of Saint Pancras in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us

that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill and of the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas under the provisions of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three and published in the London Gazette on the nineteenth day of the same month the benefice (being a rectory) of All Hallows the Great and All Hallows the Less and the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Michael Royal and Saint Martin Vintry within the city and diocese of London were united into one benefice and it was by the same Order provided amongst other things that an ecclesiastical district formed or to be formed within the limits of the Metropolis should be selected by the Bishop of London as the district for which a church should be built (and consecrated by the name and style of All Hallows, or such other name and style as may appear to such Bishop to be most expedient) out of the proceeds of the sale or sales which are about to be carried into effect, of the materials and site of the church of All Hallows the Great which as directed by that Order, is to be taken down.

"And whereas the district hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected by the said Bishop of London as the district for which a church shall be built and consecrated as provided by the said Order of Your Majesty in Council.

"And whereas out of the net proceeds of the sale or sales hereinbefore mentioned we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners are authorized by the said Order in Council after setting apart a sum of six thousand five hundred pounds or thereabouts for or towards certain objects specified by such Order, to appropriate the remainder of such net proceeds for or towards the acquisition of a suitable site for and the erection of a new church within the limits of the said proposed district as the church for such district and if the balance of the amount of such remainder shall be sufficient, to appropriate the same for or towards the acquisition of a suitable site for, and the erection of a parsonage house within the limits of the said proposed district as the parsonage house for such district.

"And whereas under the terms of the said Order in Council it is further provided that out of the income of the united benefice of Saint Michael Royal with Saint Martin Vintry and All Hallows the Great and Less, and after making provision for the payment to the rector thereof and his successors of a clear annual sum of six hundred pounds out of the income of the said united benefice the residue of such income shall subject to certain contingencies form the endowment or part of the endowment of the new district hereinafter proposed to be constituted.

"And whereas the amount at present so available for the endowment of the said proposed district when duly constituted is two hundred and thirty-one pounds per annum or thereabouts.

"And whereas the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish then of the same new parish will under the provisions of the said Order in Council be vested alternately in

the Bishop of London for the time being and in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and the Metropolitan Church of Christ Canterbury the first turn of appointment and presentation to be vested in the Bishop of London.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick, Bishop of the said diocese of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill and of the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town which are described in the Schedule hereunder written (all of which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed) shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of All Hallows North Saint Pancras' and that the said district so soon as a minister shall have been licensed thereto shall be endowed as contemplated by the firstly herein-mentioned Order of Your Majesty in Council.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and (so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then) of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister of the said proposed district or (as the case may be) of the incumbent of the said new parish shall (as is provided by the hereinbefore recited Order in Council) be assigned to and be vested alternately in the said Bishop of London for the time being and in the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of Christ Canterbury, the first turn of appointment and presentation to be vested in the said Bishop of London.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Hallows North Saint Pancras comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill within the original limits of the parish of Saint Pancras in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, which is bounded upon the west partly by the new parish of Saint Saviour South Hampstead and partly by the new parish of Saint Stephen Hampstead both in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the north by the parish of Kentish Town within the original limits of the said parish of Saint Pancras upon the east by the hereinafter described portion of the parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town also within the original limits of the said parish of Saint Pancras and upon the remaining sides that is to say upon the south-east and upon the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town from the parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill aforesaid at the point where Allcroft-road joins the roadway called or known as Lismore-circus the said point being over the tunnel which carries the main line of the Midland Railway under the

said circus and extending thence generally westward along the middle of the last-named roadway for a distance of two and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction at the Haverstock Hill Railway Station on the said line of railway with Rochford-street (formerly called or known as Circus-road) and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nine and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Southampton-road and extending thence westward and in a straight line across the last-named road to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence which forms the north-eastern boundary of the garden and premises attached to the building called or known as Saint Dominick's Priory and situate upon the south-western side of the last-named road and extending thence north-westward along the said wall or fence for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill from the new parish of Saint Saviour, South Hampstead aforesaid.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town which is bounded upon the west by the hereinbefore described portion of the parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill upon the north and north-east by the parish of Kentish Town aforesaid and upon the remaining side that is to say upon the south by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Kentish Town from the parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town aforesaid at the centre of the tunnel which carries the Hampstead Junction Railway over the main line of the Midland Railway aforesaid and extending thence westward along the middle of the last-mentioned line of railway for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the roadway called or known as Lismore-circus as aforesaid above the middle of the tunnel which carries the said last-mentioned line of railway under the said circus and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named roadway for a distance of seventy links or thereabouts to the point where the same roadway is joined by Allcroft-road as aforesaid upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town from the parish of Saint Andrew Haverstock Hill aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and the patrons and incumbents of the said parish of Saint Andrew, Haverstock Hill have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the patron and the incumbent of the said parish of Saint Martin Kentish Town have offered certain objections to the said scheme.

And whereas (notwithstanding such objections) the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of the Annunciation situate as aforesaid.

“Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick Bishop of the said diocese of London (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said district parish of Saint Mary (Bryanston-square) Saint Marylebone which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of the Annunciation situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The District Chapelry of the Annunciation Bryanston-street, Saint Marylebone.’

“And with the like consent of the said Frederick Bishop of the said diocese of London (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of the Annunciation situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

“We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The District Chapelry of the Annunciation Bryanston-street, Saint Marylebone, being:—

“All that part of the district parish of Saint Mary (Bryanston-square) Saint Marylebone, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the east by the new parish of Saint Thomas Portman-square, in the said county and diocese, upon the south partly by the new parish of Saint Mark North Audley-street and partly by the parish of Saint George Hanover-square, both in the county and diocese aforesaid, upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint John Paddington in the said county and diocese, upon a small part of the north by the new parish of Saint Luke Nutford-place in the same county and diocese and upon the remaining part of the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke Nutford-place from the district parish of Saint Mary (Bryanston-square) Saint Marylebone aforesaid at the junction of Seymour-place with Upper Berkeley-street, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of fifteen and three-quarter chains to its junction with Gloucester-street and with the roadway forming the northern side of Portman-square and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of seven and a half chains to its junction with Baker-street and with Lower Berkeley-street, upon the boundary which divides the said district parish of Saint Mary (Bryanston-square) Saint Marylebone from the new parish of Saint Thomas Portman-square aforesaid.”
