## Foreign Office, Juiy 12, 1894.

TTHE Queen has been graciously pleased to appoint Lieutenant-Colonel Henry Trotter, C.B., to be Her Majesty's Commissioner on the European Commission for the Navigation of the River Danube.

## Whitehall, July 6, 1894.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to grant unto James Burns, Esquire, Captain in the Royal Regiment of Horse Guards (eldest son of John William Burns, of Kilmahew, in the parish of Cardross, in the county of Dumbarton, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace and Deputy Lieutenant for the said county of Dumbarton), and Florence Honoria, bis wife, eldest daughter of William Wrey Hartopp, late of Dalby Hall, in the parish of Melton Mowbray, in the county of Leicester, sometime Captain in the said Royal Regiment of Horse Guards, who was the son of Edward Bourchier Hartopp, late of Dalby Hall aforesaid, Esquire, both deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that they may take and use the surname of Hartopp in addition to and after that of Burns ; that he, the said James Burns, may take and bear the arms of Hartopp quarterly with his own family arms ; and that such surnames and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by the issue of their marriage; the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be roid and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

## Westminster, July 20, 1894.

THIS day the Lords being met a message was sent to the Honouralle House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords authorized by virtue of a Comimission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Moyal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to
