THE Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Telegrams, dated 22nd July, 1894, from Her Majesty's Representative at Constantinople:—

"Arrivals from Black Sea coast, between Roumanian frontier and Kertch, inclusive, to undergo medical inspection in a port with sanitary officer. Arrivals from Gulf of Adalia, between Cape Chalidonia and Cape Anamour, to submit to similar inspection. Quarantine mentioned in my *telegram of the 22nd June reduced to five days, to be passed at Sinope. These regulations date from 17th July. Quarantine against Lisbon suppressed from 18th July."

"Cholera having broken out at Adrianople five days' quarantine has been imposed on all

arrivals from Europe by land, to be performed at Turco-Bulgarian and Turco-Servian frontiers."
