In the High Court of Justice.—Chancery Division. Mr. Justice North.

In the Matter of the Blackpool Railway Company, and in the Matter of the Railway Companies Act, 1867.

WHEREAS by an Order, dated the 16th June, 1894, an inquiry is directed whether there are any and what debts of the said Company, and whether the same and which of them are incumbrances or charges on the undertaking, or tolls and moneys arising out of the same, or any and what part of the same respectively, and how the same respectively were created, and what are the rights and priorities of the persons for the time being interested therein. Now pursuant to

such Order the several persons claiming to be entitled to debts of the said Company, including incumbrances or charges on the undertaking, or tolls and moneys arising out of the same, or any part of the same respectively, are personally, or by their Solicitors, on or before the 29th October, 1894, to come in and prove their claims, at the chambers of Mr. Justice North, at the Royal Courts of Justice, Strand, London, or in default thereof they will be peremptorily excluded from the benefit of the said Order. Wednesday, the 7th November, 1894, at twelve o'clock at noon, at the said chambers, is appointed for hearing and adjudicating upon the claims.—Dated this 4th August, 1894.
