tion previously specified (either at the end of their first or second year of service) before being classed as "trained men."

Trained Men .- Non-Commissioned Officers and Sappers with over one year's service, who have passed the test examination previously specified may be returned as efficient, provided that they shall have attended the continuous training for eight days, and 78 submarine mining drills.

Experts.—Non-Commissioned Officers Sappers with over three years' efficient service, who have passed the test examination for experts, may be returned as efficient, provided that they shall have attended the continuous training for eight days and 48 submarine mining drills, or the complete period of fifteen days' continuous training

and 10 submarine mining drills.

Special Exemptions .- Non-Commissioned Officers and Sappers specially exempted from attendance at the continuous training under the provisions of the Volunteer Regulations, may have their certificates granted, provided that they shall have attended the following number of drills, which may be counted by attendance during a portion of the camp, at whole-day or half-day parades, or at hourly drills.

Recruits.-90 drills. Trained Men.—90 drills. Expert Men.—60 drills.

Notes.

Drills.—A submarine mining drill is one hour's actual submarine mining work. Periods of continuous work of not less than 1½, 2, 2½, 3, and 3½ hours, may be reckoned as equivalent numbers and fractions of drills towards efficiency.

Recruits should not do more than two hourly drills on

one evening.

A whole-day parade will count as 6 drills.

A half-day parade will count as 4 drills.

A working day during the continuous training will count as 6 drills in computing the number of drills required in excess of the period of eight days' continuous training, and also in the case of Volunteers specially exempted from attendance for the period of eight continuous days. tinuous days.

All certificates of efficiency are issued subject to the recommendation of the Officer specially deputed to make the technical inspection of the division.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and fortytwo and of the Act of thirty-third and thirtyfourth years of Her Majesty chapter thirty-nine and of the Acts therein recited duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the eighth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words and figures following, that is to

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and forty-two, and

of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-nine and of the Acts therein recited, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an union of two contiguous benefices situate within the Metropolis, and within the City and Diocese of London, namely, the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Alban, Wood Street, with Saint Olave, Silver Street, and the benefice (being a rectory) of Saint Michael, Wood Street, with Saint Mary Staining, and for effecting certain other measures incidental to or arising out of such union.

"Whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Frederick, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, caused proposals for a Scheme for effecting an union of the said two benefices to be laid before us, which proposals were prepared under the seventh and eighth sections of the firstly mentioned Act and were approved by the said Frederick, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, and were assented to by the patrons of the two benefices to be affected thereby, that is to say, by the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, and by the Provost of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary of Eton near unto Windsor in the County of Buckingham, and the same College, who, are the alternate patrons of the said benefice and Rectory of Saint Alban, Wood Street, and Saint Olave, Silver Street, and by the Right Honourable Hardinge Stanley, Baron Halsbury, who as Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, was then alternate patron on behalf of Your Majesty, in right of the Crown, of the said benefice and rectory of Saint Michael, Wood Street, with Saint Mary Staining, and by the parishioners of Saint Michael, Wood Street, in vestry assembled, as the other alternate patrons of the lastly mentioned benefice and rectory, and the same proposals were also assented to, subject to certain modifications by the vestries of the parishes concerned, that is to say, by the joint vestry of the parishes of Saint Alban, Wood Street, and Saint Olave, Silver Street, and by the joint vestry of the parishes of Saint Michael, Wood Street, and Saint Mary Staining.

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to be expedient that the said proposed union of the said two benefices should be effected, and that such arrangements relating thereto, and to the other matters hereinafter contained should be made as

are hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Farrer, Baron Herschell, is now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain.

"And whereas the said Frederick, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, as such Bishop, and the patrons of the said two benefices and the vestries of the said parishes respectively are willing that the scheme for effecting the said union should embody certain modifications of the said proposals, and this present scheme does embody the same modifications accordingly, but therwise is based upon the said proposals
