The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of "The Ecclesiastical Commission Act 1863" duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the nineteenth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say :--

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of 'The Ecclesiastical Commission Act 1868,' section three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of part of the property of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Canterbury for certain property belonging to us.

"Whereas the lands tithes and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereanto annexed and marked A are a part of the property of the Dean and Chapter of Canterbury and the said dean and chapter have agreed that the said lands tithes and hereditaments shall be transferred to us in consideration of the transfer to them of certain lands tithes and hereditaments now belonging to us being the lands, tithes and hereditaments particularly described and set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked B.

"And whereas the terms of such transfer are in our opinion fair and reasonable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Canterbury and with the consent of the Right Honourable any other Act of Parliament.

and Most Reverend Edward White Archbishop of Canterbury as visitor of the said dean and chapter certified by their having hereunto affixed their respective corporate seals that upon and from the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any further conveyance or act in the law the lands, tithes and hereditaments described in the schedule hereunto annexed marked A with their appurtenances together with the benefit of the perpetual land tax, if any, charged thereon which has been redeemed shall subject always to the liabilities and charges to which the said lands, tithes and hereditaments are now specifically liable be transferred to us in the manner contemplated by the said Act and that we shall be entitled to the rents profits and proceeds thereof as from the sixth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four and that in consideration for such transfer to us as aforesaid the lands tithes and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked B with their appurtenances together with the benefit of the perpetual land tax, if any, charged thereon which has been redeemed shall subject always to the liabilities and charges to which the said lands, tithes and hereditaments are now specifically liable be transferred to the said dean and chapter in the manner contemplated by the said Act and that the said dean and chapter shall become entitled to the rents profits and proceeds thereof as from the said sixth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

LINCOLNSHIRE (PARTS OF HOLLAND) SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1894.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Con-tagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1894 not to apply to certain Districts.

The provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1894 dated the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfour shall not apply to either of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order, and the Order of the Board of the same date applying the provisions of the said Markets and Fairs Order to certain Districts and parts of Districts named in the Schedule to that Order shall be read and have effect as if neither of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order were included in the Schedule to that Order.

Movement of Swine. 2.--(1.) Swine shall not be moved by land or by water into or out of either of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(2.) Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to interfere with or apply to movement from any place in either of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order to any other place in either of the said Districts.

Movement of Fat Swine for Slaughter into Districts to which this Order applies.

3. Fat swine may for the purpose of being slaughtered be moved from a place not within either of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order such place not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place to premises within either of those Districts with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the District in which the place to which the swine are to be moved is situate in manner and under the conditions following-

- (i.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place from which and the premises to which the swine are to be moved for slaughter.
- (ii.) The swine, before the movement is commenced, shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad

thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

- (iii.) The swine after the movement has commenced shall not be exposed at any sale in England or Wales or Scotland.
- (iv.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article.
- (v.) The swine moved under this Article shall be slaughtered within four days after their arrival at the premises specified in the Licence; and the Local Authority of the District into which the swine are moved shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the specified premises and are slaughtered there within such four days.
- (vi.) The swine while being moved under this Article and until they are slaughtered shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all swine not marked for slaughter under this Order.

Movement of Fat Swine for Slaughter out of Districts to which this Order applies.

4. Fat swine may for the purpose of being slaughtered be moved from a place in either of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order such place not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place to premises not within either of those Districts with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the District in which the place to which the swine are to be moved is situate in manner and under the conditions following-

- (i.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place from which and the premises to which the swine are to be moved for slaughter.
- (ii.) The swine, before the movement is commenced, shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (iii.) The swine after the movement has commenced shall not be exposed at any sale in England or Wales or Scotland.
- (iv.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article.
- (v.) The swine moved under this Article shall be slaughtered within four days after their arrival at the premises specified in the Licence; and the Local Authority of the District into which the swine are moved shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the specified premises and are slaughtered there within such four days
- (vi.) The swine while being moved under this Article and until they are slaughtered shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all swine not marked for slaughter under this Order,

As to Movement of Swine by Railway through the Districts to which this Order applies.

5. For the purposes of this Order, swine shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order where they are moved through such Districts by line across the loins of each of the swine railway from a place outside such Districts to

another place outside such Districts without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or re-booked within such Districts.

Movement of Swine by Licence of Board.

6. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, swine may be moved in any circumstances with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Disinfection of Places and Things.

7.—(1.) The Local Authority of either of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order may make such Regulations as they think fit for the following purposes or any of them.

- For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any sty or other place which has been used for swine while affected with or suspected of swine-fever, and any utensil, pen, hurdle, or other thing used for or about such swine, and any wood-work with which such swine have come in contact, and for prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and such disinfection are to be effected :
- For requiring the owner, occupier or person in charge of such sty or other place to cleanse and disinfect such sty or other place and things at the expense of the Local Authority or at the expense of such owner, occupier or person in charge.

(2.) If the owner, occupier or person in charge of any such sty or place does any act in contravention of any such Regulation or fails in any respect to observe the same, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and where the occupier of such sty or place fails to cleanse and disinfect in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place and things to be cleansed and disinfected and to recover the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such owner, occupier or person in charge in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Slaughter in Swine-Fever.

8.—(1.) The Local Authority of either of the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order may, if they think fit, cause to be slaughtered—

- (i.) any swine affected with swine-fever; or
- (ii.) any swine being or having been in the same pig-sty or shed or in the same hord or otherwise in contact with swine affected with swine-fever.

(2.) The Local Authority shall, out of the local rate, pay compensation as follows for swine slaughtered under this Article:

(a.) Where the pig slaughtered was affected with swine-fever, the compensation shall be one half of its value immediately before it became so affected, but so that the compensation do not in any such case exceed four pounds:

(b.) In every other case the compensation shall be the value of the pig immediately before it was slaughtered, but so that the compensation do not in any such case exceed eight pounds.

Granting of Movement Licences.

9.—(1.) A Licence shall only be granted for movement of swine under this Order where in the opinion of the Local Authority or the person granting the Licence, as the case may be, the granting of such Licence is necessary or expedient.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee or other person selling the swine, or exposing the swine for sale, or by the purchaser thereof or by his agent, or by the auctioneer or other person conducting or licensed to hold the sale at which the swine are exposed, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Production of Licences ; Names and Addresses.

10.—(1.) Every person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Buard or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer

Offences.

11.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

(2.) If any person exposes a pig at any sale in England or Wales or Scotland in contravention of the provisions of Article 3 and Article 4 of this Order, the owner or consignee of such pig and the person exposing the same thereat, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878.

Interpretation.

12. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1894.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the nineteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfour.

Short Title.

14. This Order may be cited as THE LINCOLN-SHIRE (PARTS OF HOLLAND) SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1894.
