Arrivals from Black Sea Coast, between Russo-Turkish frontier and Agha, subject to twenty-four hours' observation at Sinope or Cavak."

ORDER OF THE LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL REARRANGING THE WARDS OF THE PARISH OF LAMBETH, APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

To the Vestry of the Parish of Lambeth, and all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 15 of the London

County Council (General Powers) Act, 1893, it is enacted that the London County Council may from time to time for the purpose of the elections of vestrymen, upon the application in writing of the vestry, or of not less than 500 rated householders of a parish mentioned in Schedules A and B to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, by order under their seal, rearrange the wards in such parish, and determine the number, extent, limits, and boundary lines of the new wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than 500 rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Council shall, in making any such rearrangement apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward have regard, as far as practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three; and it is also by the said Act enacted that such Order may contain such provisions with reference to the election, rotation, and retirement of vestrymen (whether elected prior or subsequently to the date of the Order) as the Council may think necessary for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Order.

And whereas the parish of Lambeth is a parish mentioned in Part I of Schedule A to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, the said parish was divided into eight wards.

And whereas the vestry of the said parish hath applied to the London County Council to rearrange the wards of the said parish pursuant to the provisions of the said 15th Section of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1893.

And whereas it appears from the rate books of the said parish, prepared in the month of October, 1893, that the said parish contains 43,957 rated householders, and that the rateable annual value of property in the said parish is £1,515,859.

Now the London County Council, having considered the said application, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward of the said parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the wards of the said parish of Lambeth be rearranged in manner following, that is to say, namely, that the said parish be redivided into eight wards, and that the eight wards be distinguished by the numbers and names mentioned in the first column of the undermentioned Schedule, that the extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said Schedule; and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule, that is, 120 vestrymen.

And the London County Council doth further order that this Order shall come into force for the purpose of the first election of vestrymen under the Local Government Act, 1894, and such election shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the District Auditors Act, 1879, it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act ;
And whereas the said Sidney Dominic Jerrold is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf for a period of one year from the 22nd day of August, 1894 :
Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, hereby certify the appointment of the said Sidney Dominic Jerrold accordingly, and hereby Order and Prescribe as follows :—
ARTICLE I.—It shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the following Authorities and their Officers ; namely,—
(1.) The Guardians of the Poor of the several

Unions named in the First Schedule to this Order.
(2.) The Overseers of the Poor of the several Parishes comprised in the said several Unions.
(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within one or more of the said Unions.
(4.) The Highway Boards for the Highway Districts named in the Second Schedule to this Order, such Districts being partly within one or more of the said several Unions.
(5.) The River Tees Port Sanitary Authority, the area within the jurisdiction of such Port Sanitary Authority being partly within one of the said Unions.
(6.) Such other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within one or more of the said Unions, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.
ARTICLE II.—The said District Auditor shall audit the said Accounts according to the provisions of the several Statutes and of the Orders issued by competent authority, in force for the time being in that behalf, and shall perform all such duties and exercise all such powers in connection with the audit of such Accounts as are prescribed and conferred by the said Statutes and Orders.
ARTICLE III.—The District in which the said Sidney Dominic Jerrold shall act as Auditor, and

which We hereby assign to him for the performance of the duties assigned to him by this Order, shall be termed "The North Yorkshire Audit District," and shall, until We otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions and Highway Districts named in the Schedules to this Order, the District of the Port Sanitary Authority named in paragraph (5) of Article I. of this Order, and the Districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of any such Authority as is mentioned in paragraph (6) of the said Article I.

ARTICLE IV.—In this Order—

THE DEVON AND TORQUAY (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1894.

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in
No. 26544. B

exercise of the powers in them vested under the Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE DEVON AND TORQUAY (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1894.

Extent.

2. This Order shall extend only to the Districts of the Local Authorities for the county of Devon and the borough of Torquay.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the twenty-third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

Interpretation.

4. In this Order—

Parasitic mange means parasitic mange of horses, asses, or mules:

The Act of 1878 means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878:

The Acts of 1878 to 1893 means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1893:

Inspector includes Veterinary Inspector:

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1878.

Extension of Definition of Animals and Disease.

5. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules shall be a disease for the purposes of the following Sections of the Act of 1878 (namely):

Section thirty-one of the Act of 1878 (notice of disease),

Section thirty-two of the Act of 1878 (Orders),
Section fifty of the Act of 1878 (powers of police), and

Section fifty-one of the Act of 1878 (powers of inspectors),

and of all other sections of that Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those Sections, including such Sections as provide for offences and procedure.

Notice of Disease.

6.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with parasitic mange, or suspected of being so affected, shall with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected, to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Duty of Inspector to act immediately.

7. An Inspector of the Local Authority on receiving in any manner whatsoever information of the supposed existence of parasitic mange, or having reasonable ground to suspect the existence of parasitic mange, shall proceed with all practicable speed to the place where such parasitic mange, according to the information received by him, exists, or is suspected to exist, and shall see that the provisions of this Order are complied with.

Treatment for Parasitic Mange.

8.—(1.) A person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with parasitic mange, shall treat that horse, ass, or

mule, or cause it to be treated, with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange.

(2.) If any person fails to comply with the requirements of this Article he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

9.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them :

(a.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of places used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange :

(b.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected :

(c.) For providing that such places, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things shall be cleansed and disinfected at the expense of the Local Authority, or of the owner, lessee, or occupier thereof.

(2.) If any person fails to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing to be cleansed and disinfected, and to recover the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such person summarily.

General Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

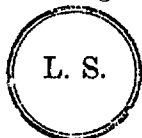
10.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board of Agriculture a copy of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board of Agriculture are satisfied on inquiry with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is of too restrictive a character, or otherwise objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Offences.

11. If anything is omitted to be done as regards the cleansing or disinfection of any place or thing in contravention of a Regulation of the Local Authority made under the authority of this Order, the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place, or the owner of the thing, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

To the Vestry of the parish of All Saints, Poplar,
and all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by section 15 of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1893, it is enacted that the London County Council may from time to time for the purpose of Elections of Vestrymen, upon the application in writing of the Vestry, or of not less than five hundred rated householders of a parish mentioned in Schedules A and B to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, by order under their seal, re-arrange the wards in such parish, and determine the number, extent, limits, and boundary lines of the new wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than five hundred rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Council shall, in making any such re-arrangement apportion among the several wards the number of Vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall in assigning the number of Vestrymen to each ward have regard, so far as practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of Vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three; and it is also by the said Act enacted that any such Order may contain such provisions with reference to the election, rotation, and retirement of Vestrymen (whether elected prior or subsequently to the date of the Order) as the Council may think necessary for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Order.

And whereas the parish of All Saints, Poplar, is a parish mentioned in Part I. of Schedule B to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855.

And whereas under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and of section 41 of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, the said

parish was in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty divided into three wards.

And whereas the vestry of the said parish hath applied to the London County Council to re-arrange the wards of the said parish pursuant to the provisions of the said 15th section of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1893.

And whereas it appears from the rate books of the said parish, prepared in the month of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, that the said parish contains eight thousand three hundred and sixty-four rated householders, and that the ratable annual value of property in the said parish is three hundred and four thousand five hundred and seventy-nine pounds.

Now the London County Council having considered the said application, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward of the said parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the wards of the said parish of All Saints, Poplar, be re-arranged in manner following, that is to say, that the said parish be divided into four instead of three wards, and that the four wards be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder written, that the extent, limits and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said Schedule, and that the number of Vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule.

And the London County Council doth further order that this Order shall come into force for the purpose of the first election of Vestrymen under the Local Government Act, 1894, and such election shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act.

To the Vestry of the Parish of Wandsworth, and all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, section 41, it is enacted that, when at any time, upon any account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament any of the parishes within the Metropolis not now divided into wards for the purpose of electing vestrymen shall be found to contain more than two thousand rated householders, it shall be lawful for the Metropolitan Board of Works, upon the application in writing of the vestry, or of not less than five hundred rated householders of the parish, to divide such parish into wards, and to determine and set out the number, extent, limits and boundary lines of such wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than five hundred rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Metropolitan Board shall apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward have regard, as far as in their judgment is practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward, as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three.

And whereas the parish of Wandsworth is within the limits of the Metropolis as defined by the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and is one of the parishes in Part 1 of Schedule B of

that Act, and was not at the passing of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, divided into wards.

And whereas the powers, duties, and liabilities of the Metropolitan Board of Works were transferred to the London County Council by the Local Government Act, 1888.

And whereas application has been made by the Vestry of the parish of Wandsworth, to us, the London County Council, to divide the said parish into wards, pursuant to the provisions of the said 41st section of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862.

And whereas it appears from the last account taken of the population by the Authority of Parliament that the said parish contains seven thousand four hundred and eighty rated householders.

And whereas it appears from the rate books of the said parish prepared in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three that the ratable annual value of property in the said parish was two hundred and seventy-six thousand nine hundred and thirteen pounds.

Now the London County Council having considered the said application, and having ascertained from the said last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament as contained in the census return for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one that the number of rated householders for the parish of Wandsworth was then seven thousand four hundred and eighty, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in the said

parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated as shown by the said rate books of the parish for one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the said parish of Wandsworth be divided into six wards, to be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first column of the

schedule hereunder written; that the extent, limits and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said schedule, and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said schedule.

Thames Conservancy.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Conservators of the River Thames propose to make the following Bye-law:—

BYE-LAW for the Amendment of the Rules and Bye-laws for the Regulation of the Navigation of the River Thames allowed by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council on the 5th day of February, 1872.

The Conservators of the River Thames in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by the Thames Acts, 1857 to 1883, and of every other authority them thereunto in anywise enabling, do order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

From and after the day when this Bye-law shall be allowed by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council Bye-law 16 of the Rules and Bye-laws for the Regulation of the Navigation of the River Thames allowed by Her Majesty in Council on the 5th day of February, 1872, shall be and the same is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof the following Bye-law shall take effect:—

16. All barges, boats, lighters, and other like craft navigating the river shall, when under way, have at least one competent man constantly on board for the navigation and management thereof, and all such craft of above 35 tons by measurement ascertained in accordance with the provisions of the Thames Watermen's and Lighter-

men's Act, 1893, or the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, as the case may be, shall, when under way, have one man in addition on board to assist in the navigation and management of the same, with the following exceptions:—When being towed by a steam-vessel or when being moved to and fro between any vessels or places a distance not exceeding 200 yards; and in case of non-compliance with this present Bye-law the harbour master may take charge of and remove such craft to such place as to such harbour master may seem fit, and the amount of the charges and expenses of taking charge thereof and of such removal shall be recoverable from the owner or owners or master thereof to the use of the conservators as provided by the Thames Conservancy Act, 1857.

Any person desirous of making any objection to or representation respecting such proposed Bye-law may do so in writing or otherwise, on or before Thursday, the 27th of September, 1894, by sending the same to or leaving or making the same up to and including the 21st instant, at the offices of the said Conservators, 41, Trinity-square, Tower Hill, London, and after that date at their new offices, Victoria Embankment, London, E.C.
