WHEREAS by "The Weights and Measures
Act, 1889," it is among other things
enacted that the Board of Trade shall from time
to time cause such new denominations of standards
for the measurement of electricity as appear to
them to be required for use in trade to be made
and duly verified.

And whereas it has been made to appear to the
Board of Trade that new denominations of
standards are required for use in trade based upon
the following units of electrical measurement,
viz.:—

1. The Ohm, which has the value 10^9 in terms
of the centimetre and the second of time and is
represented by the resistance offered to an unvary-
ing electric current by a column of mercury at
the temperature of melting ice 14.4521 grammes
in mass of a constant cross sectional area and of a
length of 106.3 centimetres.

2. The ampere, which has the value $\frac{1}{10}$ in terms
of the centimetre, the gramme and the second of
time and which is represented by the unvarying
electric current which when passed through a
solution of nitrate of silver in water in accordance
with the specification appended hereto and marked
A deposits silver at the rate of 0.001118 of a
gramme per second.

3. The Volt which has the value 10^8 in terms
of the centimetre the gramme and the second of

time, being the electrical pressure that if steadily
applied to a conductor whose resistance is one ohm
will produce a current of one ampere, and which
is represented by $6974 \left(\frac{1}{1.232}\right)$ of the electrical
pressure at a temperature of 15° C. between the
poles of the voltaic cell known as Clark's cell set
up in accordance with the specification appended
hereto and marked B.

And whereas they have caused the said new
denominations of standards to be made and duly
verified.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the
power vested in Her by the said Act, by and with
the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to
approve the several denominations of standards set
forth in the schedule hereto as new denominations
of standards for electrical measurement.

SCHEDULE.

I.—Standard of Electrical Resistance.

A standard of electrical resistance denominated
one Ohm being the resistance between the copper
terminals of the instrument marked "Board of
Trade Ohm Standard Verified 1894" to the
passage of an unvarying electrical current when
the coil of insulated wire forming part of the
aforesaid instrument and connected to the afore-
said terminals is in all parts at a temperature of
 15.4 C.

II.—Standard of Electrical Current.

A standard of electrical current denominated
one ampere being the current which is passing in
and through the coils of wire forming part of the
instrument marked "Board of Trade Ampere
Standard Verified 1894" when on reversing the
current in the fixed coils the change in the forces
acting upon the suspended coil in its sighted
position is exactly balanced by the force exerted
by gravity in Westminster upon the iridio-platinum
weight marked A and forming part of the said
instrument.

III.—Standard of Electrical Pressure.

A standard of electrical pressure denominated
one Volt being one hundredth part of the pressure
which when applied between the terminals forming
part of the instrument marked "Board of Trade
Volt Standard Verified 1894," causes that rotation
of the suspended portion of the instrument which
is exactly measured by the coincidence of the
sighting wire with the image of the fiducial
mark A before and after application of the pres-
sure and with that of the fiducial mark B during

the application of the pressure, these images being produced by the suspended mirror and observed by means of the eyepiece.

In the use of the above standards the limits of accuracy attainable are as follows:—

For the Ohm, within one hundredth part of one per cent.

For the Ampere, within one tenth part of one per cent.

For the Volt, within one tenth part of one per cent.

The coils and instruments referred to in this schedule are deposited at the Board of Trade Standardising Laboratory, 8, Richmond-terrace, Whitehall, London.

SPECIFICATIONS referred to in the foregoing Order in Council.

SPECIFICATION A.

In the following specification the term silver voltameter means the arrangement of apparatus by means of which an electric current is passed through a solution of nitrate of silver in water. The silver voltameter measures the total electrical quantity which has passed during the time of the experiment, and by noting this time the time average of the current, or if the current has been kept constant, the current itself can be deduced.

In employing the silver voltameter to measure currents of about one ampere the following arrangements should be adopted. The kathode on which the silver is to be deposited should take the form of a platinum bowl not less than 10 centimetres in diameter, and from 4 to 5 centimetres in depth.

The anode should be a plate of pure silver some 30 square centimetres in area and 2 or 3 millimetres in thickness.

This is supported horizontally in the liquid near the top of the solution by a platinum wire passed through holes in the plate at opposite corners. To prevent the disintegrated silver which is formed on the anode from falling on to the kathode, the anode should be wrapped round with pure filter paper, secured at the back with sealing wax.

The liquid should consist of a neutral solution of pure silver nitrate, containing about 15 parts by weight of the nitrate to 85 parts of water.

The resistance of the voltameter changes somewhat as the current passes. To prevent these changes having too great an effect on the current, some resistance besides that of the voltameter should be inserted in the circuit. The total metallic resistance of the circuit should not be less than 10 ohms.

Method of making a Measurement.

The platinum bowl is washed with nitric acid and distilled water, dried by heat, and then left to cool in a desiccator. When thoroughly dry it is weighed carefully.

It is nearly filled with the solution, and connected to the rest of the circuit by being placed on a clean copper support to which a binding screw is attached. This copper support must be insulated.

The anode is then immersed in the solution so as to be well covered by it and supported in that position; the connexions to the rest of the circuit are made.

Contact is made at the key, noting the time of contact. The current is allowed to pass for not less than half-an-hour, and the time at which contact is broken is observed. Care must be taken that the clock used is keeping correct time during this interval.

The solution is now removed from the bowl

and the deposit is washed with distilled water and left to soak for at least six hours. It is then rinsed successively with distilled water and absolute alcohol and dried in a hot-air bath at a temperature of about 160° C. After cooling in a desiccator it is weighed again. The gain in weight gives the silver deposited.

To find the current in amperes, this weight, expressed in grammes, must be divided by the number of seconds during which the current has been passed, and by 0.001118.

The result will be the time-average of the current, if during the interval the current has varied.

In determining by this method the constant of an instrument the current should be kept as nearly constant as possible, and the readings of the instrument observed at frequent intervals of time. These observations give a curve from which the reading corresponding to the mean current (time-average of the current), can be found. The current, as calculated by the voltameter, corresponds to this reading.

SPECIFICATION B.

ON THE PREPARATION OF THE CLARK CELL.

Definition of the Cell.

The cell consists of zinc or an amalgam of zinc with mercury and of mercury in a neutral saturated solution of zinc sulphate and mercurous sulphate in water, prepared with mercurous sulphate in excess.

Preparation of the Materials.

1. *The Mercury.*—To secure purity it should be first treated with acid in the usual manner, and subsequently distilled in vacuo.

2. *The Zinc.*—Take a portion of a rod of pure redistilled zinc, solder to one end a piece of copper wire, clean the whole with glass paper or a steel burnisher, carefully removing any loose pieces of the zinc. Just before making up the cell dip the zinc into dilute sulphuric acid, wash with distilled water, and dry with a clean cloth or filter paper.

3. *The Mercurous Sulphate.*—Take mercurous sulphate, purchased as pure, mix with it a small quantity of pure mercury, and wash the whole thoroughly with cold distilled water by agitation in a bottle; drain off the water, and repeat the process at least twice. After the last washing, drain off as much of the water as possible.

4. *The Zinc Sulphate Solution.*—Prepare a neutral saturated solution of pure ("pure recrystallised") zinc sulphate by mixing in a flask distilled water with nearly twice its weight of crystals of pure zinc sulphate, and adding zinc oxide in the proportion of about 2% by weight of the zinc sulphate crystals to neutralise any free acid. The crystals should be dissolved with the aid of gentle heat, but the temperature to which the solution is raised should not exceed 30° C. Mercurous sulphate treated as described in 3 should be added in the proportion of about 12% by weight of the zinc sulphate crystals to neutralise any free zinc oxide remaining, and the solution filtered, while still warm, into a stock bottle. Crystals should form as it cools.

5. *The Mercurous Sulphate and Zinc Sulphate Paste.*—Mix the washed mercurous sulphate with the zinc sulphate solution, adding sufficient crystals of zinc sulphate from the stock bottle to ensure saturation, and a small quantity of pure mercury. Shake these up well together to form a paste of the consistence of cream. Heat the paste, but not above a temperature of 30° C. Keep the paste for an hour at this temperature, agitating it from time to time, then allow it to cool; continue

to shake it occasionally while it is cooling. Crystals of zinc sulphate should then be distinctly visible, and should be distributed throughout the mass; if this is not the case add more crystals from the stock bottle, and repeat the whole process.

This method ensures the formation of a saturated solution of zinc and mercurous sulphates in water.

To set up the Cell.

The cell may conveniently be set up in a small test tube of about 2 centimetres diameter, and 4 or 5 centimetres deep. Place the mercury in the bottom of this tube, filling it to a depth of say 5 centimetres. Cut a cork about 5 centimetres thick to fit the tube; at one side of the cork bore a hole through which the zinc rod can pass tightly; at the other side bore another hole for the glass tube which covers the platinum wire; at the edge of the cork cut a nick through which the air can pass when the cork is pushed into the tube. Wash the cork thoroughly with warm water, and leave it to soak in water for some hours before use. Pass the zinc rod about 1 centimetre through the cork.

Contact is made with the mercury by means of a platinum wire about No. 22 gauge. This is protected from contact with the other materials of the cell by being sealed into a glass tube. The ends of the wire project from the ends of the tube; one end forms the terminal, the other end and a portion of the glass tube dip into the mercury.

Clean the glass tube and platinum wire carefully, then heat the exposed end of the platinum red hot, and insert it in the mercury in the test tube, taking care that the whole of the exposed platinum is covered.

Shake up the paste and introduce it without contact with the upper part of the walls of the test tube, filling the tube above the mercury to a depth of rather more than 1 centimetre.

Then insert the cork and zinc rod, passing the glass tube through the hole prepared for it. Push the cork gently down until its lower surface is nearly in contact with the liquid. The air will thus be nearly all expelled, and the cell should be left in this condition for at least 24 hours before sealing, which should be done as follows.

Melt some marine glue until it is fluid enough to pour by its own weight, and pour it into the test-tube above the cork, using sufficient to cover completely the zinc and soldering. The glass tube containing the platinum wire should project some way above the top of the marine glue.

The cell may be sealed in a more permanent manner by coating the marine glue, when it is set, with a solution of sodium silicate, and leaving it to harden.

The cell thus set up may be mounted in any desirable manner. It is convenient to arrange the mounting so that the cell may be immersed in a water bath up to the level of, say, the upper surface of the cork. Its temperature can then be determined more accurately than is possible when the cell is in air.

In using the cell sudden variations of temperature should as far as possible be avoided.

The form of the vessel containing the cell may be varied. In the H Form, the zinc is replaced by an amalgam of 10 parts by weight of zinc to 90 of mercury. The other materials should be prepared as already described. Contact is made with the amalgam in one leg of the cell, and with the mercury in the other, by means of platinum wires sealed through the glass.

MILLBROOK.—Forthwith and entirely in Freemantle Church Burial-ground in the parish of Millbrook, in the county of Southampton, except as follows:—

In such partly walled graves and earthen graves as are now existing, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those interred therein at the date of the Order as can be buried at or below that depth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the fourth day of October next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before the said fourth day of October. *C. WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intitled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued

subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by another Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has made a representation stating that he is of opinion that the Order of Her Majesty in Council of the thirteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, in so far as it affects burials in the parish church and churchyard of Ashburton, in the county of Devon, should be varied, and that the following directions should be substituted for those contained in the said Order, with respect to burials in the said church and churchyard, viz. :-

That burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Ashburton, in the county of Devon, and in the old churchyard within five yards of the church; and also in the rest of the old churchyard, except as follows:—

In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the fourth day of October next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation, one month before the said fourth day of October.

The time passed in partial quarantine abroad in accordance with the above-mentioned Rule and Articles 36 and 37 of the Law and Royal Order of September 10, 1892, shall be taken into account.

Arrivals admitted into Spanish ports, previous to publishing the Royal Orders declaring foul or dangerous the places they come from, shall be admitted to free pratique in the ports they subsequently call at, whatever may be their cargo.

MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894.

Draft Rules of the Supreme Court for the purpose of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.

THE following draft Rules are published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893, by order of the Authority to make Rules under the Supreme Court of Judicature Acts. Copies may be obtained from the Queen's Printer.

Note.

[The Joint Committee of the two Houses on Statute Law Revision, to which the Merchant Shipping Consolidation Bill was referred, authorized the omission of certain detailed provisions as to practice from the Bill on the ground that they dealt with matters which should be provided for by Rules of Court, and should not be included in the statute itself.

The determination of the Division of the High Court by which the jurisdiction with respect to various matters under the Bill is to be exercised has also been left to Rules of Court.

The first of the following Rules represents the present law with regard to the exercise of the jurisdiction, while the other two reproduce the existing provisions with regard to the matters which the Committee decided should be dealt with by Rules, with such alterations only as are necessary to make them consistent with modern practice.

There has been no application under the provisions reproduced in the Rules dealing with the repayment of money on volunteering into the Navy for the last twenty years, the last application being in June, 1874, but the power to apply still exists, and the procedure is therefore reproduced.]

General Jurisdiction under Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.

1. The jurisdiction of the High Court under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (in these Rules referred to as "the Act"), with the exception of that under sections twenty-eight, thirty, and five hundred and four of the Act, shall be assigned to the Probate, Divorce, and Admiralty Division.

Application under Section 30 of Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.

2. Any application under section thirty of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, may be made by summons or otherwise, and either ex parte or upon service of notice on any person as the Court may direct.

Application as to Excess of Wages paid on Seamen Volunteering into the Navy.

3.—(1.) Any application to the High Court under section one hundred and ninety-seven of the Act shall be made to the Admiralty Registrar, and shall be in such form, and shall be accompanied by such documents and by such statements, whether on oath or otherwise, as the President of the Probate, Divorce, and Admiralty Division directs.

(2.) The Registrar shall, on receiving the application, give written notice thereof and of the sum claimed to the Admiralty, and shall proceed to examine the application, and shall, if necessary, apply to the Registrar-General of Shipping and Seamen to produce any papers in his possession relating thereto, and may call for further evidence.

(3.) If the Registrar considers that the whole of the claim is just, he shall give a certificate accordingly, but if he considers that the claim or any part thereof is not just, he shall give notice of his opinion, in writing, under his hand to the person making the application, or his Solicitor or Agent.

(4.) If within sixteen days from the giving of the last-mentioned notice the person to whom the notice is given does not cause to be left at the Admiralty Registry a written notice demanding that the application be referred to the Judge, the Registrar shall finally decide thereon, and certify accordingly.

(5.) If the notice is left as aforesaid, the application shall stand referred to the Judge in chambers, and his decision thereon shall be final, and the Registrar shall certify the same accordingly.

(6.) The Judge and Registrar shall in any proceeding under these Rules have full power to administer oaths, and to exercise all the ordinary powers of the Court, as in any other proceeding within its jurisdiction; and the Judge or Registrar (as the case may be) may, if he thinks fit, allow for the costs of any such proceeding any sum not exceeding five pounds for each seaman in respect of whom application is made; and that sum shall be added to the sum authorized to be repaid under the Act, and shall be certified by the Registrar accordingly.

4. These Rules may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court (Merchant Shipping), 1894.
