THE Queen has been pleased to approve of the re-appointment of Louis Antoine Aimé de Verteuil, Esq., C.M.G., George Townsend Fenwick, Charles Leotaud, and Eugène Cipriani, Esqrs, to be Unofficial Members of the Legislative Council of the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago.

Whitehall, August 27, 1894.

THE Queen has been pleased to order a Congé d'Élire to pass the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Wells to elect a Bishop of the See of Bath and Wells, the same being void by the death of the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor Arthur Charles Hervey (commonly called Lord Arthur Charles Hervey), late Bishop thereof; and Her Majesty has been pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Right Reverend Father in God Doctor George Wyndham Kennion, now Bishop of Adelaide, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Bath and Wells.

Whitehall, August 27, 1894.

THE Queen has been pleased to give and grant unto Lieutenant-General Henry Kent (retired) Her Majesty's Royal licence and authority that he may accept and wear the Insignia of the Imperial Order of the Medjidieh of the First Class, which His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey has been pleased to confer upon him as a promotion in that order in recognition of his services whilst actually and entirely employed beyond Her Majesty's Dominions in the service of His Imperial Majesty.

Westminster, August 25, 1894.

THIS day the Lords being met a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to*
