And whereas it is expedient to suspend, as hereinafter mentioned, the operation of the said Article as regards the Medical Officer for the Workhouse of the said Tonbridge Union:

Now, therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order that the operation of the said Article 182 of the above-cited Order shall, with respect to the Medical Officer for the time being for the Workhouse of the said Tonbridge Union, be suspended until We, by an Order under our Seal of Office, shall otherwise direct.

**GULF OF BOTHNIA—SWEDISH SHORE.**

*Pitea Approach—Amended Particulars of Shoal South-east of Sandö.*

THE Swedish Government has given notice, dated 1st August, 1894, that a recent examination of Geten Shoal shows that it extends a third of a mile S.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E. (S. 62° E.) from its previously charted extreme; the least depth found on the extension being sixteen feet, with an uneven rocky bottom.

The black and white spar buoy previously
