PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by section twenty-six of "The Pluralities Act 1838" after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, "chapelries, and other places or districts may be "separated from the parishes or mother churches "to which they belong, with great advantage, "and places altogether extra - parochial may "in some instances with advantage be annexed "to parishes or districts to which they are con-"tiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for "ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his "own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop "of the Province, or when the Bishop of any "diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop "that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or "district within the diocese of such Archbishop, " or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may "be, may be advantageously separated from any "parish or mother church, and either be consti-"tuted a separate benefice by itself or be united "to any other parish to which it may be more "conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining "tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a "separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-"parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be "constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said "Archbishop for his consideration) describing the "mode in which it appears to him that the altera-"tion may best be effected, and how the changes "consequent on such alteration in respect to "ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, "and payments, and in respect to patronage and "rights to pews, may be made with justice to all "parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by "such alteration shall consent in writing under "his or their hands to such scheme, or to such "modification thereof as the said Archbishop may "approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full "consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any "such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall

"certify the same and such consent as aforesaid. "by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it "shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to "make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury hath pursuant to the enactment aforesaid made a report dated the fifteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four to Her Majesty in Council in the words and figures following, that is to say: -

" To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

" I the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

"That there is within the county of Kent and my diocese of Canterbury the parish and benefice or rectory of Betteshanger with the rectory of Ham, the said parish of Betteshanger-with-Ham containing a population of one hundred and thirtythree and the net annual value of the benefice being two hundred and forty-three pounds or thereabouts, which said rectories of Betteshanger and Ham were united and became one benefice under an Order of Your Majesty in Council gazetted on the third day of October one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight.

"That there is also within the said county of Kent and my diocese of Canterbury the parish and benefice or vicarage of Eastry with a population of one thousand three hundred and forty-three, and of the annual value of two hundred and twenty-

eight pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also within the said county and my said diocese the parish and benefice or rectory of Northbourne with a population of eight hundred or thereabouts and of the annual value of one hundred and sixty-four pounds or thereabouts.

"The patronage of the said benefice of Betteshanger-with-Ham belongs to the Right Honourable Walter Henry Baron Northbourne and the Reverend John Worthington Bliss B.A. is the

present incumbent of the said benefice.

"The patronage of the said benefice or vicarage of Eastry and also the patronage of the said benefice or rectory of Northbourne belongs to me in right of my Archbishoprick and the Reverend Charles Dudley Lampen is the present incumbent of the said vicarage of Eastry and the Reverend George Litting is the present incumbent of the said rectory of Northbourne.

"There is a church in the parish of Betteshanger having accommodation for one hundred and twenty persons and there is also a church in the parish of Ham having accommodation for eighty persons.

"The portion of the parish of Eastry which is verged red on the map or ordnance sheet hereto annexed and known as 'Updown' is contiguous to the parish of Betteshanger and has a population of thirty and the portion of the said parish of Eastry which is verged green on the map or ordnance sheet hereto annexed and known as Ham Cottages' is contiguous to the parish of Ham and has a population of thirty or thereabouts the said portion or district known as Updown lies nearer to and is more conveniently situated with regard to Betteshanger Church than Eastry Church as is also the district known as Ham Cottages with regard to Eastry Church and Ham Church respectively and for a long period the parts of Eastry which are proposed to be annexed to Betteshanger and Ham respectively have been under the spiritual care and oversight of the Rector of Betteshanger-with-Ham by arrangement and the residents have attended his ministrations.

"The portion or district of the parish of Northbourne which is verged purple on the map or ordnance sheet hereto annexed is contiguous to the parish of Betteshanger having a population of about one hundred and thirty the said portion or district lies nearer to and is more conveniently situated for the attendance of the inhabitants at Betteshanger church than at Northbourne church and has by a voluntary arrangement been under the spiritual charge of the said rector of Betteshangerwith-Ham for nearly thirty years: the inhabitants attend Betteshanger church and consider it their proper place of worship.

"That it therefore appears to me that under the provisions of 'The Pluralities Act 1838' the portion or district of the said parish of Eastry verged red and green and the portion or district of the parish of Northbourne verged purple on the map hereto annexed may with advantage to the interests of religion be separated from the said parishes and benefices of Eastry and Northbourne respectively and be united and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish or benefice of

Betteshanger-with-Ham.

"That in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the said Act of Parliament I have prepared the following scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes tithe rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto of myself as patron of Eastry and Northbourne, of Lord Northbourne as patron of Betteshanger-with-Ham and of the Reverend Charles Dudley Lampen as vicar of Eastry the Reverend George Litting as rector of Northbourne and the Reverend John Worthington Bliss as rector of Betteshangerwith-Ham I do certify by this my report to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make an Order for carrying such scheme into effect."

And whereas the scheme and consents referred to in the said Archbishop's report, are in the words and figures following:-

"The SCHEME above referred to.

"That there shall be separated from the said

annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish and united benefice of Betteshanger-with-Ham All that part of the said parish of Eastry which is bounded by an imaginary line starting from the corner of the parish boundary in the middle of the road at the south end of the footpath or listway forming such parish boundary between Eastry and the detached portion of Ham and running thence in a north-westerly direction along the said road to the middle of the Roman road near the pond called Buttsole thence southward along the said Roman or Dover road to the point where such road crosses the boundary line between the parishes of Eastry and Tilmanstone thence eastward along such boundary to the point where the said boundary line of Eastry parish joins the boundary line of Betteshanger parish at the corner of Longlands plantation and thence northward along the boundary line between Eastry and Betteshanger and the detached portion of Ham back to the point started from. And there shall also be separated from the said parish and benefice of Eastry and united and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish or united benefice of Betteshanger-with-Ham all that part or parts of the said parish of Eastry which are bounded by an imaginary line starting from Ham Bridge and running in a southwesterly direction in a straight fine to the north rear corner of the gardens of three cottages known as Ham Cottages thence along the rear line of the said gardens to the road leading from Ham Bridge to Ham House and along the parish boundary line in the middle of the road to the point where the footpath to Eastry joins the said road thence along the said footpath in a westerly direction to its junction with a footpath running south to Ham House thence along this second path back to the road and parish boundary and thence north-eastward along such road back to Ham Bridge the point started from, but so nevertheless that the said portion verged green shall be considered as attached to the parish of Ham and the said portion verged red as attached to the parish of Betteshanger.

"That there shall be separated from the said parish and benefice of Northbourne and united and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said united benefice of Betteshanger-with-Ham All that part of the said parish of Northbourne which is bounded by an imaginary line starting from the parish boundary line in the middle of the road at the junction of four roads immediately north of Betteshanger Cottages and running thence in a south-easterly direction to the road leading from West-street to Northbourne National Schools thence following the course of such lastmentioned road southward (to its junction with another road which runs northward past the Corn Mill) thence westward along a private road on the north side of the Mill House property and (from the point where such private road turns in a north-westerly direction to Little Cherrygarden Farm) in a straight line to the southern corner of the grounds surrounding the house known as Little Betteshanger and thence in the same straight line in a westerly direction to the boundary line between the parishes of Northbourne and Betteshanger and thence first northward and then eastward following such parish boundary along the road past the parish church of Betteshanger and Cæsar's Camp Plantation back to the point started from. Such portion of the parish of Northbourne is verged purple on the map hereto

annexed. "That the said separated portions of the said

parish and benefice of Eastry and united and I parishes of Eastry and Northbourne shall be

subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said parish of Betteshanger-with-Ham and the incumbent of the said parish of Betteshangerwith-Ham shall have exclusive cure of souls.

"That the inhabitants of the said separated portion of the said parish of Northbourne and also of the said separated portion of the said parish of Eastry which is to be considered as attached to Betteshanger shall be entitled in common with the parishioners of Betteshanger to accommodation in the church of such parish of Betteshanger and the inhabitants of that part of the separated portion of Eastry which is to be considered as attached to Ham shall be entitled in common with the parishioners of Ham to accommodation in the church of Ham parish and such inhabitants of such separated portions of Eastry and Northbourne respectively shall not be entitled to accommodation in any other church or chapel except nevertheless such person or persons (if any) who may possess a legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in any other church or chapel and who may not be willing to relinquish or give up the same.

"That all fees offerings and payments for churchings marriages burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the churches of the said parish of Betteshanger-with-Ham and all such other ecclesiastical dues offeringsand emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said separated portions of Eastry and Northbourne shall belong to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Betteshanger-

with-Ham.

"That no alteration shall be made in regard to the glebe land tithes or tithe rent-charges of the said parishes of Eastry and Northbourne.

"That no alteration shall be made in regard to

the patronage of any of the said benefices.

"Given under my hand this fifteenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and ninety-" Edw. Cantuar.

" CONSENTS.

"The Right Honourable and Most Reverend Edward White by Divine Providence Archbishop of Canterbury the patron or person entitled in right of his Archbishoprick to present or collate to the vicarage of Eastry and the rectory of Northbourne if the same were now vacant the Right Honourable Walter Henry Baron Northbourne the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Betteshanger-with-Ham if the same were now vacant the Reverend Charles Dudley Lampen the incumbent of the said benefice or vicarage of Eastry the Reverend George Litting incumbent of the benefice or rectory of Northbourne and the Reverend John Worthington Bliss M.A. incumbent of the benefice of Betteshanger-with-Ham hereby signify their consents to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

HEREAS by section sixteen of "The Pluralities Act, 1838," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear "to the Archbishop of the province, with respect "to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be "represented to him by the Bishop of any to diocese, or by the Bishops of any two "dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that "one or more benefice or benefices, and one or "more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, "vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese " or dioceses, being either in the same parish or "contiguous to each other, and of which the "aggregate population shall not exceed one "thousand five hundred persons, may, with " advantage to the interests of religion, be united "into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the " province shall inquire into the circumstances of "the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear " to him that such union may be usefully made, " and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that " the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sine-" cure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages " respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such " consent being signified in writing under the hands " of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop " shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry "and consent to Her Majesty as hereinafter " directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, " a statement in writing of the facts, and in other "cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid repre-" sentation to be affixed on or near the principal " outer door of the church, or in some public and " conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinc-" cure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any " person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, " may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing " under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the " said Archbishop, against such union; and if no " sufficient cause be shown within such time, the " said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and con-" sent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and "thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in "Council to make and issue an Order or Orders 46 for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or " rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, "with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes " only."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the fourteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words following, that is to say :-

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of All England and Metropolitan do hereby certify

to Your Majesty in Council:-

"That the Right Reverend Edward Henry Lord Bishop of Exeter as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Saint Paul and the rectory of All Hallows Goldsmith-street both in the city of Exeter having represented unto Us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion

be united into one benefice We inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to Us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Saint Peter in Exeter being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said benefices of Saint Paul (now vacant) and of All Hallows Goldsmith-street (if the same were now vacant) consent to the proposed

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council We caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to Us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Exeter our inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto the consents in writing of the patrons and a copy of the representation and notice before

mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And We do hereby certify the inquiry and consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the rectory of Saint Paul in the city and diocese of Exeter and the rectory of All Hallows, Goldsmith-street in the same city and diocese shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only. HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of "The Ecclesiastical Commission Act 1868" duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the nineteenth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words and figures following, that is to "We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of 'The Ecclesiastical Commission Act 1868,' section three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of a part of the property of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Norwich for certain property belonging to us.

Whereas the lands and hereditaments particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked A are a part of the property of the Dean and Chapter of Norwich and the said Dean and Chapter have agreed that the said lands and hereditaments shall be transferred to us in consideration of the transfer to them of certain tithe rent-charges now belonging to us being the tithe rent-charges particularly described and set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed

"And whereas the terms of such transfer are in our opinion fair and reasonable.

" Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Norwich and with the consent of the Right Reverend John Bishop of Norwich as visitor of the said dean and chapter certified by their having hereunto affixed their respective corporate seals that upon and from the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any further conveyance or act in the law the lands and hereditaments described in the schedule hereunto annexed marked A with their appurtenances together with the benefit of the perpetual land tax, if any, charged thereon which has been redeemed shall subject always to the liabilities and charges to which the said lands and hereditaments are now specifically liable be transferred to us in the manner contemplated by the said Act and that we shall be entitled to the rents profits and proceeds thereof as from the sixth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four and that in consideration for such transfer to us as aforesaid the tithe rentcharges particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed and marked B together with the benefit of so much of the perpetual land tax charged thereon as has been redeemed shall subject always to the liabilities and charges to which the said tithe rent-charges are now specifically liable be transferred to the said dean and chapter in the manner contemplated by the said Act and that the said dean and chapter shall become entitled to the rents profits and proceeds thereof as from the said sixth day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid in conformity with the provisions of the said recited Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the second day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

figures following, that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the constitution of a new archdeaconry within the diocese of Ripon and the endowment of the said new archdeaconry in the manner hereinafter mentioned, and also with respect to the rural deaneries or some of them which are within the same diocese.

"Whereas there are at present within the said diocese of Ripon two archdeaconries and no more to wit the archdeaconry of Craven and the archdeaconry of Richmond.

"And whereas in pursuance of the hereinbefore lastly-mentioned Act a statutory schedule setting forth the portions or divisions of the said diocese of Ripon which at the time of the passing of the same Act were accounted and held to be the rural deaneries within the said two archdeaconries of Craven and of Richmond respectively has been duly deposited in the registry of the same diocese.

"And whereas under the provisions of an Order

of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the twelfth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-first day of the same month the rural deanery of Ripon was divided into two rural deaneries one of which was called the rural deanery of Ripon and the other the rural deanery of Masham.

"And whereas under the provisions of another Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the seventeenth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight and published in the London Gazette on the eighteenth day of the same month the diocese of Wakefield was founded, and comprised a portion of the diocese of Ripon aforesaid, such portion including (inter alia) a part of the rural deanery of Wakefield in the archdeaconry of Craven aforesaid.

"And whereas certain cures, ten in number, namely, the cures of Rothwell, Lofthouse, Middleton, Oulton, Woodlesford, Swillington, Garforth, Kippax, Allerton Bywater, and Methley, were not included with the rest of the rural deanery of Wakefield, in the said diocese of Wakefield.

"And whereas the same ten cures still remain a part of the archdeaconry of Craven aforesaid.

"And whereas the Right Reverend William Boyd Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon has proposed to us and has represented to us that it is in his opinion desirable that a new archdeaconry within the same diocese should be constituted and should be taken partly out of the said archdeaconry of Craven and partly out of the said archdeaconry of Richmond and should comprise and consist of those portions of the said two archdeaconries of Craven and of Richmond respectively which are described in the schedule to this scheme annexed, and that the said new archdeaconry should be endowed in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said William Boyd, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon has further proposed and represented to us that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to the rural deaneries or some of them within the said diocese are desirable and should be carried into effect.

"And whereas the said arrangements involve certain alterations of the areas of certain of the rural deaneries within the said diocese, and provide for the inclusion of the ten cures hereinbefore mentioned within the rural deanery of Whitkirk in the said Archdeaconry of Craven.

"And whereas it is a part of the proposals made to us as aforesaid by the said Bishop that the Reverend Arthur Thornhill Waugh, Clerk in Holy Orders and Canon Residentiary in the cathedral church of the said diocese of Ripon, shall be the first archdencon of the said proposed archdeaconry and that the canonry residentiary so held at present by the said Arthur Thornhill Waugh shall be annexed to the same archdeaconry as the endowment thereaf, and he the said Arthur Thornhill Waugh as the incumbent of the same canonry has consented to such annexation.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said proposals of the said Bishop should be carried into effect in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said William Boyd Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon (in testimony whereof he hath set his hand and his episcopal seal to this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying

this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order there shall be constituted within the said diocese of Ripon one new archdeaconry to be called 'The Archdeaconry of Ripon' to comprise and consist of the rural deaneries (and of the parishes cures and churches therein contained) now portions of the said present archdeaconry of Craven and of the said archdeaconry of Richmond respectively the names of which rural deaneries are set down in order under the name of the said archdeaconry of Ripon in the schedule to this scheme annexed.

"And we further recommend and propose that as from the day aforesaid the said archdeaconry of Craven and the said archdeaconry of Richmond shall comprise and consist of those rural deaneries the names of which are set down in order under the name of each of the said two archdeaconries respectively in the schedule to this scheme annexed, and that the name which in the said schedule is given to any rural deanery shall be the name thereof and that every parish or cure or church the name of which is set down in numbered order in the first column of the said schedule under the names of either of the said two archdeaconries respectively and under the name of any one specified rural deanery in either of the said archdeaconries respectively shall belong to and be and form a part of the archdeaconry and of the rural deanery under the respective names of which it may appear as aforesaid and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the archdeacon of the same archdeaconry and of the rural dean of the same rural deanery and shall not belong to or be or form a part of any other archdeaconry or rural deanery nor be subject to the jurisdiction or authority of any other archdeacon or rural dean the intent of these our recommendations and proposals being that the said schedule to this scheme annexed shall as to the first column thereof be (in so far as the same legally can or may be) as from the day aforesaid substituted for the hereinbefore mentioned statutory schedule of rural deaneries within the said diocese of Ripon as aforesaid, and for the schedules referred to in the said Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the twelfth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven as aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose with the consent of the said Bishop of Ripon testified as aforesaid and with the consent of the said Arthur Thornhill Waugh (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) that upon and from the day aforesaid the said canonry residentiary in the cathedral church of the said diocese of Ripon as aforesaid now held by the said Arthur Thornhill Waugh as aforesaid shall be permanently annexed and united to the said new archdeaconry of Ripon, and be held by the archdeacon of the same archdeaconry for the time being, so that every future archdeacon of the same archdeaconry of Ripon shall as such archdeacon be entitled to installation to the said canonry and so long as he shall remain such archdeacon shall be invested with, and shall hold and enjoy all the rights privileges and emoluments of a canon residentiary of the said cathedral church of the diocese of Ripon as aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid or any of them under or by virtue of the said Acts or of a ny of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty,

chapter one hundred and thirteen and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her Majesty chapter eighty-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the second day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Your Majesty chapter eighty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the incomes of the benefices of Rawmarsh, Christ Church Parkgate, and Saint Thomas Kilnhurst all in the county of York and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said three benefices of Rawmarsh, Christ Church Parkgate and Saint Thomas Kilnhurst, is vested in Your Majesty Your heirs and successors in right of the Crown, and such right of patronage and presentation is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Farrer, Baron Herschell, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as such patron as aforesaid, has represented to us and we are of opinion that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the consolidated chapelry or new parish of Christ Church, Parkgate, and within the consolidated chapelry or new parish of Saint Thomas, Kilnhurst by means of that apportionment of the incomes of the said three benefices which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas each of the said three benefices is now full of a clerk.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William Dalrym ple, Archbishop of York, Primate of England and Metropolitan, as Bishop of the Diocese within which each of the said three benefices is situate (in testimony whereof the said William Dalrymple, Archbishop of York has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal) and with the consent of the said Farrer, Baron Herschell acting on behalf of Your Majesty as such patron as aforesaid of each of the said three benefices (in testimony whereof the said Farrer, Baron Herschell has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consents of the Reverend Theophilus Percy Ring, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Rawmarsh, and of the Reverend Philip Houghton, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Thomas Kilnhurst (in testimony whereof they the said Theophilus Percy Ring and the said Philip Houghton, have respectively signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, the following arrangements shall be made :-

"I. That as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall have been published in the London Gazette all those portions of the present endowments belonging to the said benefice of Rawmarsh which are specified in the first part of the Schedule to this scheme appended shall be transferred from the said benefice of Rawmarsh to the said benefice of Christ Church, Parkgate, and shall as from the day aforesaid be annexed thereto and form part of the endowments of the lastly-mentioned benefice and,

"II. That as from the same date all that further portion of the present endowments of the said benefice of Rawmarsh which is specified in the second part of the Schedule to this scheme appended shall be transferred from the said benefice of Rawmarsh to the said benefice of Saint Thomas, Kilnhurst and shall be annexed thereto and form part of the endowment of the said benefice of Saint Thomas, Kilnhurst, and that as and from the date of the transfer lastly mentioned taking effect the annual payment amounting to ten pounds which is referred to in the third part of the same Schedule shall cease and determine and shall no longer be payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said benefice of Rawmarsh to the Vicar or Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Thomas, Kilnhurst.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the

said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE referred to in the foregoing Scheme.

"PART I.

"(a.) All and singular the freehold ground rents amounting in the aggregate to three hundred and fifteen pounds and ten shillings per annum arising or payable in respect of certain property in the parish of Walthamstow in the county of Essex, being the whole of the freehold ground rents amounting to four hundred and three pounds and five shillings per annum which were secured to the benefice of Rawmarsh by a deed dated the twenty-eighth day of July in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, with the exception of such portion of the ground rents amounting to eighty-seven pounds and fifteen shillings per annum which arose or were payable in respect of that portion of the same property which was subsequently sold to the Tottenham and Forest Gate Railway Company by deed dated the twentieth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three.

"PART III.

"The yearly sum or rent-charge of ten pounds heretofore payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the benefice of Rawmarsh, to the Vicar or Incumcent of the benefice of Saint Thomas, Kilnhurst, which said yearly sum or rent-charge was created and made payable by a deed dated the fourteenth day of January in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.
