"And also all those several rent-charges in lieu of tithes amounting to one hundred and eighty-five pounds which upon the commutation of the tithes in the parish of Narford in the county of Norfolk were awarded to the Bishop of Ely and his lessees in lieu of the appropriate tithes of the same parish.

"And also all those several rent-charges in lieu of tithes amounting to three hundred and eighty-two pounds twelve shillings and fivepence being the amount which upon the commutation of the tithes in the parish of Sedgford in the county of Norfolk was awarded to the Dean and Chapter of Norwich and their lessee in lieu of the appropriate tithes of the same parish except so much thereof as is payable out of land numbered 120 in the apportionment of the said tithe rent-charge amounting to the sum of two pounds seven shillings and seven pence, the property of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners.

"And also all those several rent-charges in lieu of tithes amounting to three hundred and twenty-five pounds sixteen shillings and five pence being the amount which upon the commutation of the tithes in the parish of Whitwell in the county of Norfolk was awarded to the Dean and Chapter of Norwich and their lessee in lieu of the appropriate tithes of the same parish except the sum of two pounds six shillings and nine pence being the sums payable out of lands numbered 162, 269 and 283 in the apportionment of the said tithe rent-charge.

"And also all those several rent-charges in lieu of tithes amounting to five hundred and seventy-six pounds four shillings which upon the commutation of the tithes in the parish of Wighton in the county of Norfolk were awarded to the Dean and Chapter of Norwich and their lessee in lieu of the appropriate tithes of the same parish except so much thereof as is payable out of land numbered 295 in the apportionment of the said tithe rent-charge amounting to the sum of one pound sixteen shillings belonging to the trustees of the poor.

"And also all those several rent-charges, in lieu of tithes amounting to six hundred and six pounds nine shillings and nine pence which upon the commutation of the tithes in the parish of Worstead in the county of Norfolk were awarded to the Dean and Chapter of Norwich and their lessees in lieu of the appropriate tithes of the same parish except so much of such appropriate tithes as was payable out of the rectorial glebe lands numbered 168, 169, 170, 171, 173, 174, 175, 176, 177, 178 and 532 in the apportionment of the said tithe rent-charge."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said

Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the dioceses of Norwich and Saint Albans.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty-three, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the second day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, chapter seventy-seven, of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the thirty-seventh and thirty-eighth years of Your Majesty chapter sixty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme with respect to the constitution of a new archdeaconry within the diocese of Ripon and the endowment of the said new archdeaconry in the manner hereinafter mentioned, and also with respect to the rural deaneries or some of them which are within the same diocese.

"Whereas there are at present within the said diocese of Ripon two archdeaconries and no more to wit the archdeaconry of Craven and the archdeaconry of Richmond.

"And whereas in pursuance of the hereinbefore lastly-mentioned Act a statutory schedule setting forth the portions or divisions of the said diocese of Ripon which at the time of the passing of the same Act were accounted and held to be the rural deaneries within the said two archdeaconries of Craven and of Richmond respectively has been duly deposited in the registry of the same diocese.
