THE Queen has been pleased by Letters Patent, dated the 3rd September, passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, to amend the Letters Patent, dated 16th September, 1885, altering the Constitution of the Council of Government of the Colony of Mauritius.

Arrivals from Hong Kong, which is infected with the pest, will also have to proceed to Ilha Grande for quarantine, and the introduction of immigrants from thence is prohibited.
