THEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Saturday, the tenth day of November next; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Thursday, the twentieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this fifteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and in the fifty-eighth year

of Our reign.

T is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Friday, the twenty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council HEREAS Charles Neve Cresswell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, duly appointed as Commissioner for the purposes of the Municipal Corporations Acts, 1882-1893 has transmitted to one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State his scheme in the following terms:-

"MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACTS, 1882-1893.

" County Borough of Brighton. "WHEREAS a Petition from the Council of the county borough of Brighton praying for the much of the area of the county borough of

alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the county borough has been presented

to Her Majesty.

"And whereas Her Majesty has been pleased by Order in Council to refer the said petition to the Lords of the Council for consideration, and did upon their report by Order dated the seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and, ninety-four in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in Her Majesty by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by the Municipal Corporations Act 1893, and in pursuance of every other power enabling Her in that behalf, fix the number of Wards into which the said county borough of Brighton shall be divided, and thereupon ordered and directed that the number of the said Wards shall be fourteen.

"And whereas on the thirteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four the Right Honourable Herbert Henry Asquith, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State did in pursuance of the thirtieth section of the Municipal Corporations Act as amended as aforesaid, warrant and appoint Charles Neve Cresswell Esquire Barrister-at-Law to be a Commissioner to prepare a scheme for determining the boundaries of the Wards of the county borough of Brighton and for apportioning the Councillors among them the number of such Wards having been fixed as aforesaid.

"Now I the said Charles Neve Cresswell do hereby in pursuance of the said warrant of appointment determine the boundaries of the fourteen Wards into which the said county borough shall be divided which Wards are hereinafter numbered and named as follows that is to

say:"Ward No. 1 otherwise Kemp Town Ward.

"Ward No. 2 otherwise Queen's Park Ward.

"Ward No. 3 otherwise Pier Ward.

"Ward No. 4 otherwise Pavilion Ward.

"Ward No. 5 otherwise Regency Ward.

"Ward No. 6 otherwise West Ward.

"Ward No. 7 otherwise Montpelier Ward. "Ward No. 8 otherwise Saint Nicholas Ward.

"Ward No. 9 otherwise Saint John's Ward.

"Ward No. 10 otherwise Hanover Ward.

"Ward No. 11 otherwise Lewes-road Ward.

"Ward No. 12 otherwise Saint Peter's Ward.

"Ward No. 13 otherwise Preston Park Ward. "Ward No. 14 otherwise Preston Ward.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 1,

otherwise Kemp Town Ward shall comprise so

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 2 otherwise Queen's Park Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Brighton as is contained within a line commencing from the point of intersection of the western boundary of Ward No. 1, with the boundary of the county borough at low-water mark, thence in a northerly direction along the said boundary to the point in the centre of Elm-grove aforesaid, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Elm-grove to a point opposite to the centre of Queen's Park-road, thence along the centre of Queen's Park-road to a point opposite to the centre of Upper Park-place thence in an easterly direction to and along the centre of Park Hill to a point in the centre of Park-street, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Parkstreet to a point in the centre of Eastern-road, thence in a southerly direction to and along the centre of Lavender-street, to the centre of Upper Saint James'-street, thence in a southerly direction to and along the centre of Graftonstreet to the centre of the Marine-parade, thence in a southerly direction to the boundary of the county borough, and thence in an easterly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 3 otherwise 'Pier Ward' shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Brighton as is contained within a line commencing from

the point of intersection of the western boundary of Ward No. 2 and the boundary of the county borough at low-water mark, thence in a northerly and westerly direction along the said boundary (of Ward No. 2) to a point opposite to the centre of Upper Park-place, thence in a southerly direction to and along the centre of Upper Park-place to a point in the centre of Carlton Hill, thence in a westerly direction along the centre of Carlton Hill to the centre of the Grand Parade, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the Grand Parade to a point opposite to the centre of Edward-street, thence in a southerly direction to and along the centre of Pavilion Parade and the centre of the road abutting upon the eastern side of the Old Steine enclosures to a point opposite to the centre of Saint James'-street, thence along the centre of the last-mentioned road to the centre of the Marine Parade, thence in a southerly direction across the Grand Junction-road to the boundary of the county borough, thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 4 otherwise Pavilion Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Brighton as is contained within a line commencing from the point of intersection of the western boundary of Ward No. 3 with the boundary of the county borough at low-water mark, thence in a northerly direction along the said western boundary of Ward No. 3 to a point opposite to the centre of Church-street, thence in a westerly direction to and along the centre of Church-street to the centre of Queen's-road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of Queen's-road to the centre of North-street, thence in a southerly direction to and along the centre of West-street to the centre of King's-road, thence in a southerly direction to the boundary of the county borough, thence in an easterly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement afore-said.

"And I do hereby determine that Ward No. 10 otherwise Hanover Ward shall comprise so much of the area of the county borough of Brighton as is contained within a line commencing from the point of intersection of the boundary of Ward No. 2, and the boundary of Ward No. 9 opposite to the centre of Southoverstreet, thence in a north-westerly direction along the boundary of Ward No. 9 to the centre of the road abutting upon the eastern side of 'the Level,' thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the said road to a point opposite to the centre of Elm-grove, thence in an easterly direction to and along the centre of Elm-grove to the boundary of Ward No. 2, thence in a south-westerly direction along the said boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the Acts relating to Her Majesty's Post Office, and in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Definitions.

1. In this Warrant-

(1.) The expression "Parcel" means a Postal Packet which is posted as a Parcel in accordance with the provisions of this Warrant, or any Warrant amending the same:

any Warrant amending the same:
(2.) The expression "United Kingdom" includes the Channel Islands and the Isle of

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Places between which Parcels may be transmitted.

2. From and after the date when this Warrant comes into operation Parcels may, subject to the provisions of this Warrant, be transmitted by post between the United Kingdom and the Dutch West Indies, and Dutch Guiana viâ the Netherlands.

Rates of Postage.

3. On all Parcels transmitted by post under this Warrant from the United Kingdom to the Dutch West Indies or Dutch Guiana, there shall be charged and paid the following rates of postages; that is to say:—

On every Parcel not exceeding three pounds in weight three shillings and sixpence. On every Parcel exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight, four shillings.

On every parcel exceeding seven pounds and not exceeding eleven pounds in weight, four shillings and sixpence.

Maximum Dimensions and Weight.

4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General, there shall not be conveyed or tendered for conveyance by post under this Warrant any Parcel, the dimensions of which shall exceed eleven pounds in weight, two feet in leugth, and four feet in length and girth measured together (such girth being measured round the thickest part of such Parcel).

Prepayment.

5. The postage chargeable as hereinbefore mentioned shall in all cases (except as otherwise provided in this Warrant) be prepaid at the time of posting, and such prepayment shall be effected by means of adhesive postage stamps, or at such Post Offices, within such hours, and under and subject to such regulations as the Postmaster-General shall from time to time prescribe, in money.

Times of Posting.

6. Parcels intended to be transmitted by post may be posted on any day of the week except Sunday, but shall not be posted on Sundays, or in England or Ireland on Christmas Day or Good Friday, and in Scotland on either of the two Sacramental Fast Days, except in the cases next hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

Where the delivery of Parcels on Sundays, or any of the other days aforesaid, at certain Post Offices, to addressees calling for the same, may hereafter be specially authorized by the Postmaster-General, the posting of Parcels on Sundays, or such other days as aforesaid, at such offices respectively, shall also be permitted within such times and in such manner as may be directed by the Postmaster-General.

Mode of Posting.

7. Except as otherwise provided in this Warrant, all Parcels shall, in the United Kingdom, be posted by being handed in at a Post Office in the manner hereinafter provided, within the hours during which such office shall be open to the public for the posting of Parcels.

Posting at Post Offices.

8. The following provisions shall apply to the posting of Parcels at any Post Office, in the United Kingdon, that is to say:—

 It shall be the duty of a person bringing a Parcel to hand it to an officer on duty at

the counter in such office.

(2.) Such Parcel must bear the name and address of the sender and the exact direction of the addressee, and must be packed in a manner adequate for the length of the journey and for the protection of the contents. The Parcel must also be so packed as to prevent any tampering with its contents without leaving an obvious trace of its violation. Such Parcel must also be accompanied by or have affixed to it a declaration of such kind, and stating the contents of the Parcel in such manner and form and with such other particulars as the Commissioners of Customs and the Postmaster-General may prescribe.

(3.) Such Parcel shall be measured and weighed by such officer, and (if such Parcel do not exceed the limits of measurement or weight hereinbefore mentioned) the postage thereof, according to the rates hereinbefore mentioned shall, subject as hereinbefore mentioned, be prepaid as hereinbefore provided, and shall be verified by such officer, and no such Parcel shall be forwarded by the post unless the before-mentioned requirements have been complied with; and if any such Parcel shall be left at a Post Office and such requirements have not been complied with, such Parcel shall be detained, and may be returned or given up to the sender thereof, or otherwise dealt with or disposed of in any manner authorized by this Warrant.

Collection of Parcels.

9. The Postmaster-General may, if he thinks fit, from time to time authorize such officers as he may direct to receive Parcels for the Post under such regulations and conditions as he may from time to time prescribe.

Irregular Posting of Parcels.

10. Any Packet transmissible by Parcel Post from the United Kingdom which, from any words or marks thereon, or other external evidence, appears to have been intended for transmission as a Parcel, but which has not been tendered for transmission as a Parcel, but has been posted in a Post Office letter-box, or otherwise than according to the manner hereinbefore prescribed for the posting of Parcels, may, in the discretion of the Postmaster-General, either be detained or returned or given up to the sender, or if the said Packet is fully prepaid with the Letter or Book rate of postage, and otherwise conforms to the Regulations as to the Letter or Book Post, the same may be forwarded as a Letter or Book Packet (as the case may be).

Return and Disposal of Undelivered Parcels.

11. With regard to-

(a.) Parcels which are addressed to a Post
Office in the United Kingdom to be called
for, or to a place in the United Kingdom
beyond the limits of the free postal delivery
of any town or district, or to a ship at any
port in the United Kingdom, and which are
not called for or delivered within such reasonable times as the Postmaster-General may
from time to time prescribe; and

(6.) Parcels which cannot be delivered in the United Kingdom for want of a true direction, or by reason that the addressee is dead, or cannot be found, or has refused the same, or has refused to pay any charges thereon, or

for any other sufficient reason;

the following provisions shall (subject to the provisions of the Warrant of the said Commissioners of the 12th day of December, 1888, relating to Foreign and Colonial Parcels) apply; (that is to say):—

(1.) The Parcel shall, as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct, be retained at or forthwith forwarded to such place as the Postmaster-General may from time to time appoint, and may, if necessary,

be there opened and examined.

(2.) (5.) Consisting of or containing:—

(a.) Any explosive substance. (b.) Any dangerous substance.

(c.) Any filth.

(d.) Any noxious or deleterious substance.

(e.) Any sharp instrument not properly protected.

(f.) Except with the special permission of the Postmaster-General, any living creature.

(g.) Any article or thing whatsoever which is likely to injure other Parcels in course of conveyance, or any receptacle in which the same are conveyed, or any officer in the Post Office or other person who may deal with such Parcel.

Any such Parcel, if posted or tendered for conveyance by post, may be detained, and either returned or given up to the sender thereof or dealt with or disposed of in such other manner as may be authorized by the Postmaster-General.

16.
