Royal Orders.

In view of official intelligence of the termination of yellow fever in Paita (Peru), declared foul by Royal Order of the 19th of May last, and in conformity with Article 40 of the Sanitary Law, and Rules 1, 9, 10, 11, and 14 of the Royal Order of the 23rd of September, 1892, arrivals from that port are declared clean whatever their date of departure. In virtue of this the said arrivals, as well as those from ports within 165 kilometres of Paita shall henceforth be admitted to free pratique if they arrive with clean bill of health visé by the Spanish Consul, or if there be none, by that of another nation, in good hygienic conditions and without suspicious occurrence in the health of the ship, so long as they do not infringe Rules 9, 10, or 11 of the Royal Order of the 31st of March, 1888, 29, 31, or 32 of that of the 23rd of September, 1892, or any other enactment subjecting ships to quarantine owing to circumstances of the voyage, or from the ports referred to in this declaration, proving to be within 165 kilometres of another declared foul.

Infectious goods, as laid down in the Royal
Order of the 29th of October, 1885, which have
remained in Paita during the epidemic, shall
likewise be admitted without disinfection, irrespective of date, if in good hygienic conditions.

NORFOLK SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1894.

By the Board of Agriculture.

'THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Revocation.

1.—(1.) The Order described in the First Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked to the

extent in that Schedule mentioned.

(2.) Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1894, No. 2 and the Order described in the First Schedule to this Order before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, those Orders before the commencement of this Order.

Movement of Swine.

2.—(1.) Swine shall not be moved by land or by water into or out of any District named in the Second Schedule to this Order otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

(2.) Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to interfere with or apply to movement from any place in a District named in the Second Schedule to this Order to any place in any other District named in such Schedule.

Movement of Fat Swine for Slaughter into Districts to which this Order applies.

- 3. Fat swine may for the purpose of being slaughtered be moved from a place not within a District named in the Second Schedule to this Order, such place not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, to premises within any such District with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the District in which the place to which the swine are to be moved is situate in manner and under the conditions following—
 - (i.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place from which and the premises to which the swine are to be moved for slaughter.
 - (ii.) The swine, before the movement is commenced, shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(iii.) The swine after the movement has commenced shall not be exposed at any sale in

England or Wales or Scotland.

(iv.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article.

(v.) The swine moved under this Article shall be slaughtered within four days after their arrival at the premises specified in the Licence; and the Local Authority of the District into which the swine are moved shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the specified premises and are slaughtered there within such four days.

(vi.) The swine while being moved under this Article and until they are slaughtered shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all swine not marked for slaughter under this

Order.

Movement of Fat Swine for Slaughter out of Districts to which this Order applies.

4. Fat swine may for the purpose of being slaughtered be moved from a place in a District

named in the Second Schedule to this Order, such place not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place, to premises not within any such District with a Movement Licence of the Local Authority of the District in which the place to which the swine are to be moved is situate in manner and under the conditions following—

(i.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than five days inclusive of the day of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the swine to be moved, and the name or description of the place from which and the premises to which the swine are to be moved for slaughter.

(ii.) The swine, before the movement is commenced, shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(iii.) The swine after the movement has commenced shall not be exposed at any sale in

England or Wales or Scotland.

(iv.) The swine moved under this Article shall be accompanied by the Licence required by this Article.

(v.) The swine moved under this Article shall be slaughtered within four days after their arrival at the premises specified in the Licence; and the Local Authority of the District into which the swine are moved shall take such steps as are necessary to insure that the swine are moved to the specified premises and are slaughtered there within such four days.

(vi.) The swine while being moved under this Article and until they are slaughtered shall so far as practicable be kept separate from all swine not marked for slaughter under this

Order.

As to Movement of Swine by Railway through Districts to which this Order applies.

5. For the purposes of this Order, swine shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a District named in the Second Schedule to this Order where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked or rebooked within such District.

Movement of Swine by Licence of Board.

6. Notwithstanding anything in this Order, swine may be moved in any circumstances with a Licence of an Inspector of the Board or of a person authorized by the Board to grant the same, which Licence will only be granted where the Board, after inquiry, are satisfied that exceptional circumstances render the movement necessary or expedient.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Disinfection of Places and Things.

7.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District named in the Second Schedule to this Order may make such Regulations as they think fit for the following purposes or any of them.

For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any sty or other place which has been used for swine while affected with or suspected of swine-fever, and any utensil, pen, hurdle, or other thing used for or about such swine, and any wood-work with which such swine have come in contact, and for prescribing the mode

in which such cleansing and such disinfection are to be effected:

For requiring the owner, occupier or person in charge of such sty or other place to cleanse and disinfect such sty or other place and things at the expense of the Local Authority or at the expense of such owner, occupier or

person in charge.

(2.) If the owner, occupier or person in charge of any such sty or place does any act in contravention of any such Regulation or fails in any respect to observe the same, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and where the occupier of such sty or place fails to cleanse and disinfect in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place and things to be cleansed and disinfected and to recover the expenses of such cleansing and disinfection from such owner, occupier or person in charge in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Slaughter in Swine-Fever.

8.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District named in the Second Schedule to this Order may, if they think fit, cause to be slaughtered—

(i.) any swine affected with swine-fever; or
(ii.) any swine being or having been in the same sty or shed or in the same herd or otherwise in contact with swine affected with swine-fever.

(2.) The Local Authority shall, out of the local rate, pay compensation as follows for swine

slaughtered under this Article:

(a.) Where the pig slaughtered was affected with swine-fever, the compensation shall be one half of its value immediately before it became so affected, but so that the compensation do not in any such case exceed four pounds:

(6.) In every other case the compensation shall be the value of the pig immediately before it was slaughtered, but so that the compensation do not

in any such case exceed eight pounds.

Granting of Movement Licences.

9.—(1.) A Licence shall only be granted for the movement of swine under this Order where in the opinion of the Local Authority or the person granting the Licence, as the case may be, the granting of such Licence is necessary or expedient.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available it granted by the owner of the swine to be moved or by his agent, or by the owner or consignee or other person selling the swine, or exposing the swine for sale, or by the purchaser thereof or by his agent, or by the auctioneer or other person conducting or licensed to hold the sale at which the swine are exposed, or by the occupier of the place or premises from or to which the swine are to be

moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

10.—(1.) Every person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Beard or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorizing the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

11.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person exposes a pig at any sale in England or Wales or Scotland in contravention of the provisions of Article 3 or Article 4 of this Order, the owner or consignee of such pig and the person exposing the same thereat, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against

the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

12. Terms in this Order have the same meaning as in the Swine-Fever (Infected Areas) Order of 1894, No. 2.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

Short Title.

14. This Order may be cited as THE NORFOLK SWINE-FEVER ORDER OF 1894.

(PORT OF LIVERPOOL—DEFINITION OF BIRKEN-HEAD FOREIGN ANIMALS WHARF.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Liverpool as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space at Birkenhead situate partly in the county borough of Birkenhead and partly in the township of Poulton-cum-Sencombe in the county of Chester, hereinafter described and consisting of the following parts numbered respectively (1) (2) (3) (4) (5) (6) and (7) on the plan of the said foreign animals wharf hereinafter mentioned, that is to say-(1) all that part bounded by a line commencing at a point near the east end of Pacificroad and at the north-east corner of certain cattle pens, slaughter-houses, stores and premises known as the Woodside Lairage, and extending southwardly eighty-nine feet or thereabouts, thence at right angles to the river wall seven feet, thence southwardly along the river frontage two hundred and eighty-one feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly eighty-six feet or thereabouts, thence southwardly one hundred and thirty-seven feet or thereabouts to the south-east corner of the said cattle pens, slaughter-houses, stores and premises, thence westwardly four hundred and sixty feet or thereabouts, thence north-westwardly four hundred and thirty feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly one hundred and forty-four feet or thereabouts to the south-east corner of the building presently occupied by the Pacific Steam Navigation Company, thence ninety-nine feet or thereabouts along the north-east side of the said building, thence in an easterly direction fifty feet or thereabouts to a point twenty-two feet distant from the western front of the Morpeth Warehouses, thence in a straight line parallel to the said western front fifty-one feet or thereabouts to a point on the south side of Pacific-road, thence eastwardly five hundred and twenty-nine feet or thereabouts along the south side of Pacific-road to the point of commencement aforesaid, the said line throughout its length following the boundary fences and outer walls of the buildings of the said Woodside Lairage, (2) all that part on the Woodside Landing Stage and North Bridge connecting the same with the shore bounded by a line commencing at a point in the north side of the said Bridge where it joins the river wall and extending eastwardly along the north side of the cartway of the said Bridge one hundred and fifty feet or thereabouts to the western margin of the said Stage, thence on the said Stage eastwardly forty-three feet or thereabouts, thence northwardly seventy-one feet or thereabouts, thence eastwardly thirty-seven feet or thereabouts, thence southwardly along the river front of the said Stage three hundred and one feet or thereabouts, thence westwardly thirtyseven feet or thereabouts, thence northwardly one hundred and seventy feet or thereabouts, thence
