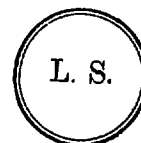

**ORDER OF LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL
RE-ARRANGING THE WARDS OF THE
PARISH OF ST. ANNE, LIMEHOUSE,
APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF
STATE.**

To the Vestry of the Parish of St. Anne,
Limehouse;
And all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, Section 41, it is enacted that, when at any time, upon any account taken of the population by the Authority of Parliament any of the parishes within the Metropolis not now divided into wards for the purpose of electing vestrymen shall be found to contain more than two thousand rated householders, it shall be lawful for the Metropolitan Board of Works, upon the application in writing of the vestry, or of not less than five hundred rated householders of the parish, to divide such parish into wards, and to determine and set out the number, extent, limit, and boundary lines of such wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than five hundred rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Metropolitan Board shall apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward have regard, as far as in their judgment is practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward, as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three.

And whereas the parish of St. Anne, Limehouse, is within the limits of the Metropolis, as defined by the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and is one of the parishes in part 1 of Schedule B of that Act, and was not at the passing of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, divided into wards.

And whereas the powers, duties, and liabilities of the Metropolitan Board of Works were trans-

ferred to the London County Council by the Local Government Act, 1888.

And whereas application has been made by the vestry of the parish of St. Anne, Limehouse, to us, the London County Council, to divide the said parish into wards, pursuant to the provisions of the said 41st Section of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862.

And whereas it appears from the last account taken of the population by the Authority of Parliament that the said parish contains four thousand six hundred and sixty-three rated householders.

And whereas it appears from the rate books of the said parish prepared in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one that the ratable annual value of property in the said parish was one hundred and twenty-four thousand nine hundred and eighty-five pounds.

Now the London County Council having considered the said application, and having ascertained from the said last account taken of the population by the Authority of Parliament as contained in the census return for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one that the number of rated householders for the parish of St. Anne, Limehouse, was then four thousand six hundred and sixty-three, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in the said parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated as shown by the said rate books of the parish for one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the said parish of St. Anne, Limehouse, be divided into three wards, to be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder written; that the extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said Schedule, and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule.
