ORDER OF LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL  
RE-ARRANGING THE WARDS OF  
THE PARISH OF WANDSWORTH,  
APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF  
STATE.

To the Vestry of the parish of Wandsworth;  
And all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, Section 41, it is enacted

that, when at any time, upon any account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament any of the parishes within the Metropolis not now divided into wards for the purpose of electing vestrymen shall be found to contain more than two thousand rated householders, it shall be lawful for the Metropolitan Board of Works, upon the application in writing of the vestry, or of not less than five hundred rated householders of the parish, to divide such parish into wards, and to determine and set out the number, extent, limits and boundary lines of such wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than five hundred rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Metropolitan Board shall apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward have regard, as far as in their judgment is practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward, as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three.

And whereas the parish of Wandsworth is within the limits of the Metropolis as defined by the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and is one of the parishes in Part 1 of Schedule B of that Act, and was not at the passing of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, divided into wards.

And whereas the powers, duties, and liabilities of the Metropolitan Board of Works were transferred to the London County Council by the Local Government Act, 1888.

And whereas application has been made by the Vestry of the parish of Wandsworth, to us, the London County Council, to divide the said parish into wards, pursuant to the provisions of the said 41st section of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862.

And whereas it appears from the last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament that the said parish contains seven thousand four hundred and eighty rated householders.

And whereas it appears from the rate books of the said parish prepared in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three that the ratable annual value of property in the said parish was two hundred and seventy-six thousand nine hundred and thirteen pounds.

Now the London County Council, having considered the said application, and having ascertained from the said last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament as contained in the census return for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one that the number of rated householders for the parish of Wandsworth was then seven thousand four hundred and eighty, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in the said parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated as shown by the said rate books of the parish for one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the said parish of Wandsworth be divided into six wards, to be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder written; that the extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said Schedule, and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule.

**ORDER OF LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL  
RE-ARRANGING THE WARDS OF THE  
PARISH OF ALL SAINTS, POPLAR,  
APPROVED BY THE SECRETARY OF  
STATE.**

To the Vestry of the Parish of All Saints,  
Poplar;

And all whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 15 of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1893, it is enacted that the London County Council may from time to time for the purpose of elections of vestrymen, upon the application in writing of the vestry, or of not less than 500 rated householders of a parish mentioned in Schedules A and B to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, by order under their seal, re-arrange the wards in such parish, and determine the number, extent, limits, and boundary lines of the new wards, but so nevertheless that no ward shall contain less than 500 rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Council shall, in making any such re-arrangement, apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward have regard so far as practicable as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three; and it is also by the said Act enacted that any such Order may contain such provisions with reference to the election, rotation, and retirement of vestrymen (whether elected prior or subsequently to the date of the Order) as the Council may think necessary for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Order.

And whereas the parish of All Saints, Poplar, is a parish mentioned in Part I of Schedule B to the Metropolis Management Act, 1855.

And whereas under and by virtue of the provisions of the said Metropolis Management Act,

1855, and of Section 41 of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, the said parish was in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty divided into three wards.

And whereas the vestry of the said parish hath applied to the London County Council to re-arrange the wards of the said parish pursuant to the provisions of the said 15th section of the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1893.

And whereas it appears from the rate books of the said parish, prepared in the month of April, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, that the said parish contains eight thousand three hundred and sixty-four rated householders, and that the ratable annual value of property in the said parish is three hundred and four thousand five hundred and seventy-nine pounds.

Now the London County Council having considered the said application, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward of the said parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the wards of the said parish of All Saints, Poplar, be re-arranged in manner following, that is to say, that the said parish be divided into four instead of three wards, and that the four wards be distinguished by the names mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder written, that the extent, limits and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said Schedule, and that the number of Vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule.

And the London County Council doth further order that this Order shall come into force for the purpose of the first election of Vestrymen under the Local Government Act, 1894, and such election shall be subject to the provisions of the said Act.

THE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. From and after the commencement of this Order the provisions of the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1894 dated the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four shall not extend or apply to the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order, and the Order of the Board of the same date applying the provisions of the said Markets and Fairs Order to certain Districts and parts of Districts named in the Schedule to that Order shall be read and have effect as if the Districts named in the Schedule to this Order were not included in the Schedule to that Order.

2. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Markets and Fairs (Swine-Fever) Order of 1894, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, such Order before the commencement of this Order.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.
